Mountain Area Hit By Snow

SUN VALLEY, Sept. 27—Officials at this famed winter resort are happy. Skiers yesterday tested Mount Baldy slopes which were bare last year until after the opening of the winter ski season. Twelve inches of snow fell on the mountain Sunday.

Area Blanketed Residents of Nigle Valley could see the snow from an afternoon from as far away as Twin Falls. Snow also fell on Mount Harrison, near Austin, and in the Soldier mountain area above Patricide.

Two tractors and road equipment were sent to Galena to rescue tourists stranded in Stanley bush by the early snowfall.

A heavy truck, loaded with cattle, slid in the snow and was stuck on the highway blocking all traffic. Tractors were used to clear the truck and clear the road. Snowplow equipment was sent from Ketchum Monday morning to help clear the highway.

Sheepmen, however, were not worried by the early snow. They expect the early snow and it is expected the first snow will not hamper regular operations.

The ski lift on Mount Baldy was pressed into action Sunday afternoon as residents of Wood River, near Idaho Falls, began their first skiing of the season.

Heading resort officials said, "We expect an early start to the season. Last year officials even tried seeding clouds with dry ice in an attempt to get snow for the season opening."

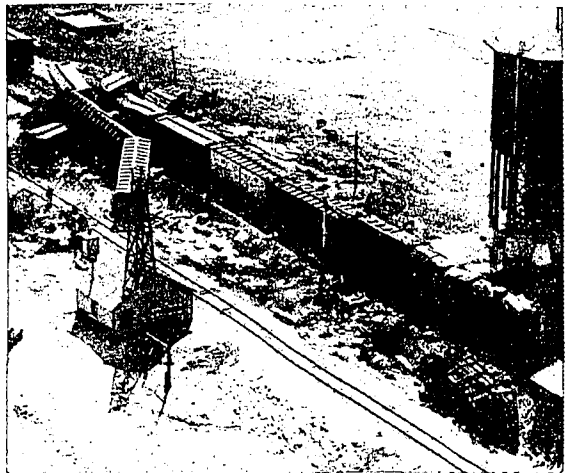

Dewey Gives Development Plan; Truman Renews Congress Blast

EN ROUTE WITH PRESIDENT TRUMAN, Sept. 27 (AP)—President Truman resumed his warfare with the Republicans in congress today, telling the people of Austin, Tex., that "this Republican congress is trying to tear up the bill of rights."

Mr. Truman stamped Texas with a new series of charges against the GOP. He started speaking at dawn in San Marcos after stops at Waco, Dallas and Fort Worth.

He will make a major farm speech tonight in Bonham, the home town of Rep. Sam Rayburn, D., Tex. "The Farm Co-op"

Mr. Truman said in Austin the "Republican no-nothing congress" has had time to do nothing but to tear up the bill of rights. He pointed to some of the farm standing in the Texas farm co-op.

He praised the long success of national leaders produced by Texas and pointed to some of the farm co-ops operating out of success.

Mr. Truman said he was warning his campaign of "telling the facts" because "between 80 per cent and 90 per cent of the press are against the Democratic administration because they (the press) are for the special interests."

"Not Talking Issues" The President also said the Republicans were not talking about issues in the campaign.

"They're talking about home and mother and about the beautiful country this is," he said. "I'm telling you the truth."

Friends of Rayburn promised to have the Bonham high school stadium packed with enthusiastic supporters when Mr. Truman speaks there shortly after his arrival at 8 p. m. (CST.)

Deviates From Role The President deviated tonight from his role of never making political speeches on Sunday. He made a non-political address to a group of Democrats at a banquet in San Antonio's Quinter hotel.

He warned that the "only way we can survive in the world today is to keep our bullets in order and our powder dry."

"That's more important to me than being President of the United States for the next four years."

It was the second time during the day that he had vowed a wish for peace in the world. He had pledged pennies into the wishing well of the ancient Spanish governor's palace near the Alamo and said his most heartfelt desire was for peace.

