Repercussions Of Mexico Tiff Seen for 1949

WASHINGTON, Oct. 21 (AP)—Repercussions from the controversy over imported Mexican labor seem expected to be felt in this country's sugar beet fields this year.

What may happen next year is something no one knows as yet.

Officials of the employment service said that all beet workers scheduled to be brought from Mexico this fall are already here and presumably at work.

Bank to Beet Fields

The total number was somewhat less than 1,000. Virtually all were sent to beet fields in the Rocky Mountain states—Utah, Colorado, Wyoming, Montana and Idaho. None went east of the Mississippi.

The field laborers were brought in under an agreement entered into with Mexico last February.

Recently the Mexican government accused this country of breaking the agreement through action of the government in throwing open the border at El Paso, Tex., to unlimited numbers of workers for hire by Mexico to leave that country.

A note to the state department said Mexico considers that its contract no longer is in force.

Long Negotiations

The 1948 labor agreement was entered into only after months of negotiations.

Any new agreement to bring in workers next year will have to travel the same road, which, in view of the latest happenings, may not be an easy one.

Employment service officials said the beet field quota of laborers was assigned quickly because of the ever present threat that freezing weather might damage the crop.

Besides getting the Mexican workers, employment officials said the beet industry recruited domestic workers throughout the United States to meet its labor requirements.

74 Million Dollars '47 Idaho Income For Federal Tax

BOISE, Oct. 21 (AP)—Soaring federal taxes devoured \$74,000,000 of Idaho's income last year, Ezra B. Hinshaw, Republican state chairman said Wednesday.

He said rising taxes have "characterized Democratic administrations" and pointed out that the Republican-controlled 80th congress gave the nation its first tax reduction in 16 years.

Hinshaw warned that "waste and inefficiency will continue to result in high tax burdens unless there is a change in our national administration."

"Federal taxes have increased more than 1,100 per cent," Hinshaw said. "Under the present national budget of about \$40,000,000,000 the bureaucratic government is spending about \$100,000,000 a day."

State Chamber for Car Driver Tests

BOISE, Sept. 21 (AP)—The Idaho state Chamber of Commerce Wednesday said Idahoans may not be able to get a driver's license by simply plunking a dollar on the counter next year.

The chamber said letters, editorials and other requests continue to flood the office of the state safety director demanding more rigid licensing of drivers.

The chamber said such a simple method of paying a dollar for two weeks to tests and examinations to determine how capable an applicant may be as a driver.

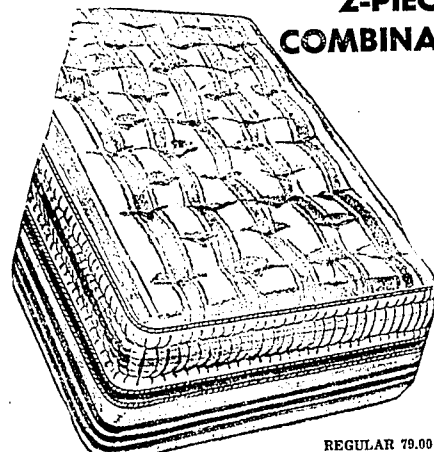

CHRONIC CRITICISM One of their speakers on a roundtable program the other night came out with that old threadbare accusation that the people were having something "stuffed down their throats."

Although in this particular instance the charge was made with reference to changes in the city's traffic regulations, it probably would have been made irrespective of what the city officials had under consideration.

Several months ago, following the completion of an exhaustive survey of Twin Falls traffic by a highly qualified authority, the city officials at Twin Falls afforded an opportunity to hear the traffic expert's report, first hand.

It was not the city officials' fault that only a handful of people turned out for that meeting. On several more recent occasions they appeared at other meetings to explain the traffic survey and its recommendations.

Even this week many Twin Falls business men were extended special invitations to a Chamber of Commerce meeting at which city representatives were present to discuss the traffic situation from every angle.

That same evening, one of the city officials and the chairman of the off-street parking committee went on the air in a roundtable discussion of the traffic survey and its major proposals.

Yet, after all these attempts on the part of city authorities to acquaint the public with the changes under consideration, and the public showing so little interest either in approval or in opposition, the charge again makes its head in the city streets.

We can understand why city administrations get fed up with their jobs. Although they are elected by the people, presumably to shoulder the responsibility of conducting the city's affairs, any move the city officials make in attempting to keep the city streets progressing automatically brings a protest from the usual belly-achers.

Of course the present city administration has made mistakes. It's doubtful if we'll ever have one that won't, even if these very critics themselves are fighting all the city officials.

It is people generally are disapproving of their council's actions, the least they can do is to familiarize themselves with the proposed steps to be taken when they are given that opportunity, and voice their objections beforehand.

