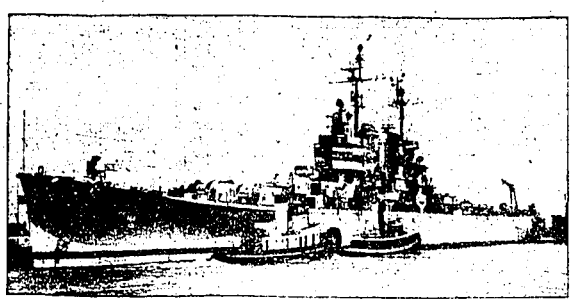

This sterilizes lid. Then shake jars well and upright. This keeps fruit evenly distributed.

VA Man Tells Limitations on Vets' Training

Bartending and minkology, dancing and all other avocational or recreational courses non-relative to job objectives have been eliminated from the OT training program effective June 30, Don Duval, senior counselor in charge of the Twin Falls VA office said Thursday.

Other courses discontinued under the 1946 independent office appropriations act which sets the VA's budget are photography, pilot, personal development, instrument or vocal music, public speaking, sports and athletics.

Signed June 30 by President Truman, supporting "any single subject course, not a part of a general educational or training program leading to an educational or employment objective," and "all other courses which VA's regional office managers know are used infrequently in their areas for vocational and recreational purposes."

Courses leading to an educational or employment objective in such courses will be allowed to complete their training, the act specified.

Elementary flight, private pilot or commercial pilot courses taught at the Twin Falls office will not fall into the discontinued category provided the veteran submits the following information to the regional office prior to training: Proof that the course is in line with his present or intended business or occupation, and qualified evidence that he is physically fit to obtain the type of license enable him to realize his job objective.

Flight courses created by veterans to complete degree requirements in college flight courses taught in vocational subjects, and upper division flight curriculum which include flight instructor, multi-engine, instrument rating, and airline transport pilot courses must conform with the foregoing requirements.

On-the-farm apprenticeship courses approved by appropriate agencies, will be considered recreational or avocational. Other courses generally not in the restricted group, but subject to job objective requirements include education courses in an approved public or private elementary or high school institution for which academic credits are awarded toward a veteran's educational objective, courses in an approved vocational, trade or technological school, courses in music, physical education, and public speaking required for the objective.

Summary of the act restricts use of VA funds for training other than that which will contribute to the veteran's vocational or occupational advancement or educational objective.

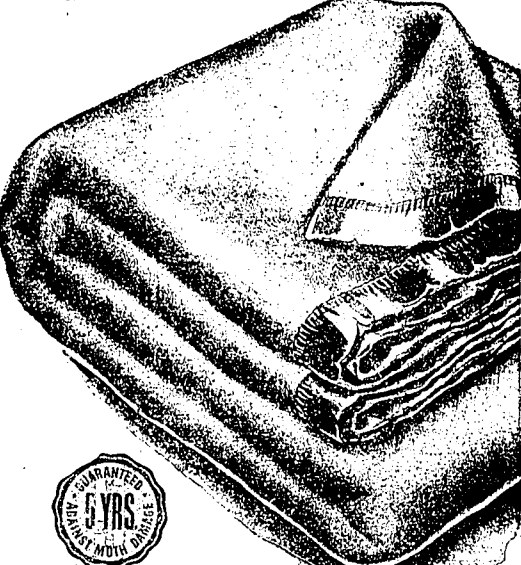

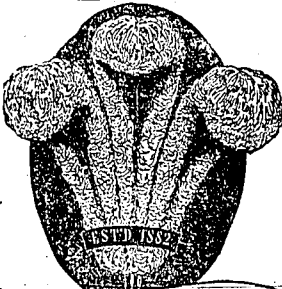

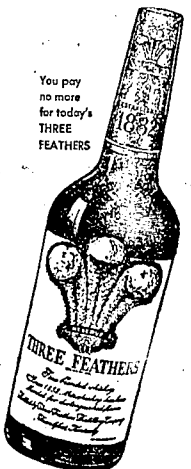

Large Wheat Crop 'Cramps' Plains States

CHICAGO, July 8 (AP)—Grain harvesters are cramping the plains states with a bumper wheat crop, farmers were warned today as they some of the golden grain on the ground.

Throughout the big wheat producing states of Kansas and Nebraska a shortage of storage space was reported. Railroads reported that again this year there is a shortage of boxcars to move the grain.

But this year the big wheat combines began harvesting the grain simultaneously in most of the large wheat producing states. In Colorado, harvesting of the second biggest crop in the state's history had started on Friday.

When farmers and elevator men believe enough storage space would be found, but they said some wheat would have to be left on the ground. If properly cared for, this overflow grain will not be lost, but will be "ground stored." Normally, some wheat remaining on the ground early in the year before it can be moved into storage or to market.

In Nebraska, the Burlington and Union Pacific railroads described the box car supply as "tight," "very tight" and "critical" in various crop experts said almost all elevators were filled to capacity, and the "considerable quantity of grain were being stored" on the ground.

