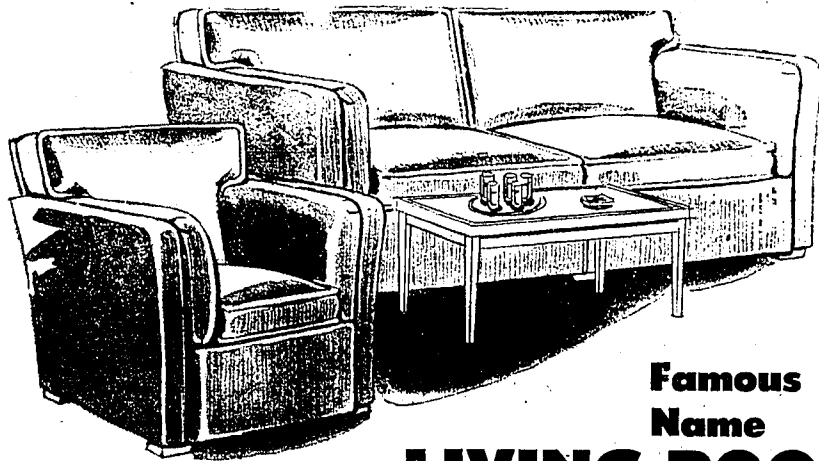

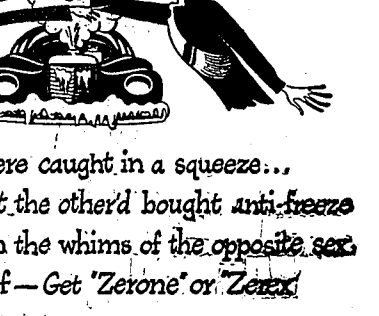

Solon Blames FDR Aide for Red Troubles

REXBURG, Oct. 14 (AP)—U. S. Sen. Arthur V. Watkins, R., Utah, last night blamed former presidential adviser Harry L. Hopkins "old the late Franklin D. Roosevelt" for the "Red" troubles that the "Russians" are a "space-loving people."

Watkins said Hopkins first was "Aide" similarly by Russian Premier Joseph Stalin, then in turn "Aide" Roosevelt.

The result, the Utah senator told a Republican political rally, was that "so many Russian sympathizers were holding responsible positions in our government that President Truman had to ask congress for \$25,000,000 to clean them out."

Watkins said "Clean-up"

He told his listeners if a Republican administration is elected "we will have clean government and won't need \$25,000,000 to clean it up."

Watkins reviewed what he called the "mistakes and failures" of the Democratic administration. He compared them with the unity he said existed in state governments headed by Gov. Thomas E. Dewey of New York, the Republican presidential nominee, and his running mate, Gov. Earl Warren of California.

Backs Dworshak, Seem

The Utah urged re-election of Sen. Henry C. Dworshak, R., Ida., and the state's two congressmen, both Republicans, John C. Sorenson, Hagerman, and Abe Gott, Moscow.

Dworshak, he said, has served not only Idaho but Utah and other western states.

He said that re-election of all three would insure the continuation of several major reclamation projects now under way in Idaho.

Canada Foresees Trouble Selling Heavy Spud Crop

OTTAWA, Oct. 14 (AP)—Tomorrow sources disclosed last night that Canada may have trouble disposing of an expected bumper crop of about 80,000,000 bushels of potatoes this year.

The crop is tentatively valued at between \$90,000,000 and \$95,000,000. However, a government spokesman said it was not true that Canada was trying to flood the American market with the dominion's production.

"The Ottawa spokesman said that Canada also imports potatoes from the U. S.

"We probably import just as much during the three months, June, July and August as we export during the whole of the year," the spokesman said.

Nevada Tourists Turn 'Time Dizzy'

RENO, Oct. 14 (AP)—Travelers in Nevada have a awful time these days, trying to find out what time it is.

Because many areas of the state do not approve of continuing daylight saving time during fall and winter months, motorists travelling from Salt Lake City to Reno via highway 50 have to make the following changes in their watches.

