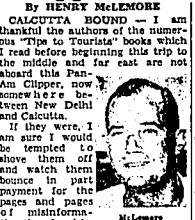

Dewey Drive Given Aid by Most Papers

NEW YORK, Sept. 10 (AP)—Thomas E. Dewey may have more newspaper support this year than any other presidential candidate in five recorded campaigns, a preliminary survey in Editor and Publisher indicated today.

Answers in this week's issues of the magazine from 100 percent of the nation's dailies showed 62 percent of them behind Dewey, and 16 percent for President Truman.

A Per Cent for Thurmond Less than four per cent favored Dixie's Rights Democrat, E. Strom Thurmond. Henry Wallace had only two newspapers. Eleven per cent of those answering were not committed.

This compared with 60 per cent who backed Dewey against President Roosevelt in the magazine's final 1944 survey and 66 per cent who supported Wendell Willkie against Roosevelt in 1940.

The Republican candidates were backed by 56 per cent in 1932 and 69 per cent in 1928.

In their total daily circulation of 16,000,000, the 498 newspapers backing Dewey represented a slightly higher percentage. Truman was down to 14 per cent in terms of the 3,000 circulation of the 117 papers behind him.

Papers which did not answer included those of the Scripps-Howard and Hearst groups.

Dewey's main strength came from newspapers in California, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania and Michigan. He had only 13 replies from newspapers in six states of the solid south, none in Arkansas, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, South Carolina or Utah.

The solid south, plus West Virginia, Oklahoma and Missouri, accounted for two-thirds of the newspapers but less than half the circulation in the Truman column.

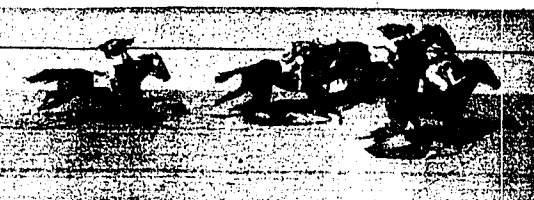
Sightseer