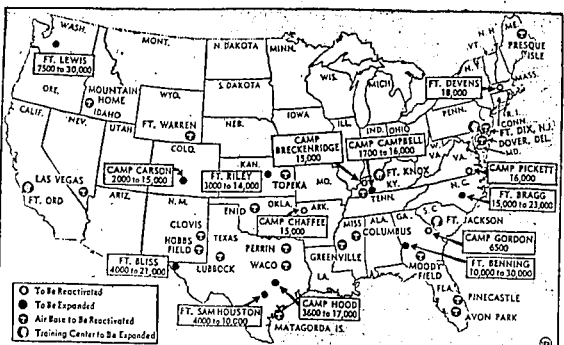

Draft's Plans Of Deferment Are Clarified

WASHINGTON, July 8 (AP)—Who gets deferred under the draft law? Any one 20 years of age and anyone not yet 19. Veterans get special treatment. If you served honorably on active duty for at least 90 days between Dec. 7, 1941, and Sept. 2, 1945, you won't get drafted.

If you served for at least one year anytime between Sept. 16, 1940, and June 24, 1948 (date the act became law), you don't have to worry. If you served more than 90 days but less than one year at any time between Sept. 16, 1940, and June 24, 1948 (but not 90 days between Dec. 7, 1941 and Sept. 2, 1945) and if you are one of certain reserve units you won't be drafted.

"Reserve Units" Not Set

What are these "certain reserve units"? It's not yet known, but the army says local draft boards will have a say in determining which units will count.

All told, it's safe to say that practically no veteran who has some active duty during the war, no matter how short, will get drafted. That includes, of course, all who were discharged for physical disability and who still have that disability. What does the draft law mean when it says "active duty"? Everything but the following:

1. Periods of duty which were purely reserve program training periods, like the two-week period in the summer.
2. Any duty consisting solely of training under the army specialized training program (ASTP), the air force college training program and all similar training programs in the navy, marine corps or coast guard (such as the navy "V-12" program).
3. Time spent as a cadet at West Point or the coast guard academy or a midshipman at Annapolis.
4. Any time spent while being processed into or separated from any of the training programs listed above.

Can Finish High School

What if you've never had any service at all, and come within the 10-25 age bracket fixed in the law? If you're in high school you can finish, provided you do so before you're 20 and provided you get passing marks. That automatically defers you until graduation. If you're in college the law gives you a guarantee to finish out the academic year in which you're called up. After that you are subject to call immediately unless:

1. You are a member of the reserve officers training corps (ROTC) or the ROTC program.
2. You are a member of the ROTC program or you are appointed a midshipman in the U. S. naval reserve and agree that upon graduation from college you will accept a commission and will serve on active duty for at least two years.
3. That doesn't mean you'll be called, necessarily. It means you might be called in the event of those two conditions is met you can be exempt or deferred until graduation—provided your marks are up to snuff.

Reserve's Exempt

The draft law also says that any reservists who on June 24, 1948, was a member of the organized units of the national guard, the air national guard, the officers' reserve corps, the regular army reserve, the air force reserve, the enlisted reserve corps, the naval reserve, the marine corps reserve, the coast guard reserve or the public health service reserve will be exempt as long as he "satisfactorily participates" in his program.

The law also allows that does not require deferment of men with wives and (or) children and other dependents, but there is no hard and fast rule. It will depend on the merits of each case. There are provisions also for occupational deferment—deferments for the "national health, safety or interest."

155 Arrested for Game Violations

When patriotic calls, he cannot, if he would, be silent, but grasping that banner, to him so dear, which he has already borne in triumph, he will march to a civic victory no less renowned than those of war.

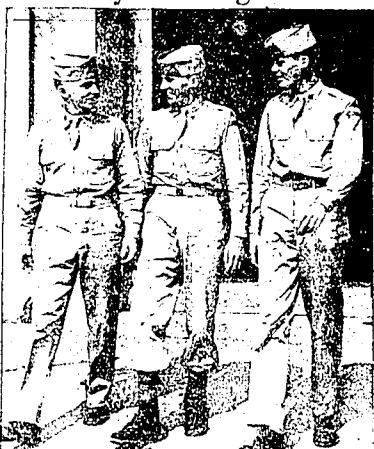

Army 'New Look' for Draftees Gift of UMY Experiment Units

(UPI's Note) The Army promises a pleasant surprise for the boys which he called the "grand old hero of Kennesaw mountain and Atlanta."

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Mom is going to like the army that's getting her son in the draft.

For example, she doesn't have to worry about his learning bad words he never heard before, from some tough sergeant. The army doesn't let its sergeants swear at recruits anymore.

That's just one of the revolutionary ideas the army has in its new training program. There are many others.

Pop might call some of them "sissy stuff." It'll be a lot different from the "rookie" training he got in World War I. And his brother Joe's probably going to mutter that it ain't the "basic" he sweated out, either, for World War II.

Most of the new ideas came from the army's experimental universal military training units at Ft. Knox, Ky. These test groups were set up to try to show U. S. parents and congress that universal military training could make better men out of boys.

