### NBC Adopts New Rule on Quiz Airings

BUN VALLEY, Sept. 22 (AP)—The National Broadcasting company today had announced a new program code imposing a form of economic sanctions on give-away programs. The code will apply to television as well as radio.

NBC's new code contains all essentials of the standards of practice code imposed by the National Association of Broadcasters plus a number of additional provisions, said NBC officials here for the network's annual convention. It becomes effective next Jan. 1.

Don't Stop "Give-Aways"  
The code doesn't prohibit giveaways as such, but counts each moment of a product name in prizes lists as part of the sponsor's time allowance for commercials on the air. Most of the prizes are put up by the sponsor but by other manufacturers as well. In return, free prizes on the air for their products.

Under the new NBC code, the sponsor will have to pay the full cost of the prizes, or share his advertising time with the manufacturer who donates prizes.

Commercial Trimmings  
The code eliminates the practice of breaking into a new program with a "middle commercial" and allows less time for commercials on news broadcasts than on other types of programs.

The code continues NBC's policy adopted last year of putting a "time-out" on crime and mystery type shows. No such shows may be broadcast earlier than 9:30 p. m. eastern time. In return, free prizes on the air for their products.

### Potato, Onion Men Ask End Of Car Curbs

WASHINGTON, Sept. 22 (AP)—The Idaho Potato and Onion Shippers' association has asked the government to end its supervision of refrigerator car distribution.

The association, headquartered at Idaho Falls, said federal management was acceptable to shippers during the war. It contends that emergency period has long since passed.

Under New Jersey rules it was declared a 12th round knockout. For 11 rounds Zale, who rewon the 160-pound crown only last June in Newark, N. J., from Rocky Graziano, had taken cruel, numbing punishment from the tireless Cerdan. He had won only two rounds and had been beaten mercifully. Just as the bell sounded to end the 11th round, Zale sank to his knees, his eyes unseeing as Cerdan rushed to his corner. Tony's seconds virtually carried him to his stool, and it was apparent it would require a miracle to send him out for the next round.

Zale, who entered the ring a 8-8 favorite and widely expected to win by a knockout, carried only the third and fourth rounds on the Associated Press score sheet. Referee Cavaleri gave him those rounds and called the ninth round event. There was no question about the other eight. Zale, who had been expected to outlast Frenchman in two at the middle with his deadly right to the body, seldom could find a target. ### Sheep Men See Little Hope for Future Growth

NEW YORK, Sept. 22 (AP)—There is little hope for expansion of the U. S. sheep industry in the near future, J. M. Jones, secretary of the National Wool Growers association, said yesterday.

Jones told delegates to the American meat institute convention the country's sheep population has declined 40 per cent since 1942.

The cause, Jones said, is that these reasons for continued liquidation of the industry at present: (1) the high cost of wool, which is not qualified or dependable; cost of operation is high in relation to prices of sheep, lambs and wool; reduction in grazing allotments on national forests; low return from sheep operations; fear of a drop in wool and lamb prices; and drought, particularly in Texas and parts of Wyoming and California.

Jones said facilities for increasing sheep production are overcome. He said all phases of the industry have started education program through the lamb industry committee in an effort to work out the problems holding down production.

Therein lies its greatest value in case of future trouble. For it fills a far-flung network of inter-locking bases that could be converted quickly into offensive and defensive bastions.

This system of bases forms a ring around the northern hemisphere. Inside that ring lie nearly all the major countries of the world—including Russia.

### More People In U. S. Own Their Homes

WASHINGTON, Sept. 22—Despite the clamor over housing, more American families own their homes now than ever in history, a federal reserve board survey showed yesterday.

About 40 per cent of the nation's non-farm families owned their homes at the beginning of this year. That meant 18,500,000 city and town families all together.

The survey did not take up farm families. The proportion of home owners among such families traditionally has been much higher than among city-dwellers.

**Data Lacking**  
The number of "home owners," of course, included those still paying on their homes. There was no data on how many have debt-free homes.

The survey showed about 45 per cent of non-farm families—a total approximating 17,000,000—were renting their living quarters as 1948 began. The remainder—about 2,000,000—were living free with somebody else.

Noting the record proportion of home owners, the reserve board observed that many had become home owners rather unwillingly.

**Purchases Forced**  
"The acute shortage of rental units has no doubt forced many families to buy homes, often at inflated prices and somewhat beyond their means, simply in order to obtain shelter," the report said.

The reserve board's report showed home ownership was greater in the higher income brackets than the lower ones, but even among families with incomes under \$3,000, two out of five owned their places.

The survey showed:

**Other Elements**  
The median rent paid by non-farm families at the beginning of this year was approximately \$30 a month.

More than one quarter of all renting families had increases in monthly rental payments during 1947.

On the average, families who paid rent spent about 12 per cent of their total income on it—less than half the 25 per cent traditionally assigned for rent in the standard home budget.

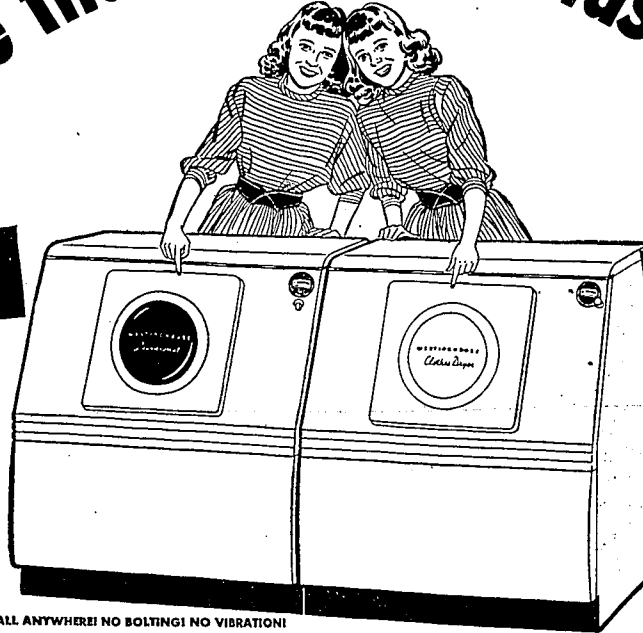