Secret Talks With Soviet Collapse; Dispute Hampered U.N.; Bevin Blames Russ

WASHINGTON, Sept. 27 (AP)—The complete collapse of secret talks in Berlin over the Berlin crisis advanced the cold war to a new and highly explosive stage today.

Authorities are frankly uncertain what may happen next. Both President Truman and Republican Presidential Nominee Thomas E. Dewey are being kept closely posted while the United States, Britain and France take their case against the Soviet blockade of the German capital into the public arena of the United Nations security council.

The failure of the secret diplomacy which the western powers have been practicing in the hope of settling the Berlin dispute, the Kremlin was revealed by the state department last night.

The department made public a 3,000-word note accusing Russia of bad faith in the Berlin negotiations and of creating "a threat to international peace."

Published at the same time was a hazy note setting out "24,000 words which top diplomats said prove the Soviets are bent upon making Moscow the center of the western powers out of the German capital."

The heavy volume of documents released by the state department as a "white paper" to show what really occurred in the negotiations over Berlin was made available to the press.

"Ready to Settle" American Ambassador Walter Bedell Smith and the envoys of Britain and France had two meetings with the Soviet premier and foreign minister, Molotov, the first of which took place on Aug. 2 in the Kremlin.

He said, according to the state department, that the Soviet occupation regime should be used throughout Berlin and that simultaneously with his acceptance of the west's "four-point restrictions"—the blockade—would be removed.

He also agreed that the west would not insist on having the western powers scrap their plans for a regional security pact until the Berlin situation was stabilized.

Stalin's readiness to trade an end to the blockade in return for acceptance of Soviet currency in the Berlin sector was the subject of the talks.

"Agreement in Principle" The second meeting with Stalin occurred on Aug. 22. It resulted in an agreement in principle between Russia and the western powers that (A) the blockade should be lifted and (B) the Berlin sector would accept Soviet currency in its sectors of Berlin but under four-point rather than single Soviet control.

Around those major points, the four governments sent instructions to their foreign ministers in Germany to make the agreement effective in detail.

It was at this point that the alleged bad faith occurred. Marshal Vasily Sokolov, according to the state department, informed the British and French envoys that the Russians had agreed to lift the blockade.

Recognize Water Law The state department today recognized the long established principle of western water law.

"Your next administration will see to it that the government responsibility is placed in charge of capable men and women who will act without bias or prejudice in the interest of the greatest good for the greatest number."

Wallace Crosses President's Trail DENVER, Sept. 27 (AP)—Gov. Wallace headed for Texas today with a challenge to President Truman to join him in defying the racial segregation customs of the south.

Wallace, who is a candidate for the Presidency, was scheduled to cross campaign trails with Mr. Truman at Dallas today.

Idaho Agriculture Maintaining Sound Position, Banker Spokesman Reports banks loaned \$81,601,000 to their farmer and ranch customers. At the beginning of 1948, the total agricultural loans outstanding in Idaho banks aggregated \$227,000,000, compared with approximately \$200,000,000 at the beginning of the previous year.

PARIS, Sept. 27 (AP)—Russia will be solely responsible if "the blind fury—the incredible rage"—engulfs the world. British Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin charged today as the western powers threw the Berlin crisis into the United Nations security council.

The Soviet Union, formally charged by the United States, Britain and France with threatening world peace, seemed likely to walk out of the security council again, or at least turn the dispute into a war of words which would threaten the very existence of the U.N.

In a hearing speech before the U.N. general assembly meeting here, Bevin intimated the charge laid against the Soviet Union yesterday.

What's more, Bevin's Andrei Vishinsky first appeared firmly, then stalked in silent anger from the assembly chamber in the white marble palace. He challenged the Seibe, Bevin charged that:

1. If atomic war comes, Russia, "by refusing its cooperation in the control and development of this great new force for the good of mankind, will bear all the responsibility for the evil which may be visited upon mankind."