At Ely, on the state's eastern border, they set their watches back one hour for Pacific standard time; about 100 miles west, they return to Pacific daylight time from Austin to Burkha. At Fallon, they go back an hour to standard time again, starting next Sunday. And finally, in Reno, the time reverts to daylight time.

Much of the same situation exists on highway 40, where Winnemucca and Humboldt county operate on standard time.

Navy to Conduct Tests in Alaska

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14 (AP)—The navy said Wednesday that exercises to be held next February in Alaskan waters are minor in size and aimed at testing clothing, equipment and personnel under cold weather conditions.

No more than 12 fighting ships and less than 12,000 men, including under 2,000 marines, will take part, an official said.

In response to questions, he said there is no significance to the fact that exercises will be held closer to Russian territory than any previous fleet exercises.

In the Pacific the navy has only the Alaskan area to practice cold weather operations and experiments, he said.

The exact location of the exercises was not given, but he said it would be close to American bases in Alaska.

32 States Put Governorship Up for Ballot

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14 (AP)—An even 32 candidates are running for the 32 governorships at stake in the Nov. 3 elections.

"At least four of the contests are attracting more than statewide interest."

Ohio, Indiana, Illinois and Michigan all now have Republican governors but the Democrats say they have a good chance in the first three and mark Michigan as a "possible" Republican say they will hold all four, but concede some are close races.

Creatly Divided

Republicans and Democrats now divide the nation's governorships 26 and 24. In all 32 states are choosing governors this year, but Maine already has held its state election. Frederick C. Payne, a Republican, won on Sept. 13.

The 33 offices to be filled are now held by 11 Republicans and 14 Democrats. Five Republicans and 10 Democratic governors hold over this year.

Two in Rockies Area

Former Gov. Arthur B. Langlie, R., is opposing Democratic Gov. Mon C. Wallgren in Washington.

Wallgren is a close friend of President Truman.

In Utah, J. Bracken Lee, former Republican mayor of Provo, is making a second attempt to unseat Democratic Gov. Herbert B. Maw, seeking a third term.

Idaho does not elect a governor this year.

Builders Told Nation Needs \$6,000 House

SEATTLE, Oct. 14 (AP)—What the country needs is a good \$6,000 house, the National Association of Housing Officials was told.

Raymond M. Foley, federal housing and home finance administrator, told 800 delegates to the association's 19th annual convention that the market for new houses at present high prices is reaching its limit.

He said the housing industry must produce lower cost housing or face a sudden falling off in home construction.

Housing Act 'Not Enough'
The housing act of 1948 adopted at the special session congress is "only a half-loaf," Foley said.

He explained that "we still lack adequate tools to cope with the critical problems of the slums and of the families whose incomes are too low to pay an economic rent for housing."

New legislation cannot cut today's \$10,000 house to \$6,000, Foley said. But that can be "constant progress toward an adequate house at \$8,000 or less if industry, labor and government really go to work on a program of lower cost housing."

Doesn't Aid Slum-Clearance
Even the \$6,000 house would not meet the slum clearance problem, he said. Slums can be cleared out only through federal assistance and financial aid as provided for in the Taft-Hillender-Wagner bill.

The association received a memorandum from President Truman criticizing housing legislation adopted by the recent special session of congress. The President pledged continued support "with every resource at my command" the enactment of comprehensive legislation for slum clearance and for "decent housing for low-income families."

ACEQUIA, Oct. 24—Mr. and Mrs. J. B. Burd have sold their 40-acre farm here to Kenneth Burk and have purchased an 80-acre farm north of Coalinga. The Burd farm was one of the few farms in this area still remaining in the family of original owners, having been homesteaded by Mrs. Burd's father, J. P. Anderson, in January, 1904.

Portal Statute Receives Test Of High Court

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14 (AP)—The Supreme Court today received its first case testing constitutionality of the portal-to-portal act. The act was passed by 74 members of General Motors corporation. They said the right to property is being taken away by overtime pay for such activities as changing into work clothes and obtaining tools needed in their jobs.

Get Teamsters Pardon
The court at the same time received an AFL teamsters union petition asking that it declare unconstitutional a Tennessee ban on union closed shops. In closed shops only union workers can be employed.

