

### Strike Is Ended by 'Captives'

WASHINGTON, July 13 (AP)—A captive coal miners' strike was settled today. Both sides agreed to put aside their union shop dispute—at least temporarily—and sign a contract covering other working conditions. They agreed to allow the union shop issue to be decided by the courts, with the result to be incorporated into the new contract.

Federal Judge T. Alan Goldsboro today reported that an extraordinary news conference the United Mine Workers and the nation's 10 largest steel companies had agreed on a compromise formula to settle their dispute over the union shop.

This will make unnecessary a hearing scheduled before Goldsboro tomorrow on a government injunction request.

The contract will be signed this morning. The miners will return to work tomorrow morning.

CONVENTION HALL, PHILADELPHIA, July 13 (AP)—President Truman let it be known today that he would "welcome" Sen. Alben W. Barkley of Kentucky as a vice presidential running mate.

That apparently settled the ticket question for the Democratic convention except for the formalities. "These will come tomorrow. There remained the outside possibility that Barkley might waive off the No. 2 spot. Hardly any delegate thought he would, but for the time being Barkley was not saying. He said only that he had not made up his mind and would not until he stepped down tonight as temporary convention chairman and turns the gavel over to Sam Rayburn of Texas.

### Indian Camps Of Past Ages Rediscovered

Have you ever found an arrowhead? If you do, you know what a thrill it is—and if you haven't, you have missed something.

Upon finding an arrowhead, many questions are immediately brought to mind. Who made it? Where did the people get it? Where did they come from? How and when did they live? Most of these questions remain unanswered.

These bits of beautifully chipped stone, fashioned with an art which is nearly forgotten today, are found at the ancient hunting camps of tribes long since forgotten—left by a nomadic people as they fished the rivers and hunted for game.

Used for Weapons  
Arrows and spears tipped with these symmetrically fashioned rock fragments were used for weapons. What a task it must have been for an ancient Indian with his primitive tools to shape crude pieces of stone into weapons upon which his life and the lives of his people depended.

Scores of such points were unearthed in the construction of the Blue Lake Country club's new golf course, located in the Snake river canyon one-half mile west of the Ferrine Memorial bridge.

Some Buried Deep  
The arrowheads were found when grading and leveling began on east-west freeway No. 1. This points were found at depths varying from a few inches to six feet below the surface of the ground, attesting to the length of time the area was used as a camp.

The points are made from red and black obsidian, a substance which glitters brightly when held in sunlight and has a general composition somewhat like glass.

Not All Obsidian  
All points of this type are not made of obsidian, however. Many are made of flint, bone, antler, shell, wood and sometimes even iron. It was not until the migration of the white man to the west that Indians began to use iron.

The shape of arrowheads and spearpoints usually is triangular or a pointed oval. Many are notched in order that a shaft with a slotted edge, could be fastened to the point with a arrow, ranch or con.

Many of the points found in the canyon were small and probably were used for hunting fish. Water-soaked tempered wooden points were used for hunting birds and rabbits which they were used for fishing, so stone heads were substituted.

The larger points found probably were used for knives instead of spearheads. The way the edges of the stone have been sharpened indicates a use in cutting rather than one of penetration.

Good Hunters  
The craftsmanship shown in these points is of a high nature. The men who made them were good hunters and fishermen and had a good supply of food or they would not have had the time to make some of the perfect specimens found.

Herds of buffalo roamed the plains and salmon ran up the river as far as Shoshone falls in those bygone days. Indian women ground grain into meal on grinding stones which have been found in the vicinity of the springs.

The high canyon walls provided protection against marauding tribes and aboriginal the camps from the winds. The river provided food and transportation, and game was available at the waterholes and springs.

Simple Lives  
These people lived simple lives and left few traces of their civilization. All that remains is the points from their weapons, and portions of their history told in the legends of present-day Indians.

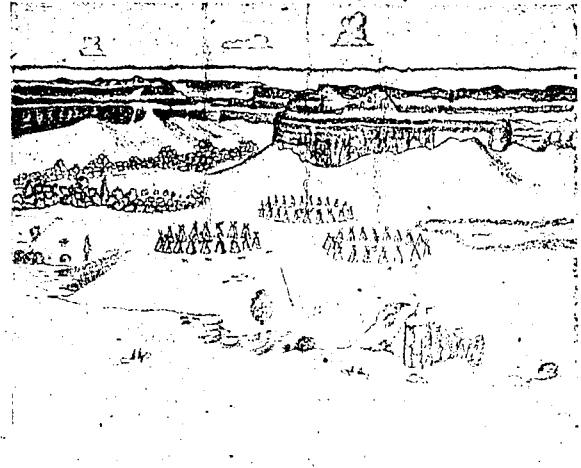
It is a fascinating chapter in nature's great book of history—much of which remains unread and little understood.