2. Russia has waged a continuous "war of nerves" and "cold war" against the western powers in Germany, and particularly in Berlin. 3. Russia's proposal for one-third disarmament of all nations within a year was withdrawn, since the Soviet union would not reveal the size of its own force. He challenged:

Double Veto? PARIS, Sept. 27 (AP)—Russia may try to bar admission of the Berlin quartet to the security council by using the double veto. The double veto has been used three times in the security council—in the Spanish, Greek and Chinese cases.

Here is how it might work in the Berlin dispute: Russia could use the veto to block the admission of the Berlin quartet to the security council's agenda and then argue that her veto was not binding.

If the other council members challenge this, Russia would then use the veto to block their challenge. The veto does not apply to questions of procedure, but does apply to questions of substance among the big powers over whether a question is procedural.

Russia to disclose the strength of her army, which he estimated at "at least" 3,000,000 to 4,000,000 men. A Russian report also mentioned "old trick that has gone through history." He said that "those who are creating a cloud for what they plan to do themselves."

West Created The western powers are preparing, if necessary, to face the possible break-up of the United Nations as now constituted.

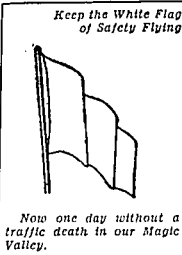

Experts Warn Of Danger in Deadly Weeds

Dangers of haloglossin, a weed poisonous to livestock, have been emphasized by Harry S. Gault, director of the Twin Falls county weed control bureau and V. McCormack, Boise, chairman of the Idaho production and marketing administration.

Gault said as far as he knows there is none of the deadly weed in this county, but he has seen it in Nevada within five miles of the state line. He described the Nevada grass as healthy. Gault said about 200,000 acres of haloglossin in Casita county, according to figures given by Glenn Bodilly, county agent there.

Danger Period
McCormack urged stockmen who will be trailing livestock over range, during the next few weeks to keep a sharp lookout for the weed. He warned that this is the time of the year when the weed is most dangerous to livestock because poisoning is caused from an exalted present in the weed. Some weeds, such as alfalfa, and seed pods. Gault asked that his office be notified immediately if any haloglossin is found in any county so that control measures can be taken. "We must hold back the spread of this weed and keep it out of the county," he declared.

Herbs Spray
The much used weed spray, 2,4-D, has little effect on haloglossin, the weed control director said. Volatile acids, amides and herbicides are the most effective measures to take against it. County agents and a conservation practice to help stockmen control and eradicate the weed.

The haloglossin plant resembles Eurasian thistle, although the leaves are not sharp-pointed and thorn-like. When the plant freezes in the winter, it is often mistaken for Russian thistle turns dark brown or black. Gault said the haloglossin plant is a hardy stockmen control and quiet when squeezed. The plant is in full bloom now.

Healthy Hays Fatal
Haloglossin appears to be equally poisonous to sheep and cattle, weed experts say, and is almost always found where there is a good stockmen experience losses when hungry stock graze on haloglossin in areas where there is a lack of other palatable forage.

Gault said the weed is more dangerous than sheep and cattle are eating habit. He pointed out sheep will eat nearly anything growing in an area, but feed from one place to another.

"Lone" Weed
Haloglossin usually grows where there is no competition from other plants for soil nutrients, such as in highway shoulders, old gravel pits, and on ranges where overgrazing has killed most of the vegetation.

The ACA control program includes seedling, eradication, or created waterways in affected areas. The greatest complex for haloglossin is in the Snake valley.

The weed was first identified in northern Nevada about 12 years ago. It has spread rapidly over desert ranges in that state, Idaho, Utah and Wyoming.