The supreme court previously has agreed to rule on validity of similar closed shop bans adopted in Arizona, Nebraska and North Carolina.

Defendants Ask Delay
Mascard and Sons company, the Tennessee defendants in the AFL test case, asked the justices to defer action on the new appeal until it decides the first three cases. The company counsel said a total of 15 similar cases are pending. The court will announce later what its procedure will be.

The Nims bill-to-portal act was passed by congress last year to knock out suits for about \$6,000,000 filed against employers by labor unions in 1946.

GLENN'S PERRY, Oct. 14 (AP)—A "wild" squirrel was chased through Glenn's Perry streets by young boys armed with B. B. guns and knives Wednesday after the rodent bit Mrs. Pauline Nims twice.

Mrs. Nims struck the rodent with the water hose and ran into the house—with the squirrel in hot pursuit. The squirrel gnawed at the wooden screen in an effort to reach her again.

Mrs. Nims' young son, David, ordered the squirrel screaming from the hand wound and took after the squirrel with his B. B. gun. Other youngsters took after the animal with knives and guns.

Order was finally restored when the pet squirrel was returned to its owner.

Most Parents Select Toys to Please Selves, Toyman Says

NEW YORK, Oct. 14 (AP)—A toy-maker said today that only "very few" parents will select the proper playthings for their children, this Christmas.

Most of them, he said, will buy toys that please themselves rather than the children.

Frank Caplan, who owns a company which makes "creative playthings," warned that "gadgets" toys may be harmful and frustrating, and children get tired of them.

"The best toy a parent can buy," he said, "is a set of plain unadorned wooden unit blocks. Children will use and enjoy them from age 18 months to 9 years."

Caplan said that girls between age 3 and 7 should have a "doll corner." He said the corner should be supplied first with a large wooden store, bed and cupboard.

"The doll corner will become the most treasured play place in a little girl's life," he said.

Boys, from ages 2 to 7, Caplan said, mostly enjoy "transportation play"—trucks, cars and boats.

Caplan said parents should not deprive children of the smaller creative toys in order to give them an expensive bicycle.

"Bicycles limit a child to physical play only," he said. Caplan said this was his idea of preferred playthings.

Eighteen months (push and pull toys)

Three to 4 years—Boys: Transportation toys. Girls: Housekeeping material for a doll corner.

Five to 8 years (game age)—Boys: Construction toys (simple), games, paints, modeling clay. Girls: Design, games, paints, modeling clay.

Six to 9 years (craft age)—Boys: Simple woodwork and metal work. Girls: Doll patterns and simple sewing.

Eight to 12 years—Boys: Models, electronic sets, toy motors. Girls: Marionettes, sewing, musical instruments, knitting.

Thirteen to 16 years—Boys: Sporting goods, records, advanced crafts. Girls: Same.

