





## Smith Claims GOP Rooting For Hinshaw

BOISE, Aug. 27 (AP)—Republican party political forces are consolidating for the election of Ezra Hinshaw as GOP state chairman, Tom W. Smith, Rexburg, said. Smith, the incumbent state chairman, is not seeking reelection. Hinshaw, a Boise businessman, is chairman of the GOP finance committee. The chairman will be selected at the state platform convention here Saturday.

To Name Committees  
Committee appointments for the convention will be announced tomorrow, Smith said. The resolutions committee will consist of a member from each county to be selected by the county group, he added. The credentials and rules and order committees each will have about seven members, he declared. Republican leaders arriving early for the convention today discussed the distribution of patronage on insurance schedules within the department of education, Smith said.

Sen. Henry C. Dworshak and Representatives Abe Goff and John Sandborn, all seeking reelection, will be the principal speakers at a picnic gathering tomorrow night.

Adding to the Republican party strength in the Idaho Federation of Republican Women's clubs opens its biennial convention tomorrow. The group will elect officers and discuss the women's part in the campaign.

Hinshaw Gains Support  
Hinshaw is gaining support within political circles for the state chairmanship, Smith said. Others who have been mentioned as "possibles" are Milton Hordley, Soda Springs; Harvey Schwendman, Newcastle; Branch Bird, Gooding; J. C. Tovey, Boise, and George Hart, Menan.

None have announced their candidacy for state chairman, he declared. Political observers say the selection for vice chairmanship is narrowing down to a contest between Mrs. Earl Wright, Dubois; Mrs. B. E. Meyers, Idaho Falls, and Mrs. C. E. Proctor, Twin Falls. Mrs. Homer Tottle, Pocatello, also has been prominently mentioned.

## Gooding Rancher Experiments On Mashed Spud Cattle Feed

GOODING, Aug. 27—Mashed potatoes by the carload! Nine carloads, in fact, have been mashed on the Ernest Fields ranch southwest of Gooding, to be fed to fatten about 150 head of Herefords this winter.

Potato ensilage is something relatively new in the way of feed for livestock in Idaho, although they have been fed just "fresh" for some time. The Caldwell experiment station has reported favorably on the new ensilage and Fields has been conducting an experimental project with government support-potatoes.

The upright type of silo is not satisfactory for storage of potato ensilage because of heavy moisture which clogs up blowers. So Fields and his son, Wesley, had a trench about 120 feet long, 10 feet deep and 15 feet wide, prepared for the potatoes.

There are several reasons for mashing or breaking up of the potatoes. First, it is difficult to keep rawly potatoes without spoilage; second is danger of blight when feeding whole potatoes. Large ones have been known to choke an animal, causing death.

The nine carloads purchased by the Fields cost about 25 cents per sack and possibly may be lower at a later date. To help preserve the mashed spuds, three per cent ground barley is added. This turns into a lactic acid culture to bring about the correct type of fermentation.

After trying several methods of breaking up the potato, Fields borrowed a machine which had been built by a Wendell machine shop. This machine had been built for another cattle company. It planned to mash the tuber the day they wished to feed. The machine is made of two rollers, a hopper and conveyor belt to carry out the mashed potato, which has been broken into three or four pieces.

After the potato-barley mixture was put into the trench, it was covered with about six inches of soil and straw. There is a large amount of water content which will sink into the ground, leaving the feed. Wesley said next time they

will add dry chopped hay first to absorb more moisture. The new ensilage will be fed in addition to wet beet pulp, ground grain and alfalfa hay. The new feed costs 20 per cent of ordinary feed, Wesley said cattle do have a sense of smell, but the possible their tastes differ from humans. They will leave other feed to eat potato ensilage, in spite of its smell.

### Idaho's Spud Growers Get Care Caution

MOSCOW, Aug. 27 (UP)—Idaho potato growers were warned today to be more careful with harvesting and handling methods in their fields and cellars this year.

E. N. Humphrey, agricultural engineer for the University of Idaho who is doing special potato harvesting research, said cracking of tubers is the primary handling error and that it can be reduced by decreasing the free fall of the potato during the harvest and handling.

Recommendations Given  
Humphrey's studies on reducing mechanical injuries during handling resulted in the following recommendations:  
Where potatoes are hand picked, a single chain level bed digger with a short drop to the machine to the ground is preferable to the two chain diggers.

