Arabs, Jews Fight Anew As 4-Week Truce Ended

CAIRO, July 9 (AP)—Arabs and Jews again took up arms to settle the Palestine question today and fighting erupted in both the northern and southern parts of the Holy Land.

A Jewish communiqué said Israeli troops counter-attacked and captured three Egyptian-held villages near Be'er Sheva.

The Israeli army and air force attacked irregular Arab forces at Be'er Sheva and Haifa.

Haifa's airport was closed and planes attacked a Jewish position in the north of Haifa.

Earlier, however, he had told newsmen in Amman that he and his associates had discussed "many things" in the past week.

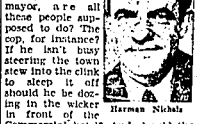

ECONOMIC RAT RACE

Prices are zooming again. The brief halt in this spring's upward spiral was too good to be true. We're off for some more inflation.

Food prices are getting back to their all-time high of last winter. Clothing is up, fuel is up, some rents are up, electrical gadgets are up, automobiles are up. Building materials, building labor and the overall cost of construction are climbing.

The third round of wage raises faltered temporarily, but as prices stiffened and began climbing employers found it hard to resist demands, though it seems probable that the pay boosts will be reflected in more price boosts that will call for a fourth round of wage demands. And so on ad infinitum, which is how a Latin word might say "until something busts."

Close one eye it is easy to see that workers ought to rescue the nation from inflation by passing up raises so as not to push up prices any higher. Obviously industry can't go on absorbing pay boosts forever. Closing the other eye it is easy to see that business ought to absorb rising costs for the good of the country. Obviously workers can't be expected to be satisfied with present pay scales when the cost of living goes up. Being realistic, it is safe to predict that workers will do their best to maintain their buying power, and their will do its best to make a bit of profit above costs. The see-saw will keep going until one of two things happens.

The balloon may burst with a loud pop, and then we would have another terrible depression. Or production may, eventually, satisfy the huge remaining demand for consumer goods. Then the curve ought to flatten out at some level of inflation yet to be determined.

Meanwhile our already too small supply of money is being used to provide the European relief program. Our contribution to the ERP is not dollars. It is goods. It is 20 per cent of our cotton, close to 5 per cent of our coal, more than half of 1 per cent of our steel, 8 per cent of our farm machinery, 3 per cent of our trucks, more heavy electrical equipment than we can spare.

The fundamental long-range reason prices are too high, and rising again, is because as a people we have more money to spend than our store-keepers have goods to sell. Take the case of the store shelves, and the tendency will be for prices to rise yet higher.

This is no argument against ERP. The fate of the world and of our country depends upon the success of ERP.

It is an argument for making ERP work. More as a relief program than we want to give relief, but as a recovery program. The best thing ERP could do would be to make Europe self-sufficient, to the extent that she had something to sell us for everything we sell her.

We are paying billions in taxes to finance ERP. That is something to gripe about as income tax installments come due. But the big price we may pay is in added inflation. For that, it is utterly essential that we get our money's worth in a sound, self-supporting, recovery program. Europe that will stand with us against all forms of authoritarianism including the Bolshevik.

CAN THIS BE 'SLAVE LABOR'?

As the left-wing United Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers (UE) is one of the bitterest critics of the Taft-Hartley Labor Act. Though it represents hundreds of thousands of workers, its officers have refused to take the non-communist oath, which would give them use of NLRB facilities for negotiating a bargain. Nevertheless the UE now reports that in the past year it has signed up 72 new employers, has won \$100,000,000 in wage increases for 450,000 members. Many who don't belong to any union think the Taft-Hartley act has flaws. But the charge that it makes for "slave labor," or that it renders labor unions impotent, is disproved by the UE's own boasts of its accomplishments under the law.

MAYBE DEWEY THOUGHT OF THIS

Felicitations were missed one possibility in speculating about the split duties he had to GOP National Chairman Hugh D. Scott, Jr. and to Herbert Brownell as Candidate Dewey's campaign manager. Provisions of '48 Farm Aid Act Explained

WASHINGTON, July 9 (AP)—Department of agriculture officials say the new long-range farm law, approved in the closing hours of congress, moves toward a philosophy of plenty.

The act, known as the agricultural act of 1948, works this way: It continues, with some changes, the present high wartime price supports through 1949. Then the longer plan, with lower price support, goes into effect.

Department spokesmen say the purpose is to give some support to abundant crops, but not so much support that the man who has to buy food has to pay prices too high for his pocketbook.

The new law has a new method of financing parity prices. The formula attempts to define the buying power of farm products during a period of full farm production.

The new law averages prices for all farm commodities during a recent 10-year period. Then this average is used, as the base of figuring, to establish a "modern" relationship among the crops and the price they bring.

The sum was authorized by the federal aid highway act of 1947, spending in the year beginning July 1, 1947. Actual construction will depend upon congressional appropriations.

happens to Zhdanov.