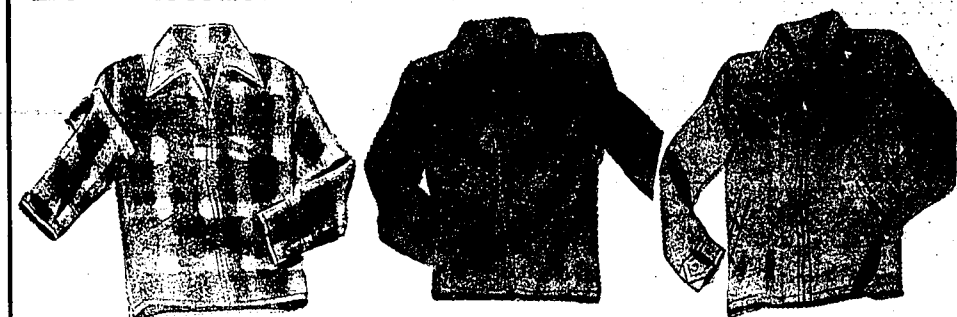

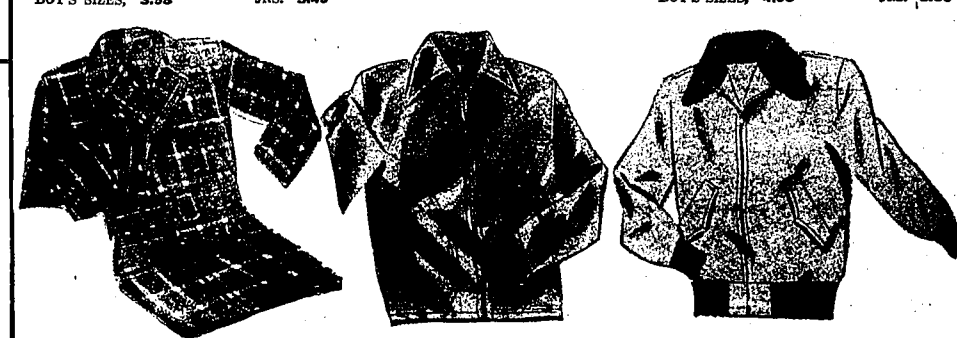

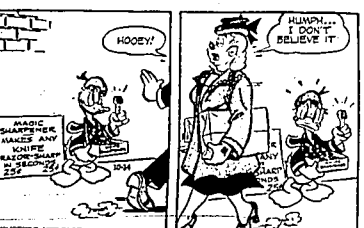

West German Area Gaining To Recovery

FRANKFURT, Germany, Oct. 14 (AP)—Western Germany, the federal republic, is making a steady recovery in heading into economic boom.

Gen. Lucius D. Clay, American military governor, said the "dramatic recovery in the Anglo-American zone" is "miraculous" after a period of "desperate struggle" in the vital Ruhr district.

Walk down the street of any city in the western zone or scan industrial production tables and you will see that Germany is no longer a country of rubble, hunger and funny money.

Rubble Gaining Way

The rubble and gaping skeletons of bombed buildings are being used to one-story houses and four-story department stores with neon signs.

At store windows are brimming with consumer goods. They are priced to sell. Macy's basement never was more crowded on Saturday.

The Frankfurt trades fair had to expand its grounds to one lot to accommodate the more than 10,000 products exhibited this month. Macy's store display in New York at the German export fair opening Jan. 1.

Set New Record

Only a month after the western occupation authorities introduced currency reform, industries in bits and pieces set a new record of 67 per cent of 1936 production. Coal production was up to 81 per cent of pre-war days. This means the Germans are expected to yield 300,000 tons of hard coal a day.

Shop windows demonstrate recovery even more dramatically than statistics.

In Hamburg, you can buy for \$175 a new Leica camera that costs \$420 in New York.

Vacuum Cleaners for \$45

In Munich, a new vacuum cleaner sells for \$47.

In Frankfurt, a Woolworth store window is packed with American imports, some selling for less than at the army post exchange.

These prices are in Deutsche marks quoted at the official export rate of 30 cents a mark. There is no other international value. But there is a black market value of 12 to 15 dollars that some G.I.'s use.

The basic black market has disappeared with currency reform, however. No longer is every public park or square a barter mart.

China Red Army Fire on Chihnsien To Continue Siege

PEIPING, Oct. 14 (AP)—Chinese communists opened fire on Chihnsien with heavy artillery Wednesday as governmental relief forces fought up from the south in an attempt to lift the siege of the big Manchurian base.

Pro-government dispatches said red batteries were shelling Chihnsien from hills to the northeast. The communists managed to penetrate defense lines only one mile east of the city, these accounts said, but later were thrown back.

Mukden-based government warplanes supported the besieged garrison with continued attacks against the red army. The Chihnsien airfield was described as still in national hands, but it has been unusable since the end of September.

The press reports were coupled with a prediction of a turn for the better in three days. Presumably was based on advance relief forces fighting to reach Chihnsien. Two government columns were reported moving up from the port of Hulutoo, 30 miles south of Chihnsien.

Devices from Kaigan, capital of Chahar province and gateway to inner Mongolia, said the main communist forces in the vicinity were retreating northward.