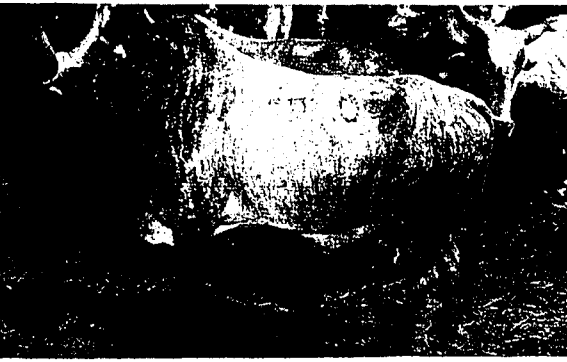

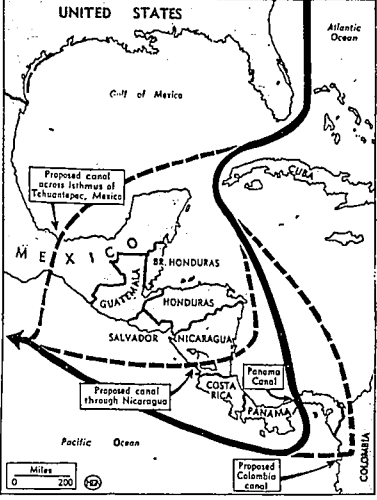

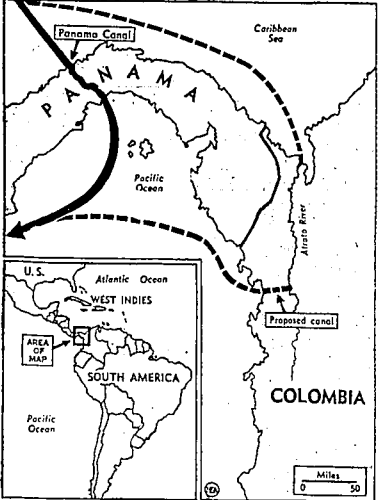

## U. S. Considers Canal Route to Augment Panama



The United States is thinking about building a new canal to link the Atlantic and Pacific oceans. The possibility of another interoceanic waterway has long been studied, but consideration is being speeded up as a result of Panama's refusal to let the U. S. fortify the Panama Canal, outside the 100-mile-wide Canal Zone. The map at left shows the route of the present canal, and routes of three proposed canal alternatives.

One would cross the Isthmus of Tehuantepec, Mexico, another would slice through Nicaragua, and the third would cross Colombia, in South America. Colombia and the U. S. have agreed to conduct a preliminary survey of this route, shown on map at right, which would link the Atrato River, which flows into the Caribbean sea, with the Pacific.

### Blood Swaps Are Made in Disease Cure

By ALTON L. BLAKESLEE AP Science Reporter

BUFFALO, N. Y., Aug. 27.—Successful treatment of a serious kidney disease in adults by giving them new blood for old was reported today by a French physician.

The patients are given a long transfusion which swaps their blood for new, healthy blood. This kind of swap in adults is unusual. It's frequently done in babies born with a dangerous blood condition caused by a substance known as the RII factor.

Described at Session The exchange of blood in 100 adults and older children was described by Dr. Marcel Deas of Paris at the closing session of the International Society of Hematology.

Normal blood donated by healthy persons is fed continuously into the vein of one arm while the patient's blood is drawn off from the other arm, he explained. Ten quarts of blood, or double the normal amount circulating in the body, are used to secure a nearly complete swap in the patient.

90 Per Cent Successful This treatment has been 90 per cent successful in curing nephritis, a kidney disease in which the blood becomes toxic or poisonous, Dr. Deas said. The new supply of healthy blood helps the kidneys return to normal function.

The blood swap also has brought temporary improvement in some cases of leukemia, a fatal blood disease. It doesn't cure. In 40 per cent of leukemia patients, the exchange brought improvement lasting up to four months, Dr. Deas said. But when the disease flares up again, a second exchange of blood helps only a little.

