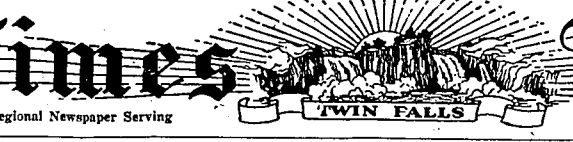

Capsule Food Won't Change 'Solid' Menus

LONDON, July 5 (AP)—Dr. Hellmuth Edhardt Heltz, one of the world's leading authorities on concentrated foods, says future generations need not fear the advent of capulated beefsteaks or pillbox strawberry short cake.

Heltz, who began experimenting with food concentrates nearly 20 years ago after getting the idea during a big game hunt, asserted in an interview that solid food could never be substituted as a permanent dietary short cake.

Good for Emergency
However, he believes capulated food has its place, and an important one, especially in an emergency.

The naturalized Briton, who studied medicine at the University of Vienna, is now the head of Allied Laboratories, Ltd., which manufactures emergency rations in tablet form at the rate of 2,000,000 a week.

Used During War
Heltz's ration is contained in a pill the size of a quarter, called Etalone. It was used during the war by the British merchant navy, commandos and ambulance units and is now being converted for peace-time.

The stocky, gray-haired doctor said a large scale test would be conducted shortly in a famine area. He said Etalone also would be a fit luncheon for a harassed office worker.

"It is far healthier to have one of my pills than to gobble down a badly made sandwich and suffer indigestion," he contended.

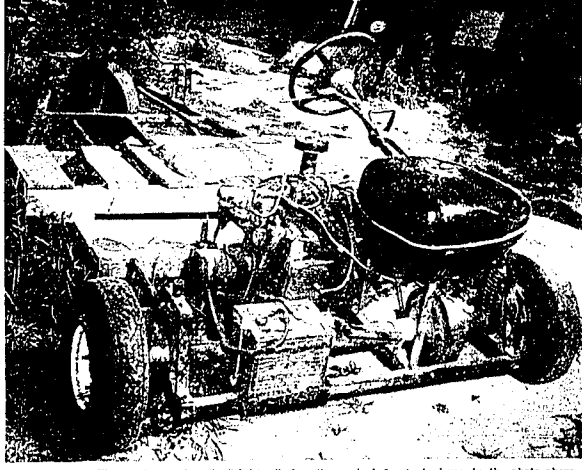