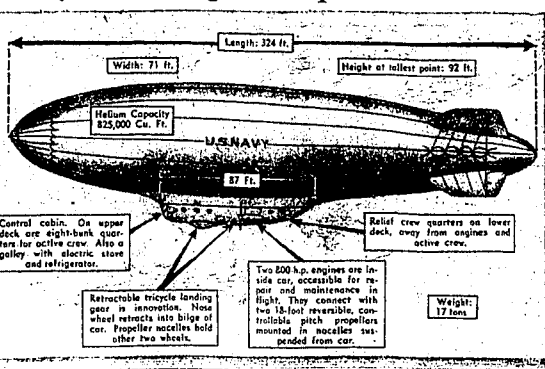

'Reefer' Habit Gaining, U. S. Agency Finds

By DOUGLAS LARSEN

WASHINGTON. The arrest of Actor Robert Mitchell in Hollywood on a marijuana drug charge brings to light an indication that "reefer-smoking" is increasing rapidly in the U. S.

Latest figures from the U. S. treasury department show the amount of marijuana confiscated by federal agents jumped 64 per cent last year over the previous year from 23,580 pounds to 38,894 ounces. The number of peddlers of the drug arrested by treasury men also increased from 882 to 987. And that doesn't include thousands of arrests by local and state narcotics men.

Mexico is one of the big sources. The illegal traffic is straining the resources of the U. S. to stop it. Well-organized gangs and hold-long operators are bringing more of it in. One of the biggest recent cases involved an American mining engineer, Victor C. Sanders. He was caught peddling "reefers" in Los Angeles.

Later a large supply which belonged to him was found hidden in a children's coop in Compton, Calif. Three big trucks held 210 carefully sealed cans, each containing 150 children's soap bars. He said he bought the stuff from a man named "Joe" in Juarez, Mexico. Sanders is in prison.

A large portion of the supply is grown right in the U. S. in back yards, on empty lots. It is easy to raise. And it is a very simple process to dry the leaves and roll them into cigarettes.

The plant looks like an ordinary garden weed, grows one to three feet high and has a seven-lobed, jagged leaf. Small buds or pods on the plant contain the high-marijuana.

"Mary" or "reefer," "muggies" "bun" or "stuffer" are names given to the drug. It makes the user sensitive to different sounds and pitches. The U. S. public health service has proved by tests that it does not improve a musician's ability.

When under the influence of a reefer the smoker believes that there is nothing he isn't capable of doing or saying. In some instances it makes the user run amok.

Generally it renders a person incapable of intelligent action, as does alcohol. It wears off in from two to four hours leaving a slight hang-over and feeling of depression.

Still, it doesn't appear to affect physical health but in India and Egypt where there is widespread use of stronger doses, it makes users feeble-minded or insane.

High Price of Eggs Causing Poultry Care

Recent high prices for eggs and poultry have focused attention on the necessity of giving proper care to poultry. County Agent C. W. DeLoe Monday. He said keeping healthy laying pullets in the fall is one way of insuring profits. Correct management of poultry is necessary to get birds through the winter safely and to keep them healthy. Though poultry raisers are cautioned to listen to several suggestions received from C. E. Lammiman, head of the University of Idaho poultry husbandry department.

Laying pullets coming into high egg production need a 13-hour working day—turn on the electric lights now to increase the working day. Ruying the birds with water, floor feeders, automatic green feed if available and some scratch grain in the litter will help to get laying house conditions similar to what the pullets had in the open.

Changing pullets from developing mash to laying mash should be done gradually over a period of two or three weeks. Pullets should have enough water to keep them and the birds or the equivalent space in community nests. Laying pullets need plenty of calcium—keep egg shell or limestone grit available, as well as an insoluble granite grit.

Laying tools should be repaired while the weather is still favorable, and before cold weather sets in plastic-covered soil heating cable should be installed to keep water from freezing. With mice seeking winter quarters, a control program should be started to keep them from getting into the laying pens and feed room.

Great Shock

"This country has had a great shock in the last few days because for the first time it was realized there is a possibility of war."

At least some veterans of the 1939-45 fighting, reminded by Defense Minister A. V. Alexander that they were still subject to instant recall to service, said they were getting their uniforms cleaned and pressed.
