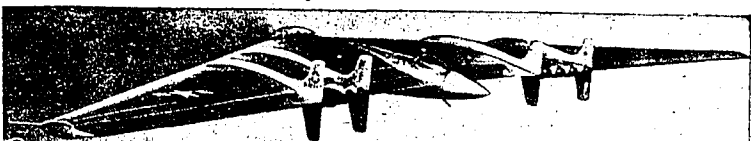

Wing Answers Prayer for Ideal Air Force Bomber

Experts Confident 'Wing' Will Answer Prayer of Air Force

By DOUGLAS LARSEN, NEA Staff Correspondent. WASHINGTON, (NEA)—The air force has super-fast bombers which can fly faster than 600 miles-per-hour.

It has long-range bombers which can hit targets 4,000 miles away and return to the original starting point.

But what the air force really needs, and wants, is a combination long-range, super-fast bomber, which it doesn't have today.

The closest thing to this combination is the Northrop B-49 flying wing. Both its speed and range are a secret. All the air force will say is that the plane has the longest range of any jet bomber.

Other jet bombers, according to the air force, have radii of operation between 600 and 1,000 miles.

The air force has just purchased 30 B-49s for experimental purposes. This is a big order and means that the experts have great confidence in the possibility of this radically-shaped airplane.

The idea of a flying wing was first suggested in 1912 by an airplane designer and manufacturer John K. Northrop in 1923. Today it is relatively simple to build an aircraft design. Then it is evolutionary and according to many of the experts of that day, completely impossible.

Northrop knew that it was the wing of a plane which provided the lift and enabled it to rise into air. He also figured out that the body of the plane, or fuselage, must be in the shape of just flatness with the air as far as the aerodynamic characteristics of the plane went.

Northrop came up with the first flying wing in the air without a tail. Even birds have tails. So in 1923 Northrop came up with the first flying wing in the air without a tail. It was called a flying wing but it had a tail boom out in back for the rudder and elevator. It made many flights and provided much valuable experimental data.

But up until then the advantage of a flying wing was not appreciated.

Storage Facilities Urged for Grains—Ben Janzen, Twin Falls county agricultural conservation chairman, urged that farmers build additional storage facilities where needed to handle the bumper crop expected this fall.

He predicted Monday the anticipated record 1934 grain crop would catch farmers throughout the country short of storage space by some 600,000,000 bushels capacity. If present storage provisions are not increased.

There is little chance to expand country and terminal elevator storage sufficiently to handle the increase without loss, and farmers are encouraged to erect adequate storage buildings on their farms for their individual grain harvests, Janzen said.

He added that loans are available to support the price of wheat, oats, barley and corn, providing the grain is stored properly.

Parallel to the large grain crop outlook, loss and expense attending that all crops will be needed, and none should be allowed to spoil through improper storage.

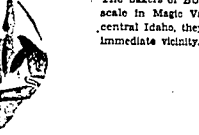

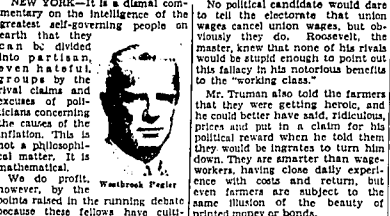

Leninism Said Reds' Religion In "Cold War"

Leninism is prominently combative.

Those are the words of Joseph Stalin, first prophet of the religion of Leninism. Coupled with the fanatical fear of the communists that befalls in party discipline will threaten the entire structure and therefore must be dealt with implacably, they probably account for the great stir being created over the disident Russian school teachers in New York.

Russia's hysteria is probably more seeming than real, a part of a general campaign of pin-pricking over every issue.

Quoting Lenin

A dictator does not let his subjects see the ideas that they can escape and fight back. Stalin is fond of quoting Lenin:

"Almost everyone knows... that the bolsheviks would not have been able to hold power (in Russia) had there not been the strictest possible discipline."

Now that discipline is considered doubly essential to Stalin organizers for his showdown with the rest of the world. As far back as 1927 Stalin envisioned a world with two centers—Russia for the communists and America for the capitalists—and predicted a fight between them which would "decide the fate of capitalism and communism for the entire world."

Cries America

"To that end," he added several years later, "we just work in order to form real revolutionary cadres and a real revolutionary leadership of the proletariat, capable of leading the many millions of the American working class toward the revolutionary class struggle."

Well, he did pretty well for a while in some American labor unions, always his first objective everywhere, until they learned more about Leninism and what it had done in Russia. The reaction has been terrific. If not complete, the communists who hoped to lead many unions have been driven underground, if not completely out.

Colosseum in Rome Is Set For Spectacle

ROME, Aug. 17 (AP)—After centuries of alliance and gloom, Rome's colosseum will soon shine again with lights and gladiators.

The old Roman circus, where 500 wild animals were killed in a 100-day series of inauguration celebrations in the year 80 A.D., under Emperor Titus, has survived earthquakes, destruction and centuries of wars, invasion and foreign occupations.

Projects Building

Two centuries ago Pope Benedict XIV, to protect the building against demolition, commissioned the interior to be refitted as a church. The interior will feature a convention of Catholic youth in the colosseum.

Many technical and artistic problems had to be solved before the 10-century-old monument could be considered for the show.

200,000 to participate

In September more than 300,000 Catholic young men and women will come to Rome. Their pilgrimage is considered as a mass rehearsal for the 1950 holy year celebrations.

The colosseum measures 572 yards in circumference and the long diameter of the elliptical structure is 265 yards. Its height is 157 feet. It can hold 80,000 spectators. The building, originally called "amphitheatrum flavium" is considered the largest theatre and one of the most imposing structures of the world.

Various remains of prehistoric man found in Europe are estimated to date as far back as 250,000,000 years ago.

Revision in the 1948 potato price support program has extended the deadline for marketing potatoes supported under that program from Dec. 31, 1948 to around April 30, 1949, Ben Jansen, chairman, Twin Falls agricultural conservation committee, announced Monday.

The support price on potatoes will continue at 90 per cent of parity through the entire marketing season, with support methods other than loans to be made available by the AOA, he said.

The price support program will include purchase, diversion, and export operations as well as loans. Participation in the loan program will not affect a grower's eligibility for other price support benefits.