It is true that it must be recognized that all this sharpshooting and belly-aching is coming from a relative few who are probably doing the city more harm than good.

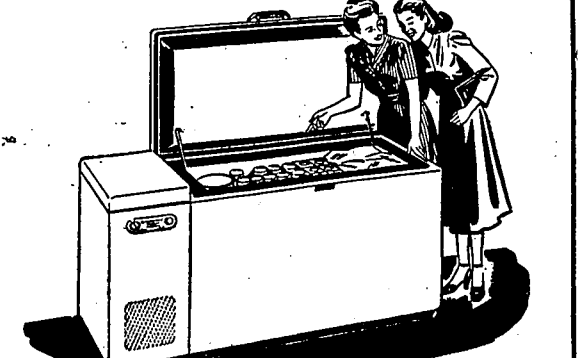

Greener was called to the camp at about 10:30 p.m. to give aid to his Negro cook who had been stabbed in the face, head, chest, stomach, legs and arms with a pocket knife wielded by another Negro.

The fight is reported to have started over an argument during a card game. The injured cook was taken to Olenia Ferry for treatment by a physician. No charges have been filed.

Vets Told of Student Loan Requirement

Magic Valley veterans studying full time in school or college under the GI bill were advised today by the veterans administration that they will be held legally responsible for tuition payments made by the VA for instruction periods they do not attend. Don Davall, Twin Falls VA representative, announced Wednesday.

Under a new VA ruling, veterans who drop from school before the end of a term or semester for which the VA has paid their tuition must refund the unused portion or acquire an equivalent amount of GI training maintenance.

Hit by Ruling
Affected by the ruling are veterans enrolled in institutions that (1) collect tuition and other charges in advance, and (2) limit refunds of tuition charges to any student veterans or non-veteran discontinuing study before the end of a term or semester.

Veterans who drop from training before the VA is obligated to pay full tuition will have their GI entitlement reduced only for the actual time tuition was paid by the VA.

Held Responsible
However, when the VA is obligated to pay the school full tuition charges, the veteran will be held legally responsible for any portion of the fee not used due to withdrawal from training.

To protect their GI educational entitlement and also help prevent substance overpayments, veteran students are urged to notify the VA immediately of any intention to drop from school, college or a job-training program.

Burley Rotarians Hear Outline for Law Amendments

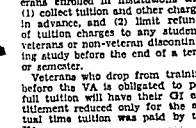
BURLEY, Oct. 21—Harry Harpster discussed the amendments to be voted on at the general election before the regular Tuesday meeting of the Burley Rotary club.

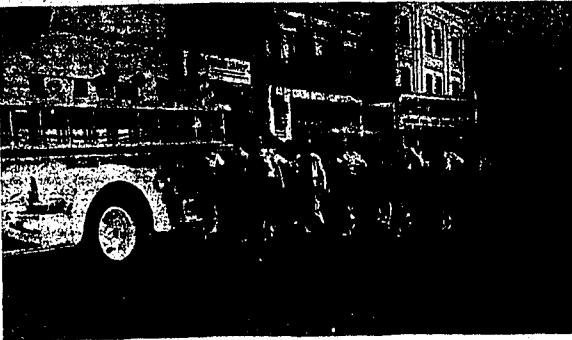

She retired from the stage and seven years ago and had spent her time writing on her 125-acre farm, "Bright Acres," near Kingston, Miss. Landi began her theatrical career with her stock company in Oxford, England, at the age of 19.

Before coming to England she had resided in Austria and France, and spoken German, French and English fluently. Her rise on the English stage was rapid, for only three years after her debut in 1923 she appeared in the leading feminine role in "The Sign of the Cross."

Her stage successes in London and later in New York quickly brought her to the attention of Hollywood and she made her first American film in the Hollywood production of "Body and Soul." BOSTON, Oct. 21 (AP)—When it comes to taking off excess weight, men have it all over women.

And that's women's opinion.

Adella Beuwkes, Michigan university nutritionist, said in an interview that she had interviewed 100 men and 100 women at the American Dietetic association convention.

But the girls are suckers for "dangerous reducing pills" or trick diets.

Seek "Magic Way"

The non-poly ladies are always looking for some magic way to lose 15 pounds in one week, reported the attractive and ardent professor.

"They forget how many years it took to make them overweight," Miss Beuwkes said, "and now they expect to lose it in a few days."

She said she has seen a formula to retain the strikish figure.

The only sure way, she said, is to discipline the sweet tooth by avoiding whipped cream, candy bars, pastries and gravy.

Majority of Fat Diets Don't Contain Enough Protein, she said, so "give up meat, eggs, butter and milk, and you may improve your figure but you ruin your health."

Fortunately the unbalanced diet seldom gets so irritable and unhappy, they can't keep at it very long.

