### \$1,000,000 Blaze Levels Big Elevator

Explosion Snowers Debris and Grain Over Large Areas

JEROME, Sept. 17 (AP)—Approximately 74,000 bushels of wheat, 85,000 bags of beans and an undetermined amount of mixed grain were destroyed in a raging fire that swept the Farmer's elevator here Thursday night. The damage has been estimated between \$1,000,000 and \$1,500,000 by elevator representatives, according to Richard Evans, Jerome fire chief, who termed the blaze the worst in the history of Jerome and possibly the largest financial loss by fire in the state.

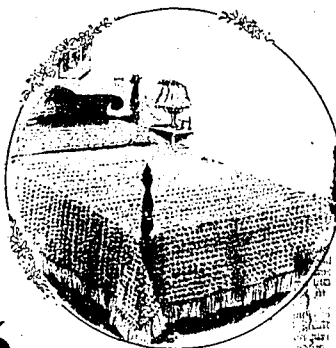

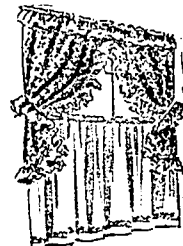

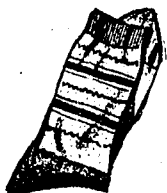

### Ethiopia Asks Apologies for Imru Affront

WASHINGTON, Sept. 17 (AP)—The Ethiopian legation demanded yesterday punishment of persons responsible for execution of Ras Imru, Ethiopian minister, from his seat with the Ethiopian corps at a science meeting here.

The legation, in a note to the state department, said:

"The Ethiopian government considers the offense to its accredited representative as grave and proclaims its grave and serious implications, especially so because the offense occurred in a public place and in the presence of the President of the United States.

Request Punishment

"The Imperial Ethiopian legation, therefore, demands that the United States government will take appropriate measures to repair the damage and to punish the offender in the manner that the dignity and inviolability of an envoy representing a sovereign government requires."

The note said the minister was invited by the American Association for the Advancement of Science to attend the opening session of its convention in constitution hall here Sept. 13.

Invitation Accepted

He accepted, and took a seat in a box assigned to the diplomatic corps. Then, the legation's note continued, "an individual unknown to the minister approached and told his excellency to leave his seat and find another place somewhere in the hall. The minister left the meeting 'in protest against such an insult.'"

There was no immediate comment from the state department upon the note.

Hargrave Submits His Resignation From U. S. Board

WASHINGTON, Sept. 17 (AP)—President Truman has accepted the resignation of Thomas J. Hargrave as chairman of the munitions board.

Hargrave held the post on leave of absence as president of the Eastman Kodak company. He said in submitting his resignation that he had planned to return to Eastman last June 20.

Mr. Truman named Donald P. Carpenter, Southerly, Conn., an ally of the defense secretary, as Hargrave's successor as chairman of the board.

Carpenter has been Forestal's deputy on atomic energy matters and chairman of the military liaison committee to the atomic energy commission since last February when he was named. He was vice president of the Remington Arms company.

As Carpenter's successor in the military committee, Mr. Truman named William Webster, Boston, who is vice president of the New England electric system. He is also a consultant to the atomic energy commission.

Police watched along the highways east of here today for a young blind man hitchhiking to New York for an operation that may restore his sight.

The police wanted to tell Clarence Peddicord, 20, that Joseph Slegal, a Philadelphia businessman, had offered to pay his way by train.

Peddicord left his wife and two small daughters at their home in Portland, Ore., a week ago and set out to hitchhike to New York for the operation.

He had to travel that way because he was broke. He carried \$1, his wife came, a battered suitcase, a week's supply of food in a paper bag, and snapshots of his wife and the kids.

His journey came to public notice when a Chicago motorist picked him up in Iowa, brought him to Chicago, and set him up in a hotel room. By that time Peddicord was down to 92 cents and had eaten most of his food.

But he still was determined to reach New York. Last night he got a lift to the city limits where he resumed his system of waving his arms to flag cars when he heard them approaching.

Just a short time later, Slegal made his offer to pay Peddicord's expenses by train.

Slegal, owner of a heavy business, said he was "sorry" his offer was too late but that he still wanted to help Peddicord if possible.

"Maybe someone will find him on the road and they can get in touch with me," Slegal said.

### Fall Lettuce Crop Forecast Is Good

BOISE, Sept. 17 (AP)—Idaho's fall lettuce crop has made good growth and yields are expected to be good.

The U. S. department of agriculture said first shipments in volume are expected around Sept. 25 or 27.

Production of Idaho sweet corn for processing was estimated at 45,900 tons compared with 28,100 tons in 1947 and the 10-year average of 12,200 tons.

