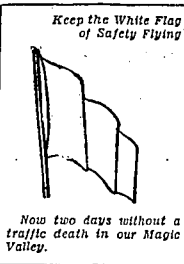

Idaho's PUC OK's Interim Hike in Rates

BOISE, Aug. 2 (UP)—The public utilities commission today has given Idaho motor freight lines temporary permission to boost their rates 15 per cent, but reserved the right to make adjustments later. The carriers had asked for a 20 per cent increase, the same percentage increase as was granted July 17 to railroads operating in the states.

Bert Auer, commission president, explained that by retaining jurisdiction in the case the commission could review the matter later on with a view to national economic conditions.

The new rates will be effective upon at least five days' notice to the public. The commission said all the carriers' witnesses at a public hearing held last April had contended that the intrastate traffic to be borne in proper share of the transportation burden. But the commission said that a man in different rates is not constructive proof that either of the rates is improper and should be changed.

The commission said the "controlling" factor is cost and that the carriers had failed to submit cost data. Thus the PUC rate rate comparisons were of little value.

Not Justified The commission said the applicants had not justified any increase in present minimum or miscellaneous charges. The PUC said it had been particularly difficult to reach a decision due to a lack of uniformity in the accounts and showings of the carriers doing less than 40,000 a year business, and the necessity of formulating and establishing such uniform system.

Alfred C. Gordon, Pocatello, represented the Idaho Farm Bureau federation as opposed to the proposed increases during the April hearings.

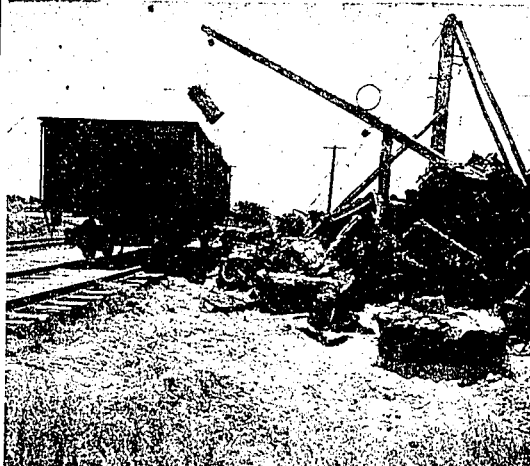

Grain Stocks in State Above '47 BOISE, Aug. 2 (UP)—Grain stocks on July 1 included 2,910,000 bushels of wheat, 140,000 bushels of corn, 1,970,000 bushels of oats, or 4 per cent more than on the same date last year.

The aggregate was 4 per cent below the 1947 average, the bureau of agricultural economics reported. Total wheat stocks July 1 last year and about 30 per cent above the same month in 1946. Farm stocks were 1,539,000 bushels compared with 404,000 last year and 783,000 in 1946. Farm stocks were 1,517,000 bushels this year compared with 1,240,000 bushels last year.

Total corn stocks amounted to 140,000 bushels, including 115,000 bushels on farms. The total compared with 164,000 bushels last year and 152,000 bushels in 1946. Off farm stocks of oats were 192,000 bushels, compared with 143,000 last July 1.

Local Men Construct Machine To Bale Metals for Shipment

By CHARLES LAMB 400 tons constant pressure. Thickening of the bale varies up to 14 inches, and weights from 200 to 500 pounds, depending on the amount of scrap in the pile. The next step of ejecting the bale is done by reversing the comb plunger sufficient for insertion of a steel head-block behind the bale. A gate is lifted mechanically, and the plunger forces the nearly-compressed bale out of the center-chamber and up the loading ramp. The gate is lowered, head-block raised, and the machine is ready for more metal. The entire procedure takes an average of slightly less than four minutes, and is accomplished by three men.

They had long been a practicing in Magic Valley but two Twin Falls men have built a baler to compress old car bodies, stoves and miscellaneous scrap metal into neat, rectangular blocks for shipment to market. The 35-ton metal presser was designed, engineered and built by Aubrey C. Mays and Dean Mays, Twin Falls. It is now being operated by the Mays and Dean Mays near the Union Pacific roundhouse.