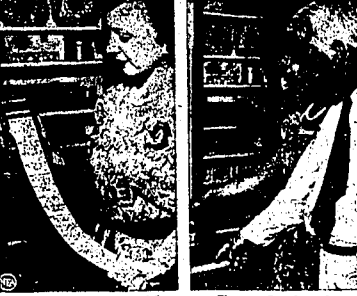

Grocery Wizard's 'Comeback Key' Lies in His 'Keedoolee'

MEMPHIS—Clarence Saunders, white-haired wizard of the self-service grocery business, hopes the key of his new "Keedoolee" store will open the doors to his third fortune.

Twice already Saunders has become a multi-millionaire through chain grocery, and lost his fortunes. Now he has stored a mechanical self-service store, something like a gigantic pin-ball machine, even to having little lights which flash on.

The customer never touches his groceries until he receives them neatly packaged. He shops with a key shaped something like a small camera.

The first "Keedoolee," which opened in a Quonset building a few weeks ago, drew hundreds of housewives in addition to numerous husbands and even some bachelors.

Saunders, 57-year-old native of Virginia, who started out as a 44-a-week grocery clerk, thus began his attempt to become a multi-millionaire for a third time.

It was 33 years ago when Saunders thought up a crazy name: Piggly Wiggly—and the revolutionary idea of having customers wait on themselves. He completely changed the retail grocery business, soon had his new stores with the clicking turnstiles spread across the land. He made and lost a fortune when he battled Wall Street, and he still says they changed the rules on him, or he would have won that titanic financial struggle.

He came back with the Clarence Saunders (Sole Owner of Key Name) stores and made another fortune, only to lose out again. Then for 13 years, nothing much was heard of him until he worked to perfect his automatic store idea, and spent a million dollars exper-

New Vigor Is Called Need to Cut Cattle TB

DENVER, Oct. 14 (AP)—The war against tuberculosis in cattle needs to be waged with new vigor, U. S. Livestock Sanitary association was told.

There are certain parts of the United States where the disease has flared to the "serious stage," Dr. C. F. Clark, state veterinarian for Michigan, told the 22nd annual meeting of the group. Clark is chairman of a tuberculosis committee which recommended revision of rules and methods for tuberculin testing of cattle.

Clark's committee, on which most of the major states are represented, recommended the revised methods to more effectively concentrate efforts in those parts of the U. S. where the disease is more prevalent.

"For the nation as a whole," Clark said, "the situation isn't alarming. But in certain individual states it is serious."

A U. S. government report submitted to the meeting showed tuberculosis in cattle was above the national average in California, Connecticut, Delaware, Iowa, Kansas, Maine, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Utah, Vermont and the Hawaiian Islands.

Already he is making plans to expand his Memphis "Keedoolee" into a "Keedoolee village," with an automatic restaurant, a super store selling fresh meat, vegetables and fruit in this present store handles only non-perishables and a landscaped garden with a lake in it for the benefit of his "Keedoolee" customers.

He has already sold franchises for "Keedoolee" stores in San Diego, San Francisco, Los Angeles, Cleveland, Buffalo, Washington, Baltimore, Richmond, St. Louis, Pittsburg and Philadelphia, and says the chain will be all over the nation within a year.

Here's how "Keedoolee" the Saunders abbreviation of "key does all" works: A customer enters the store, obtains the key, and shops among glass sample cases. She sticks her key into a red receptacle, pushes a button, marked "R," and the article and price is written in perforated code on an adding machine roll in her key. She goes through

the same procedure for other items. Each time she punches a key to "buy" something, a red, green or amber light flashes on—part of the decorative effect.

Finally, her shopping complete without having touched an article, she goes to the cashier's stand. Her bill is totaled, she pays up, and the perforated tape from her key is sent back by conveyor to a man behind through a "translator," which, by electricity, causes the groceries indicated by code holes in the strip to come down chutes.

Each order of groceries comes into a big wooden tray. Clerks put them into big bags which travel to the customer on a conveyor. The store is geared to handle five customers a minute, and Saunders expects to average \$2,000 an hour. He buys in carload lots, expects to mark up his goods from one-half to three cents an article over manufacturers' cost, no matter what the cost. Thus he would mark up a \$3 item no more than three cents.

Saunders said: "Let other stores outrun."