Increased production was due both to a greater acreage planted and to a higher yield. The harvest was 12,000 acres this year compared with 9,500 last year and the yield of 3.8 tons this year compared with 3.0 tons last year.

ation is the only method by which this mess can be cleared up.

"The city administration is not only in accord with these sentiments, but has already started gathering the information upon which to base the formal request for a grand jury investigation. We are confident there is ample evidence to warrant such an inquiry. We expect to present our request for a grand jury within the next several days."

"The people of Twin Falls are familiar with all the developments which have been giving our city a bad name," the mayor continued, "and the recent arrest of one of our police officials came as a climax which cannot be ignored."

"Unless this latest incident is cleared up, together with all the other developments preceding it, the city officials are placed under a certain stigma which cannot go unchallenged."

"Either we must be cleared of suspicion, or any suit that might exist should be established definitely and beyond all doubt. The investigation, he contended, should be all-inclusive. The sheriff's department and the county prosecutor's office should be gone into thoroughly, as well as the city police department and all other municipal officials having any connection with all of these developments."

"The vicious rumors which are being circulated, if nothing else, are being done for a purpose for which those responsible should be held to stand up under the same rigorous scrutiny."

"If, on the other hand, there has been some ulterior purpose for mixing it up, it appears that our city is rotten, those responsible should be forced to stand up under the same rigorous scrutiny."

"We ask the people of Twin Falls to keep faith in us and to support us in our request for a grand jury investigation. We must have a show-down. The reputation of our city is too much at stake for this thing to go any longer."

I. E. (Bill) Nilschert, commissioner of law enforcement, said he would welcome the assistance of anyone having information which might shed light on any of the several issues involved.

"That goes for our own departments as well as for any others which would come under investigation," he said. "We ask for nothing but facts."

Councilmen would not comment upon the nature of the facts in their possession, or upon when they might make a formal request to call a grand jury.

However, Police Chief Howard W. Gillette said, "There's far more to the case than meets the eye," as part of his first comment regarding the arrest of Orville Reinhold, former traffic sergeant of the police department, Monday morning on charges of extorting \$1,000 from O. A. Rambo, proprietor of Bo's cafe.

Date of the preliminary hearing requested by Reinhold has not been set. He was arraigned Tuesday morning. Since that time, a number of prominent citizens have expressed their opinions a grand jury is needed. A few said they felt it not necessary.

Wednesday, the Kiwanis club referred the question to its civic affairs committee for a report to be made at its next meeting on the advisability of a grand jury inquiry.

**For Parolees**

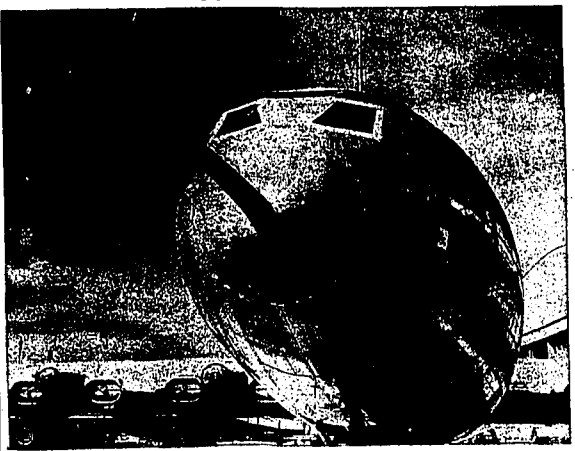
Clapp said that prison inmates nearly ready to be returned to society are placed in the camp for a transition period from the close confinement of prison routine.

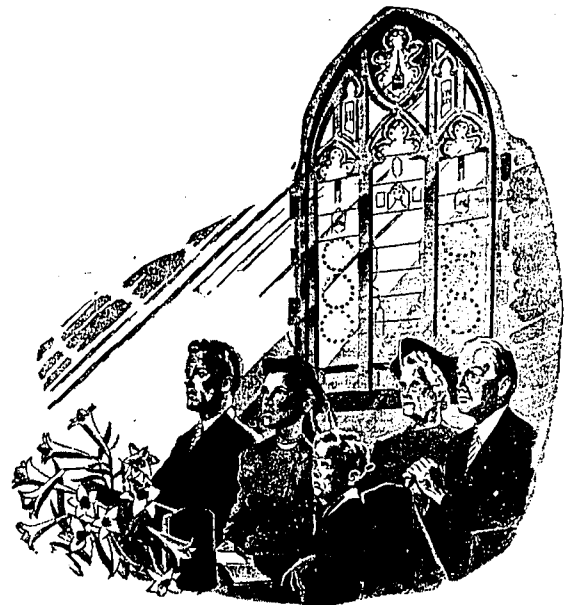
