

Report of Group Warns of Grade School Crisis Here In 1953; Action Is Urged

Children of World War II veterans may have no school to enter in 1953 or may have to go to school in half-day shifts, the statistical committee of the citizens committee for Twin Falls schools reported Monday night at an executive board meeting in the Twin Falls high school.

The report, presented by the Rev. A. Stanley Christensen, was prepared by Herbert R. West, chairman, Mrs. Ariell Kelly and the Rev. Mr. Christensen.

However, the most serious pinch in school facilities is felt in the city's three elementary schools. A marked increase in enrollment has been felt since the beginning of World War.

Grade Enrollment
The Rev. Mr. Christensen said that grade enrollment has jumped from 1940 to 1947 a total of 1,000. During the same period enrollment in elementary grades has increased from 1,200 to 2,000.

In studying the town's birthrate during the last 10 years, it was pointed out that births have increased from 17 to 28 per cent.

Related to Birthrate
Enrollment in the first grade of the local schools in 1947 is stated to be the birthrate six years previously. This indicates that when the present birth rate is taken into account, a serious shortage will occur.

Report Traces Growth
The report traces the growth in the local schools in the junior high school and the senior high school from the middle 1920s to the present. It points out that enrollment in the junior and senior high schools has been higher than in the past.

Allies Faced With Settling On War Issue

By J. M. ROBERTS, Jr.
 AP Foreign Affairs Analyst

The situation in Berlin contains the strong possibility that the western allies will soon face a decision as to whether they want to risk war with Russia, now or later.

The allied representatives here who seek to end the Berlin blockade by negotiation naturally are not going to admit defeat. But I cannot find one glimmer of hope that the negotiations will bring an end to the east-west war for control of Germany. Any relaxation of the blockade would merely mean a slight tactical change on the overall picture.

Russ Want Control

The Russians are out for control of all Germany. The communists want to be back at our throats with some other tactic or on some other front. They are conducting a fanatical campaign. As long as their policies remain unchanged and their dynamism unchecked, the conflict will go on.

The blockade is not lifted, continued operation of the air lift may soon involve more serious matters than the mere matter of keeping it effective during the winter.

Bus Landing Strips

As you fly between Frankfurt and Berlin, all along the edges of the corridor you see Russian landing strips. Some of the strips are visible, sometimes not. Sometimes they are built on the air just outside the corridor to remain as long as the "vital" run is not an entirely peaceful operation.

The British and French, according to a highly authoritative non-American source, consider continued operation of the air lift as a definite threat to peace. This analyst recently made three points in reporting the situation to his government:

- 1.—The danger of war can be avoided only by a four-power approach which has been under way — to the Berlin problem, with lifting of the blockade as the principal objective.
- 2.—If the western powers continue indefinitely to operate the air lift, incidents are bound to develop which could cause war.
- 3.—An attempt to break the blockade with armed ground convoys would cause immediate war.

Hopes Dimmed

Since this report was made, developments have dimmed most hopes on the first point. On the second point, we can only wait and see what Russia is willing to take. The American belief here is that, if we ourselves are prepared to take the risk of war, peace can be preserved, lift or no lift.

On the third point, there is no longer much discussion. Some Americans feel that, given sufficient notice in which to withdraw to a face-saving position, the Russians would not open fire on convoys. But all the emphasis now is on getting the job done through the air lift.

If the Russians try to interfere with that, if we come to the point where we either have to put up fighters to protect the cargo planes or get out of Berlin, the American will have come to what might very well prove the final cast of the die.

August Report Is Given on Cannery

She reported 4,577 cans of vegetables, 373 cans of fruit and cans of meats were processed. During the month 6,815 cans were processed. Highest weekly total was 1,200 cans.

According to the report, volume is exceeding last year's total. The cannery has been operating on two or three-day basis a week. The cannery will be open Tuesday and Wednesday this week.

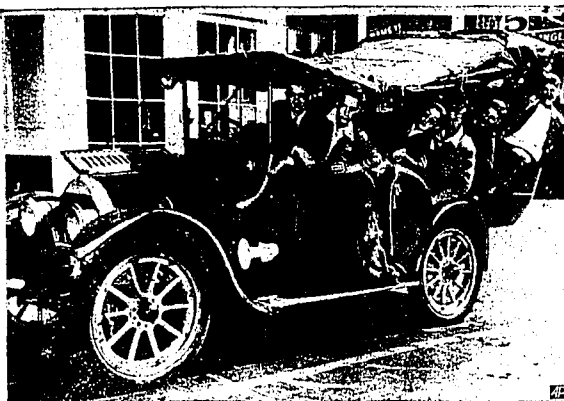

U. S. Income Soars to New Record Mark

WASHINGTON, Sept. 21 (AP)—National income rose to an annual rate of \$221,400,000,000 in the second quarter of 1948, the Commerce department reported today. This is an all-time high.

Corporate profits increased more than any other type of income, even without counting "paper profits" on inventories, the department added. \$18,900,000,000 Above 1947.

The April-May-June rate of total national income was \$5,300,000,000 above that for the first quarter. It was \$18,900,000,000 above the figure for the full year 1947.

"Business developments in August . . . showed little indication of any lull in the high rate of economic activity," the department's office of business economics commented. "Industrial prices continued to advance . . . as the influence of third round wage advances spread . . . and continuing high incomes maintained the demand pressures."

Farm Prices Down

In contrast to generally rising industrial prices, agricultural prices moved downward under the influence of the prospective record high level of agricultural crop production.

The department said all other types of income shared in lesser degree the increases achieved in corporate profits.

New Plow Is Seen as Boon To Wasteland

WASHINGTON, Sept. 21 (AP)—Forest service experts say a new contraption promises to bring new life to vast areas of western rangeland.

It is known as the "brushland plow"—designed to eradicate "sagebrush which chokes out grass. It has been tested for only one year, but officials say it will do the job.

The plow is a disk model—combining features of American and Australian machines.

Disk in Falls
To enable it to withstand rough range usage, the disk is arranged in pairs which work on knee action assemblies similar to those used for automobile wheels.

The plow has demonstrated that it can remove 75 per cent of the sagebrush growth.

Flowing, however, is but the first stage in a program to grow better forage. The forest service has spent a lot of time and effort finding and developing the best kind of grasses. The original range research stations engaged in this work were at Odessa, Utah, and Missoula, Mont. Others recently have been established at Portland, Ore.