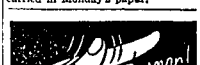

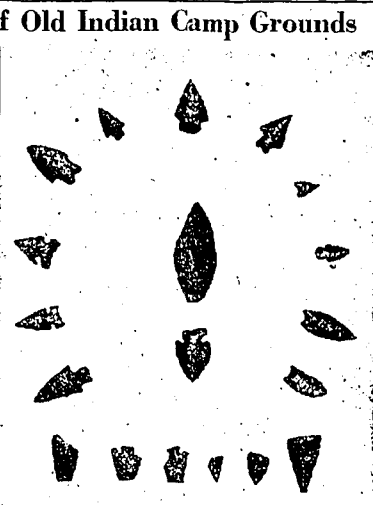

### Allies Keep up Front Against Red Blockade

**By J. M. ROBERTS, Jr.**  
AP Foreign Affairs Analyst

The allies are continuing to build up their front against Soviet expansion in Berlin amid a strong air of expectancy that some sort of a break in the blockade will occur. London dispatches refer to the "critical" week-end just passed, and to the faithful week ahead, and Berlin correspondents report speculation that a Russian reply to allied demands is in the offing.

**U. S. Site Tight**

United States officials, meanwhile, are sitting tight, professing a complete lack of foreknowledge of what comes next.

Russian propaganda, at first directed toward outer of the allies, now apparently is directed more toward producing another four-power conference on all Germany. The firm determination of the allies not to produce another four-power conference on all Germany, however, seems to be that Russia will refuse to lift the blockade prior to a four-power conference, presiding on the foreign minister level. The western powers have no stomach for more of that.

**Willing to Talk**

The United States is willing to talk when the blockade is lifted, but only on the same old low-level basis.

This brings the allies flatly up against the question of what to do if Russia remains adamant. The practical situation is that the allies, while putting up a solid front, know that they cannot supply Berlin by air when confronted by the flying weather and winter demands for coal.

**Wonder How Long**

Many observers already are wondering how long the allies can ignore Russia's tactics. They are chief negotiations, no matter how much their motives are suspected. If Russia continues the blockade of Berlin, it will appear more and more evident that if conditions begin to stabilize by the thousands, if pneumonia begins to stalk through healthy and light-colored dwellings, and if the already-falling productivity of the western sector becomes a complete calamity, it is certain that the allies will have to negotiate, for the record if for nothing else.

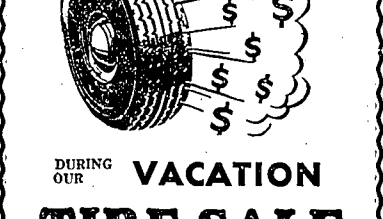

PHILADELPHIA, July 13 (AP)—The golden voice is gone. That was the paramount fact as the Democratic convention opened yesterday like a football team starting a game with four men trying to play quarterback.

The great signal call is dead. There is no one here to say "my friends" and the divergent aims, motives of the Democratic party in the brotherhood of the Democratic loyalists.

You have to have a hero or several heroes. And none has come here yet.

In the opening hour of its fifth annual quadrennial bid for power, the historic Democratic party is as split apart as the marching would-be heirs to a rich man's legacy.



**FBI Personality Missing**  
What is missing here is that personality, the unifying magic of the last leader—the purple Democrat, Franklin D. Roosevelt.

There is no doubt among most delegates here that the inheritor of his mantle, Harry Truman, will be nominated to lead the party.

But they are preparing to nominate him in a unifying atmosphere of revolt over an internal problem affecting one-tenth of the American population—the Negro citizens.

This subject controlled in the attention of the delegates at this stage the "high cost of living, the world crisis, or any other problem facing the nation."

No One Optimistic  
It outweighs even the prospects of victory in November. In two days here I have heard no delegate even bring up the topic in an optimistic vein.

There is no hero or potential hero yet on the scene. There is little parading or open enthusiasm for the leader they know they will pick—Truman. There are more arguments than there are cheers.

This is the surface picture today as the Democrats meet to organize, after nearly 16 years in power, against a resurgent Republican party.

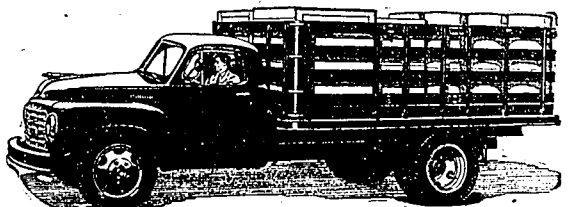
