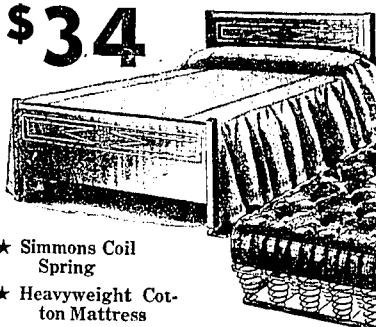

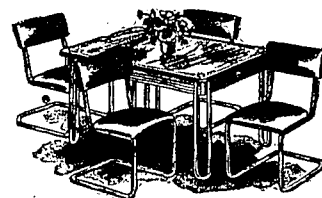

Rockies Teem With Tourists; Survey Shows

DENVER, July 22 (AP)—The Rocky mountains are teeming this summer with as many tourists as ever, but the postwar spending spree has slackened in the plushier vacation resorts.

Pleasure hunters who lured around the stark mountain lodges a year ago are reveling this season in the aptly named joys of camping out under the stars or sleeping in their automobiles and trailers.

Travelers into Colorado have less money because of higher costs at home, the Denver Visitors bureau said today. A survey of officials in six mountain states showed heavy travel, but less spending than during the 1947 record season.

Park Attendance up

The Yellowstone and Rocky mountain national parks, two of the favorite public vacation centers, report sharply increased attendance over last year's all-time high.

But luxurious hotels and lodges on the fringe of the natural wonders report less business.

At Jackson Hole, Wyo., near Yellowstone, John Wort, operator of one of the town's most popular hotels and camp trailers, said that more and more camping rigs are on the road this year. "There are just as many tourists, but they're spending only half as much," he declared.

Bill Wallace of Jackson Hole's Meadowbrook lodge in Wyoming said business "doesn't compare with last year when we were sleeping the majority in lobby chairs every night."

Modest Budgets

The Montana Chamber of Commerce reported eight per cent more tourists entered the state in June and the first two weeks of July than in the same 1947 period. But the number of free spending tourists and camp trailers and motor homes are traveling on more modest budgets in 1948. More and more of them are resorting to sleeping in the open.

Early summer floods damaged roads in northern Idaho and temporarily closed travel business there. Scenic spots are jammed now but the flow of dollars has caused some resort managers to conclude "people just aren't spending any more."

Utah officials reported a travel center coinciding with that in the other five mountain states.

70 Members of 4-H Clubs Attend First Day of Judging School Held Near Buhl

BUHL, July 22—More than 70 members of nine 4-H clubs attended the opening day of the Twin Falls county 4-H livestock judging school Wednesday on the ranch of Bud McNulty two miles south of Buhl.

Under the guidance of State Swine Specialist Wade Wells, the club members from the west end of Twin Falls county judged purebred Poland China swine owned by McNulty.

Wells, who is considered one of the outstanding livestock judges in the northwest, prefaced the judging with an analysis of the outstanding traits used in judging swine.

He pointed out to the class that the price of pork in its various forms governed to a large extent the value of individual pigs and young boars used in the judging.

Wells outlined the main points to look for in selecting good beef cattle, emphasizing the bone structure and body lines. After the instruction the class was organized for more instruction.

Purchased registered Hereford cattle owned by Henry Lehman were the subjects of the first section of the afternoon section of judging.

FDR 'Critical' Of Food When Under Duress

WASHINGTON, July 22 (AP)—Herietta Nesbitt says she could always tell, when she was White House housekeeper, for the Roosevelt family, when the war was building to a new emergency.

The President would get choosy about his food, Mrs. Nesbitt says that in her 13 years in the White House it was the only way in which she saw the President abstain.

Each morning Mrs. Roosevelt would find out what her husband wanted to eat that day and phone Mrs. Nesbitt's office. Once Mrs. Nesbitt heard the President exclaim: "Damn it, I don't want beef!" (It was the only time she ever heard him swear.)

Genito Query

Then she heard Mrs. Roosevelt ask genito: "What do you want?" "I want steak," he said.

Mrs. Nesbitt's story was published under the title "White House Diary" (Doubleday).

She writes that the President's favorite pie was America's favorite pie—apple. He preferred chocolate ice cream. But he also liked oysters, wild turkey, alone crab, terrapin.