Months of trial-and-error experimentation were required to build the baler. The first car was routed to the Colorado Fuel and Iron company smelters in Pueblo, Colo. The device was first evolved by Aubrey C. Mays in 1938 while he watched a hydraulic metal presser in operation at Kansas City, Kans., steel yards. Contrary to statements of steel company engineers that a similar machine could not be built for less than \$50,000 and was an impossibility without employing hydraulics or compressed air, the home-made presser was constructed at half under half that figure, with strictly mechanical means of operation.

Scrap metal is fed by hand into a pile of feet deep, 10 feet long and 47 by 15 inches. A square 17-ton comb plunger compresses the many-layered metal pieces into a space 47 by 15 inches. The plunger, running on a nine-foot greased runway, is pushed forward and backward by a 100-horsepower stationary engine, stepped up to 3,000 horsepower at the drive shaft, pulley unit of the type used in logging. The bale's thickness is then determined by dropping a four-ton pile driver powered by the same engine, from a height of 34 feet. The impact is equal to an exertion of

Idlewild Field Largest, Most Costly Airport

NEW YORK, Aug. 2 (UP)—The New York International Airport which was dedicated Saturday by President Truman and Gov. Thomas E. Dewey, is the world's largest and most costly commercial airport. The seven and one-half square mile field—520 acres—has cost \$100,000,000 since the city let the first construction contract in April, 1943. Cost Quarterly Bulletin Before the job is finished in 1954, an estimated quarter billion dollars will have been spent on field hangars and buildings and approaches.

The Idlewild airport is more than eight times the size of Los Angeles' field's 560 acres. It will be nearly four times the size of Newark, N. J., airport when the port authority expands that field to 1,300 acres. Idlewild's capacity will be 1,000 scheduled flights a day. Newark, which is the next largest airport in commercial use in the east, and the Cleveland Center handle 600 flights daily. Washington's 700-acre national airport can handle 700 flights a day.

Only seven years ago, nearly three quarters of the sprawling field was merely flat at the bottom of Jamaica bay. Hydraulic pumps scooped 61,000,000 cubic yards of white sand from the bay and spread it eight feet deep over the tidelands. 100,000 tons of beach grass was planted by hand to anchor the sand's erosion wind and rain.

Delays Likely In Deferment Arrangement

WASHINGTON, Aug. 2 (UP)—Selective service officials said today it may be "some time yet" before a system of deferments can be worked out for the nation's new peacetime draft registrants. The law specifically exempts certain men from the draft. But selective service must decide the basis for deferments of other registrants such as married men and those with dependents.

19 Through 25 Eligible Youthful 18-through-25 must register for the draft by only those 19-through-25 may be inducted for 21 months service. The overwhelming majority of draftees will come from the ranks of men 18-through-21. Men who are now married are not expected to be drafted. But selective service must decide what to do about draft-age youths who marry or become fathers in the future. During World War II, dependency deferments were not given out unless the marriage or birth took place before a certain date.

Some Deferments It has been announced that there will be deferments for some key industrial and government workers. The new regulations will have to take into account the needs of the draft law grants automatic deferments to citizens, theologians, students, 10-year-old high school students, and most veterans. Selective Service Director Lewis B. Hershey has estimated that because of physical disabilities and deferments, not more than 10,000 men will be available from the ranks of men 22-through-25.

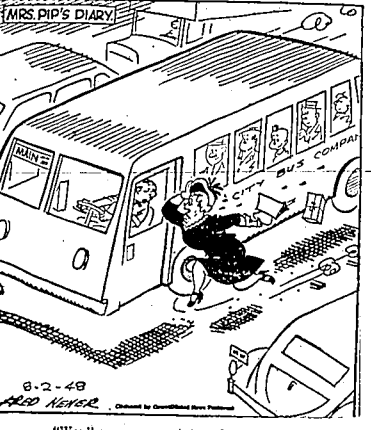

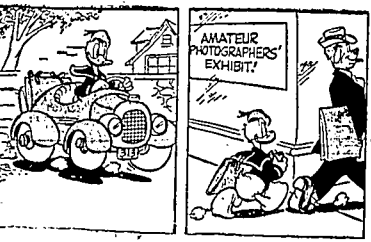

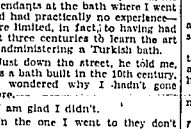
