School Board Elections Are Forum Topic

"Why your school board election is important to you" was the topic of discussion over the Magic Valley forum on KLEK Tuesday evening.

Three Twin Falls people spoke on the subject and urged people living in the Twin Falls school district to go to the polls on Sept. 7 when school trustees will be chosen.

Mrs. Artie Kelly, vice president of the Lincoln PTA, speaking as a mother said parents should realize school trustees determine curriculum, textbooks, the hiring of teachers and the general management of the schools.

Fortunate Privilege

"I think we are fortunate to have the great American privilege of voting. Let's you and I keep this privilege, and the only way is to vote," stated Mrs. Kelly.

Ivan Garmand, local farmer, gave the taxpayers' point of view. He said 45 per cent of the total farm tax paid in Twin Falls county goes for the operation of schools. Saying he was not complaining, he went on to explain there is a "terrible lack of interest" in the trustee elections.

He said more money is spent on Idaho schools than administering the state government. He urged voters to cast their ballots at not school elections.

Asher E. Wilson, former member of the state board of education, a member of the state school reorganization committee and a member of the Twin Falls school board group, told of the financial problems involved in administering state funds to the schools.

He explained that the state is not furnishing enough money to equalize the cost of education between the high tax districts and low tax districts.

Earthquakes Hit In Italian Areas

ROME, Aug. 25 (AP)—Many thousands of southern Italians are camping out today, afraid to return to their homes because of earthquakes which have shaken them almost daily for a fortnight.

Poggiu, a city of 64,000, was described in Rome press dispatches as deserted. Authorities estimated 50 buildings will have to be torn down there and that 400 homes had been destroyed in nearby Montesantolo and San Giovanni Rotondo. Smoke and hot air issued from earth cracks near Montesantolo, the dispatches said.

The government is sending tents and medical supplies to the quake area, which extends in a belt across the Italian peninsula from Foggia to Naples.

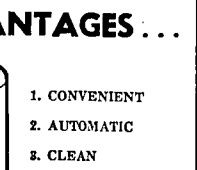

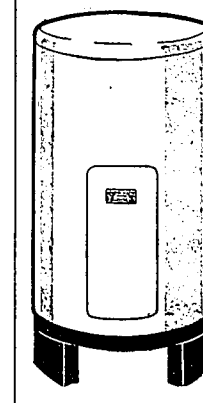

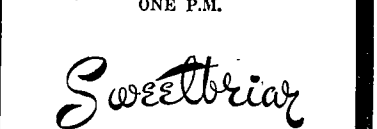

Chisox Break Yankee Victory Streak at 7

NEW YORK, Aug. 25 (AP)—The cellar-dwelling Chicago White Sox, pluffed over their three straight victories against Cleveland Indians, continued to play the role of giant-killers Tuesday, knocking off the New York Yankees, 6-5. The defeat, only their fifth in 18 meetings with the White Sox this season, snapped the hated Yankee's seven-day winning streak, but ruined a glorious chance to pick up ground on the leaders.

At that, the Yankees just missed the Sox with a belated ninth-inning rally. Southpaw Bill Wright, a former Yankee, who was credited with the victory, was the loser. He was touched up for nine hits and four runs in the seven innings he worked. What proved to be the winning run, though, were garnered off Joe Page, who once again failed the Yankees in relief.

Tony Lupin, the Harvard alum, and the venerable Duke Appling, were the leaders in the White Sox attack. Each collected three hits and each drove in two runs. Among Lupin's exploits were a double and home run. His homer, fifth of the season for him, tied the score in the fifth at 2-2.

The Sox went ahead in the sixth. With Page on the mound, the White Sox called two more times in the top of the ninth on successive hits by Floyd Baker, Lupin, Appling and Seery.
