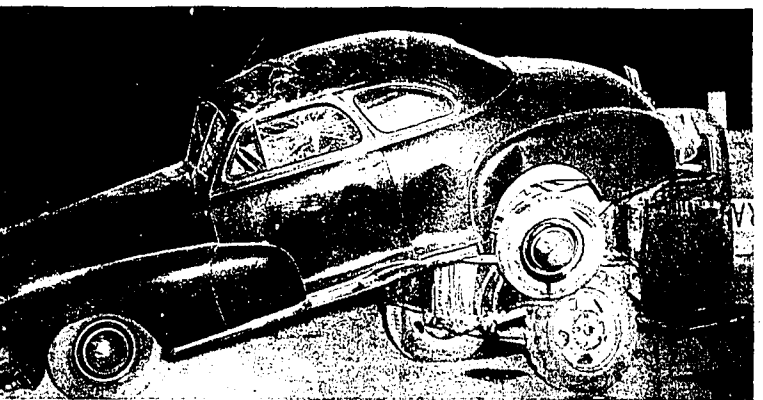

Air Post to Rush Package Service

Immigration on Sept. 1 of air parcel post service will give Twin Falls overnight delivery of packages to practically every city in the nation.

C. L. Palmer, United Air lines manager at Twin Falls, announced Monday.

Palmer predicted the new service will be especially helpful to retail merchants who will be able to limit high-cost inventories by routing orders to meet sudden local demands.

4. Workers whose special skills in industry require that they stay on the job.
5. Those physically or mentally unfit.
6. Members of the armed services.
7. Veterans who served more than 90 days in any of the armed services between Dec. 8, 1941, and Sept. 2, 1945.
8. A sole surviving son of a family

In which one or more sons or daughters were killed in action or died in line of duty while serving in the armed forces during World War II.

9. Conscientious objectors.
10. Ministers and clergymen.
11. Public officials deferred by law, including governors of states and territories, members of congress, members of state legislatures and judges.

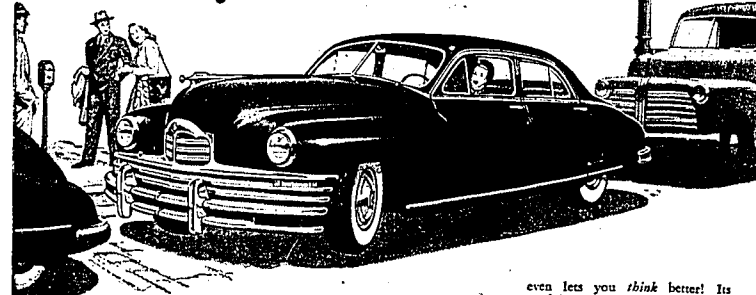

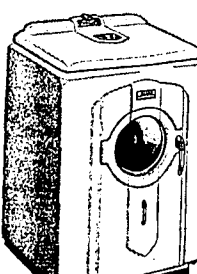

Growers Say Idaho Firms Violate Trust

BOISE, Aug. 23 (AP)—Two Idaho companies and their officials have been listed as defendants in a complaint filed by an Iowa corn seed company in federal district court.

The Michael-Leonard company of Iowa was listed as plaintiff in a suit against the Caldwell Seed company and the Orem Seed company of Caldwell.

Secret Method

The Iowa corporation charges their own secret method of producing seed corn is being used by the two Idaho firms.

C. A. Davenport of Caldwell, president and director of both Idaho companies, is charged with having used the secret and retaining it after employment by the Michael-Leonard firm.

A seed corn product of the two Idaho companies is alleged to be similar to a seed produced by the Iowa firm.

Violated Trust

The Michael-Leonard company charges in its complaint that Davenport violated the trust of his employment by producing the "substantially identical" with the plaintiff's product "referred to" as "substantially identical" with the plaintiff's product.

The plaintiff asks the court to enjoin the two Idaho companies from further production and sale of "substantially identical" seed corn to which they are entitled to their own supplies of this seed corn to them.

Henry Frowns on Guide Book Advising Tour of Delhi Street

By HENRY McLENNOR
NEW DELHI, India — The guide book told me that I must see Chandni Chowk, the principal thoroughfare of old Delhi and for centuries one of the great streets of this part of the world.

So I went to Chandni Chowk. I took me nearly two hours to walk to its quarters of a mile length. There may be other streets in the world which can match it for filth and equine manure, but I doubt if there is one such thing as walking along Chandni Chowk. You push and are pushed, and there is no house at all—just a mat in the mud.

Since the partition of India, fully half a million refugees have come to Delhi, and most of them have come to live in the narrow lanes. There used to be just one row of shops and houses on each side of the street. Now there are five and six rows, consisting of anything that will keep out the rain and the sun. Cardboard houses. Straw huts. Shacks of propelled tin. And, here and there, on houses at all—just a mat in the mud.

To try to make a living the refugees sell anything. Here will be a man with nothing more to sell than a half dozen mangoes. There will be a displaced woman offering a pair of shoes. All about run naked babies, covered with filth. Of the filth millions of them. They cover the sidewalks and the drains of the vendors. They all but obscure the sun. There is no use in attempting to brush them off. Flick away 10 and 100 swoop down to crawl on and pester you.

No car can negotiate Chandni Chowk. In English, means silver market. Nowhere in India can one find filth workers in precious metal. The delivery of their work is unbelievable. But one foot from the entrance to a shop there will be a buffalo, knee deep in mud, gazing placidly at a refugee asleep on the ground, his head pillowed by a coxy mud and his body covered with filth. Chandni Chowk is a place where one can buy a priceless ruby or sapphire and, when leaving the shop, stumble over a family which does not have a home, a single possession, and little hope of ever gaining any one of them.

How the children exist is a mystery. The life expectancy is 35 years, and that must be an optimistic estimate. Dirt. Disease. Little or no medical care. No such thing as orange juice, clean clothes, vitamins, etc.

I wish I hadn't gone to Chandni Chowk.

It's liable to make a missionary out of me.

And I just wasn't cut out for that sort of thing.

New Drug Is Used in Cure For Allergies

CHICAGO, Aug. 23 (AP)—A new drug has been more than 90 per cent effective in treating 142 cases of hay fever and other allergic conditions, an Illinois physician reported today.

The best showing was obtained against hay fever, with "good results" reported in 88 of the 88 hay fever patients treated.

Reports in Journal

The drug is theophyllin, one of the antihistamine group. Dr. John Peters of suburban Oak Park reported on the use in an article in the Illinois Medical Journal.

His findings:

"The drug was effective in controlling symptoms of 91 per cent of patients suffering from both hay fever and asthma. There were three failures in a group of 34 cases.

Cures 75 Per Cent

In 18 cases of asthma, the drug was effective in 75 per cent of the patients. All of the failures were in patients suffering from bronchial asthma. The drug was 100 per cent effective in pollen and grass asthma.

Dr. Peters said theophyllin appears to be the least toxic of the antihistamines. Only 12 of the 142 patients treated suffered such undesirable reactions such as gastric disturbance, insomnia, nervousness and sweating.
