### Tito Party Denies Deviation Charge of Red Chieftains

BELGRADE, June 29 (AP)—The Yugoslav communists of Marshal Tito today denied any deviation from the Moscow line, but admitted that Yugoslavia needs the "help" of Russia and its satellites, and pledged that the country would keep the communist front intact.

The central committee of the Yugoslav Communist party issued a long communiqué replying to the denunciation by the communists of Tito and other Yugoslav leaders as having played too close to western imperialism.

The communiqué called the communists' charges against Yugoslav communism "unfounded" and "one-sided," and it called upon all Yugoslav communists to continue their support of the Tito regime.

The communiqué said the central committee of the Communist party of Yugoslavia was broadest over Tito's tirade. It was the first official information the Yugoslav had received of yesterday's anti-democratic attack of communists in this country by the communists.

Received With Calm  
Many of them had heard the news from foreign radios and by word of mouth, but they were not surprised it would come. No special security precautions were in effect in case of a riot.

No Apology Given  
The Yugoslav communiqué made no apology for the charges, including Trotskyism and anti-Sovietism, which the communists charged to the Tito regime.

The communiqué referred to the communists' criticism of Tito's dismissal of Stjepan Cvetic, finance minister, and Andrija Hebrang, minister for light industry, and other members of the cabinet who defended these two men "without showing any information to the public from the central committee of the Yugoslav party."

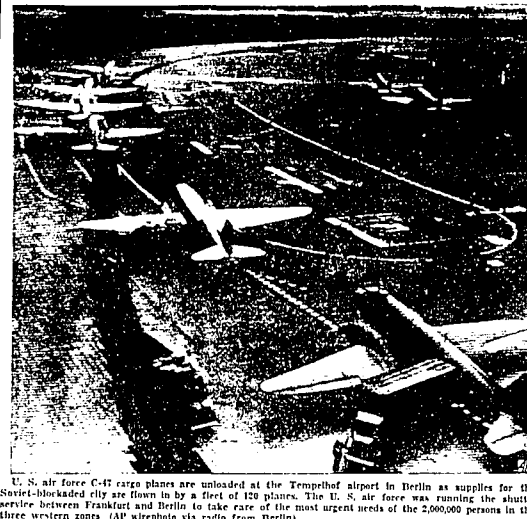

### 3,755 Persons Die in Japan's Quake, Mum'Arthur Reports

TOKYO, June 29 (AP)—Gen. Douglas MacArthur's headquarters reported today that 3,155 persons lost their lives in Fukui as the result of yesterday's disastrous earthquake and fire.

The first of the dead included an estimated 1,000 dead for devastated Fukui city alone. The figures included the toll in 39 villages as well as the prefectural capital, Allied headquarters also disclosed that 7,752 persons were seriously injured and 30,722 buildings were damaged. Of that number, 6,306 were burned.

A report from United Press Staff Correspondent Peter Kaitchick now in Fukui said that the quake still went on for hours, but there was no further damage.

Some Felt in Tokyo  
Some of the quakes were strong enough to be felt in Tokyo 60 miles away. Experts said minor tremors always followed a big quake.

Meanwhile, Allied and Japanese officials rushed food and medicines to Fukui in an attempt to check a possible outbreak of disease among the survivors.

The second night after the quake came to the city and many other communities in the three prefectures from the quake zone. The wounded were stretched out in the streets and workers still were digging for victims trapped under the debris.

Thousands Homeless  
Thousands of homeless men, women and children wandered among the ruins in search of food and shelter.

Alleged headquarters announced that a 15-truck convoy of supplies and personnel was on the way from Osaka to Fukui, while two trucks were on the way from Osaka with medical supplies. The government in Tokyo speeded medicine to the quake zone. It reported cases of typhoid, dysentery and tetanus in the provincial capital, now devoid of water and sanitation.

### U. S. Reveals 'Terms' Given By Aid Areas

WASHINGTON, June 29 (AP)—The state department today had disclosed the "terms" which Marshall plan countries are accepting to insure that U. S. economic aid to Europe is not wasted.

The announcement of the "terms" was expected by diplomats here to signal a fresh communist propaganda blast assailing the multi-billion dollar European recovery program as "U. S. imperialism" and "rule of the dollar."

In exchange for U. S. aid, Italy and Ireland, as other countries will, made:

1. Guarantee of a favorable economic climate for European recovery — by adopting necessary measures to establish financial stability, increase trade and establish a valid rate of currency exchange. They promise also to promote production.
2. Special concessions to the U. S. — agreed to submit to the international court at the Hague any claims by U. S. nationals arising from governmental measures in their countries; to guarantee the convertibility into dollars of new private American investments in their countries; to make arrangements whereby the U. S. can obtain critical materials needed for stock piling.
3. Favored in Trade — An agreement, in an exchange of separate notes, to grant most-favored-nation trade treatment to U. S. occupied areas including Germany, Japan, Korea and Trieste.
4. A pledge to set aside in local currency an amount of money equal to the value of U. S. aid which they receive. The U. S. must agree on the purpose for which this "special fund" is spent. Part of it will be used to pay economic cooperation administration expenses abroad.
