Whirlwind Tour Before Speaking at the Capitol, the President made a whirlwind, open-air swing through the nation's capital district and out to the army's Fitzsimons general hospital where he promised his administration was "for the welfare of the entire country to the utmost extent."

After Lunching with 1,200 persons under the sponsorship of the Truman-Barkeley club of Colorado, Mr. Truman was scheduled to leave again on his westward journey with several more speeches tonight at towns along the way.

After the President lashed Sen. Robert A. Taft, R., O., for helping "kill the housing bill" behind his own name, Mr. Truman interjected "I think what a whip they must have cracked over Taft."

U. S. Enters Case Against Ticket Firms

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20 (AP)—The government has ordered 23 manufacturers to end an alleged conspiracy to fix prices and eliminate competition in the production and sale of tickets used by railroads, theaters, athletic arenas, and similar enterprises.

The order was issued by the federal trade commission which said the defendants "admitted" the charges, with some qualifications, and waived formal hearings.

The commission had accused the manufacturers of using the grade associations as "clearing houses" for agreements to charge "identical and uniform prices" in violation of federal law.

The FTC asserted the firms involved used such devices as a "code of symbols" and periodically issued documents purporting to be "guides of fair value" to tip off supporters of the firms on the agreed uniform price.

The manufacturers named in the order included H. K. Mulford, Inc., San Francisco; Dillingham Printing Company, Inc., Los Angeles; and Frank McCaffery's Acme Press, Seattle.

From now on, youths will report to their local draft boards as they reach the age of 19. The 20,000 special registration centers across the country will close.

Selective service headquarters here had no idea how many young men are on its books, and officials said they will not know until next week.

No Delinquent Reports National headquarters said it has had no reports of delinquencies, but added that heavy penalties are provided for failure to register.

Meanwhile, prospective draftees had a handy list to study. Announced yesterday by President Truman, it sets out the infirmities that may keep a young man out of uniform.