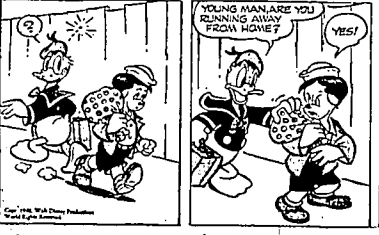

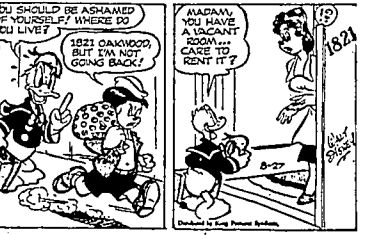

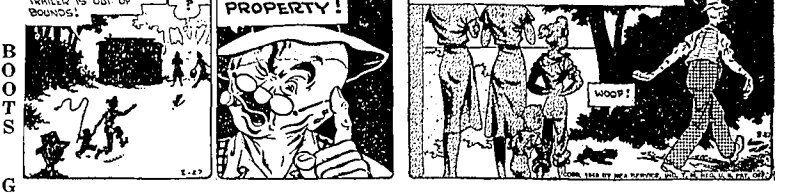

### Nation Facing Wave of Heat On Week-End

CHICAGO, Aug. 27 (AP)—A week-end of hot, muggy weather—good for the growing crops but horrible for humans—appears in prospect for most of the nation.

Federal forecasters said today they could see no break in the hottest weather of the summer season. They said temperatures, which have ranged in the 90s to above 100 over the heat belt, may drop a few degrees in some areas. But rising humidity has brought even more discomfort to the sweltering millions in the hot zone from the Dakotas to the New England states.

"Hot and humid" was the forecast for most of the heat-stricken states. The mercury headed for daytime marks of between 80 and 100, the same as recorded yesterday over the entire area. But most of the midwest has had a daily dose of 90 to 100 degrees temperatures every day this week.

Yesterday's hottest weather extended along the Ohio river valley through Indiana, Ohio, Kentucky and northeastward into the northeastern section of the country. Generally, federal weather bureau forecasters said, the mercury was around the 100 degree mark.

Except for Florida, only traces of precipitation were reported throughout the country.

The continued hot weather prompted early quitting of work at factories in some cities.

The U. S. weather bureau said there were several official marks of 100 and above yesterday. The bureau in New York said the official high was 100.8, second highest in history. But at La Guardia airport the thermometer went even higher—in 102.8.

Baltimore's 101 was the hottest day in eight years and a record for the date. Philadelphia wilted under a blistering 101.2 while the weather bureau reported 100 above in readings in Louisville, Columbus, Portland, Me., and Huntington, W. Va. Marks of 89 were registered in Harrisburg, Pa., Hartford, Conn., and Rochester, N. Y.

Seattle's 72 was the lowest daytime temperature. In the California desert, Fresno reported 101, but Los Angeles had a comfortable 78. It was 90 in Salt Lake City.

**Man Is Jailed on Locomotive Theft**

### 33,000 Men in Idaho Set for Draft Sign-up

BOISE, Aug. 27 (AP)—Idaho young men between the ages of 18 and 25 will register Monday for the nation's first peacetime draft. Draft officials estimate 33,000 will have to register.

Id. Westernman Whitlock, deputy Idaho selective service director, said men must have passed their 20th birthday to be exempt from registration.

Bring Service Proof

Veterans are asked to bring evidence of prior service to facilitate draft registration. He said that although veterans are exempt they must register.

Whitlock said men born after Aug. 30, 1922, will register Monday.

He said local registrars will handle registration in counties where draft boards have not been set up. Registration plans have been completed for all Idaho counties, he added.

Register After Birthday

Men becoming 18 years of age will register within five days of their 18th birthday, Whitlock said.

Draft age men will register in this order:

- Sept. 1-Sept. 1—Men born in 1923.
- Sept. 2-3—Men born in 1924.
- Sept. 4-7—Men born in 1925.
- Sept. 8-10—Men born in 1926.
- Sept. 10-11—Men born in 1927.
- Sept. 13-14—Men born in 1928.
- Sept. 15-16—Men born in 1929.
- Sept. 17-18—Men born in 1930 prior to Sept. 19, 1930.

It was a few minutes after the two escaped before their disappearance was noted, Falls said. They left the gang at 9 p. m.

Falls said both men are serving sentences for grand larceny. Spence is serving a maximum term of 14 years and Sheldon was sentenced to one to 14 years. Sheldon was violating his parole, Falls said.

Falls is in charge of the prison in the absence of Warden L. E. Clapp, who is attending a convention in Boston.

Both men were wearing prison clothing at the time of the escape, Falls said.