Although universal military training was killed by the first congress, it did not die in vain. Much of what was learned by the Knox "trainees" has today been incorporated into the army's basic training.

The ban against swearing is part of the whole new approach to making good soldiers. It used to be that a man was shown how to do a thing like making his bed just once. After that his sergeant just bawled him out every time he made it wrong. The new way is to show him how to make a bed several times, if necessary. That way is more efficient than curs words, they've discovered.

Another lesson the army learned at Knox is that just because a man knows how to do a thing, it doesn't necessarily mean he can teach somebody else to do it. Instructors have to be trained to teach. The army is planning a huge training program to provide competent instructors for the draftees.

About one-half of the men inducted for the first six months or so will go to training camps and the rest will be assigned to regular army units. As fast as the army can

turn out the trained instructors they will be sent to regular army units also, to help in the training of the draftees.

As many newly-inducted men as possible will get individual interviews with a chaplain. The new men will be encouraged to go to church and given a man-to-man briefing on the fact that a clean and honest soldier is the best in the service. Letters from the chaplains will be sent to the parents of the younger boys, keeping them posted on the boys' progress.

Camp commanders will be encouraged to try to get nearby communities to help in the planning of the trainees' recreation. At Knox, in cooperation with Louisville, Ky., the groups and citizens excellent recreation was arranged for the young "uniters." It kept them out of the adobe and made them feel as if they were in their own home town. This device will be used widely as camps getting draftees.

A more intelligent presentation of sex problems is another goal of the new training. Instead of trying to scare the men with horror pictures of what happens to a man with a venereal disease, emphasis will be placed on self-control, the rewards of clean living and the responsibility of a soldier to his family, the church and to his country.

At least once a week there will be supervised discussions of current events on the theory that the best soldier is the most intelligent soldier.

Some courses in the army's basic training have been dropped to make room for the "uniters." These include courses on mines and booby traps, combat teamwork, motor vehicle operation, the use of common hand tools and others.

Because many of the draftees will be sent abroad for occupation duty, the new basic training will include such courses as military intelligence, procedures for handling prisoners of war and displaced persons, and the processing of captured documents.

Wherever possible the army is going to point the badges of the barracks where draftees will be quartered. Pleagier quarters helped make the Ft. Knox experiment succeed. Unfortunately, they say, the army won't have much money for this part of the training program.

In trying to revolutionize its training, the army has a three-fold purpose.

First, it wants to make better soldiers.

Second, it wants to make army life so attractive that enough men will want to re-enlist and future drafts to maintain strength will not be necessary.

And finally, the army feels it owes a great responsibility to U. S. parents to make the best of the men's time while they are in service.

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Could Russia Be 'M' Too? Analyst Asks

 Recent demonstrations of independence within the Russian sphere have aroused speculation as to whether eastern Europe's policeman may himself be sick.
 Yugoslavia's refusal to be cowed by Russian disapproval was the first big crack in the communist front. Then the Finns apparently felt safe in voting against communism. Now we have seen demonstrations of anti-communism in Czechoslovakia.
 Does Tito have any reason to believe the Russians will not come and get him? Were the Finnish communists, like those in Italy, left alone at the last moment to sink or swim without Moscow's support? Does Gromyko lack the strength for drastic action against the Czech patriots?

Tightening Forecast
 First reaction to the Yugoslav affair among close observers was it would cause Russia to tighten the clamps throughout her sphere. Reports of troop movements in Romania and Bulgaria, and of impending purges wherever local communists had failed to "see up" their masters, have done nothing to weaken this reasoning.
 But, as the U. S. ambassador to Belgrade said of the Yugoslav leader, there's more than meets the eye.
 The western allies were much interested in the timing of their protests to Moscow over the Berlin situation. Whether this concerned more than the Berlin situation itself is not known.

Still Much to Learn
 There is still a great deal to be learned about the Yugoslav affair. The sudden flareup between Yugoslavia and Albania, going much farther than the differences between Tito and the other communist members, is a puzzle within itself. Albania has been a Yugoslav dependency. She may have seized the opportunity to assert her independence. But, isolated as she is under Tito's guns, it wouldn't seem too likely. Also, the entire propaganda buildup for a split between Albania and Yugoslavia came from Belgrade. Until the announcement of defense measures, the silence in Tirana was mindful of the silence in Warsaw while Hitler was preparing his case for aggression against Poland.
 Could it be that Tito has designs on Albania and that the whole flareup came when Russia, not that a purely speculative question demonstrates it, was unable to furnish the satellites which surround attempts to appraise the situation within the Russian sphere.

Russia Disunity Rumored
 There were reports several months ago of disunity within Russia, not only among sections of the population but within the political leadership. Confidential reports from Moscow at the time cautioned American observers against any dependence on Russian disunity. It was emphasized that, whatever might occur within the Politburo, it would always present a united front against foreigners.
 However, there has been wonderment for some time that the Russian Communist party, supposed to meet every three years, has not yet convened since the war. Are there forces at work within Russia which cause the masters to fear such a meeting? We can't know.
 But we do know there are new, re-developed cracks in the outer shell of communism. It is only natural to speculate on how deep they may go.
