



# Yokohama as Quake, Fire in Japan Strike Large City

TOKYO, Tuesday, June 29 (AP)—Earthquake and fire late Monday destroyed the city of Fukui, 200 miles west of Tokyo, causing undetermined but possibly heavy loss of Japanese lives. Japanese newspapers guessed the casualty total at 5,000 dead and injured, but American occupation authorities said no estimates were possible.

The small U. S. military government unit in Fukui reported all American personnel were safe but that they lost most of their belongings when fire destroyed the headquarters and other buildings.

Gifford, bureau director, said Monday. He warned that action will be taken after the July 1 deadline set by county commissioners.

Farmers set definite times to cut their hay and clear their crop. Gifford said, and they should also set definite times to eradicate or control noxious weeds. He pointed out the entire county to be graded a weed district.

The weed control bureau has been deluged with requests to take care of noxious weeds on the county's noxious weeds. It has no sufficient equipment to take care of all the work at one time. Gifford said that the bureau is planning other growing conditions to make weeds ready for treatment all at one time.

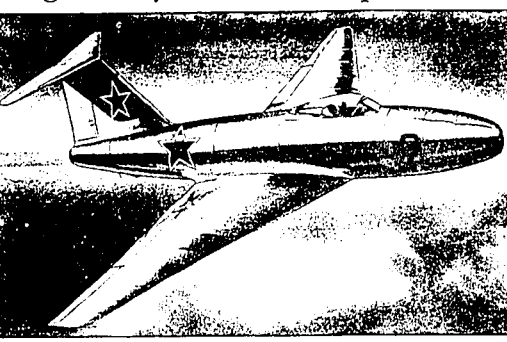

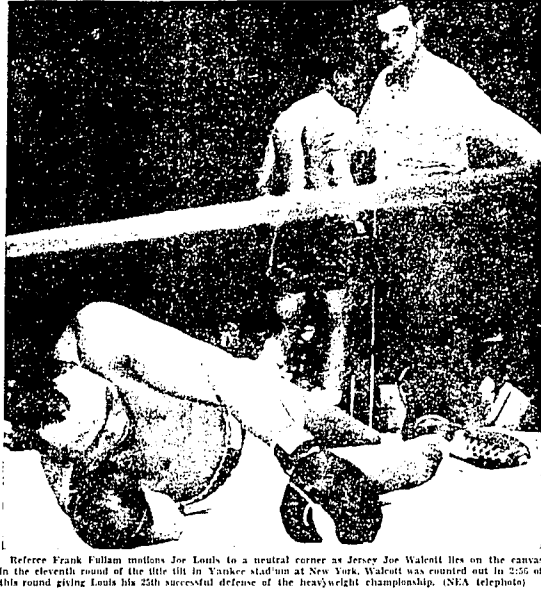