He had definite ideas on his preparation. Once the cook warned: "The President likes a duck just chased through the flame."

Fala Got Biscuit

The President's favorite cake was fruit, and Mrs. Roosevelt's was angel food. They both liked a crab meat soup the receipt for which was found among Mrs. George Washington's records. The President's breakfast tray always included a dog biscuit for Fala.

Like other American husbands the President ate left-overs on the day after company.

Mrs. Nesbitt's story also includes amusing anecdotes of happenings in the White House.

Slept on Couch

Once there were so many guests that Mrs. Roosevelt slept on a couch in the hall and another lady on the President's bed.

One tea was ready for 300 and Mrs. Roosevelt waited. No one came.

The White House maid brought her forgotten to mail the invitations.

When Mrs. Roosevelt and Mrs. Nesbitt made their first inspection of the kitchen they found the kitchen dirty and almost empty of utensils. It took a four-year struggle, but they finally succeeded in getting money from their allowance to put in a modern kitchen.

War Scare Is Eased by Use Of Diplomacy

Last week-end's war scare has been much allayed by news that the western allies are turning back to diplomacy in an effort to settle the Berlin crisis.

It has been just a week since word went out over the pipelines that officials were considering the use of armed convoys to break the Russian blockade. Whether it was put out to test Russian reaction, to try out western public opinion or, as it seemed, as one of many possibilities under consideration, is not entirely clear.

Whatever the actual consideration at that time, the atmosphere now is different. Secretary Marshall declares that he still will not submit to coercion, but there is renewed tendency to seek unexplored areas of compromise. Apparently we intend to build up a record for United Nations consideration if negotiations fail. That was the original idea, before Moscow rejected the recent allied protests.

The new note reported to have been drawn up in London appears to be very much in the "proposed" stage, since President Truman and other Washington officials still have to consider the personal report of General Clay. The British give us a hint, however, that it does not close the door on four-power consideration of at least some German problems other than those directly affecting Berlin. This is one of the points on which the nations have been at odds, the allies insisting on the Berlin blockade as a separate question. The Russians demanded another overall conference on Germany.

If the allies now are willing to reopen the discussion of all-German issues, it represents a compromise

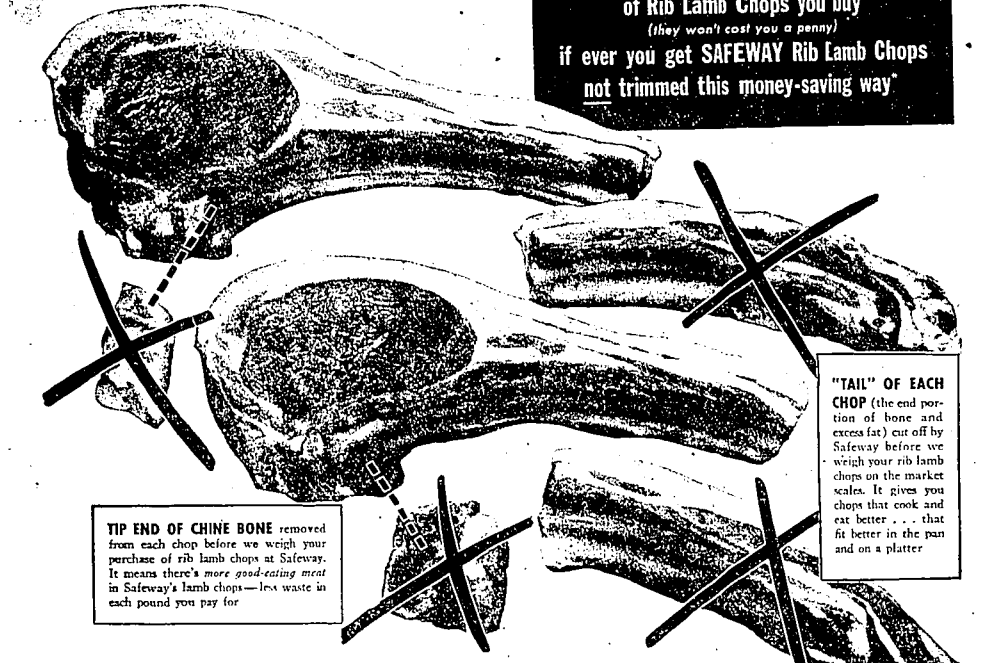