The ideal approach, she said, is to get in touch with a doctor who gives more than a diet—he gives encouragement.

Officers of Association

Miss Beuwkes, an officer of the American Dietetic association, thinks girls are out on weight as the more complex.

"The more tied up in modern living we get, the more we release emotional tension by eating," she said.

What to do about it? Here's her advice:

"Every time the electrical people come up with a new labor-saving device, Americans should learn to eat a little less."

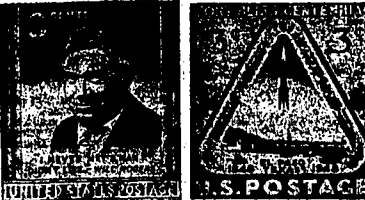

Shanghai Good Only to Avoid, Henry Finds on Second 'Visit'

By HENRY McLEMORE

SHANGHAI, China—If you'll furnish the wrapping paper and I'll give you a present.

You can have it. We're here for three days before we flew up to Peking, and on returning, I'll give you a present. It just as much as we did on our first visit.

To begin with, it goes against the grain of the whole thing. I can't have to pay tribute to keep up the show of around, and that is what I do in Shanghai.

The street vendors here come close to driving me crazy. I saw a side street and 10 or 12 of them will surround you, shove their bicycle in your face and demand that you buy something. There is no waving them away. The more you say "no," the more they shove against a wall or building. As a result, you give them money to get them out of your way.

There is a flourishing business in blackjacks in Shanghai. They are sold on many corners, and tourists are advised to buy one and display it prominently as they walk about the streets.

The first night we were in Shanghai we didn't know the score and were foolishly enough to argue with a "pusher-pusher" man crossing a bridge by richshaw. He wanted money for giving the richshaw one push as it started downhill. When I gave him none, figuring he hadn't done anything, he took a swing at me through the richshaw curtain and then ducked into the crowd. I told an M. P. about this and he advised me to get a blackjack.

The local cops won't help you, he said. "Get yourself a blackjack and let them have it."

Shanghai's unpleasantness is chiefly due to the millions of refugees who have come into the place since the civil war started. A recent census estimated Shanghai's population at something more than 8,000,000, but it is generally believed to be fully a million more than that. You never saw so many people in your life.

The city limits reach for miles, yet a drive around the city is like squeezing a rabbit hole. Downward progress is all but impossible. On Nanjing road, Feking road, Bubbling

No End Seen For Drops in Sheep-Raising

WASHINGTON, Oct. 21 (AP)—The agriculture department sees no end to the six-year decline of the U. S. sheep-raising industry.

But it says slight increases in wool imports next year will take care of a drop in supplies here. Other products, men and women's woolen apparel will appear in sufficient quantities at close to this year's prices.

In the periodic report on the wool industry, the department reported that sheep stocks dropped again in 1947. They were probably about 29,000,000 head on Jan. 1, the lowest since 1897 when the records start.

The report said total wool production will be only about 272,000 pounds in 1948—the smallest output on record. This year's production is estimated at about 289,000 pounds.

The government will continue to support the price of wool at about 12 1/2 cents a pound to the farmer, but it does not expect to buy much because the farmer can probably get more selling his output to meat producers.

True Story of Northern Italy Riots Unveiled

ROME—This is a matter of setting the record straight, or at least balancing it up a little bit.

In July, after the shooting of Communist Leader Palmiro Togliatti here, I wrote a piece on the basis of information available in New York, saying that the Italian government had displayed great strength and apparently had the communist situation well in hand.

Stage Demonstration

The communists had staged a widespread but brief demonstration throughout Italy, police in Rome had given a display of power in quelling it, and it looked like they had an army and police force capable of handling the worst situations.

It is not so sure now.

Competent and strategically placed observers here tell a different story. They say the government never let out the full story of what happened in northern Italy. We know of a brief slip and tuck situation, but not the full extent of the communist display of strength.

Reds Hold Control

Now it seems that the communists held control of key points in northern Italy for 24 hours or more. The highly-touted Carabinieri (mobile police) and other police were disarmed. Then the communists backed off with a nose-thumbing gesture, as much as to say "see, we can do as we wish, and we will yet—when we are ready."

The objective observers are inclined to agree with the communists. The picture they paint is this: The Carabinieri and army run something less than 25,000 men as provided by the peace treaty. The army is in good shape, but the Carabinieri are not, lacking leadership and unable to prevent the killing of several of their own men each month. Local police, something like 80,000 of them throughout the country, vary in effectiveness.

3 Million Active Reds

On the other hand there are two million active communists, including well organized armed units totaling 85,000 men, and five million more "volunt" communists.

Observers are quick to point to the trouble the Greek army is having with the small forces of General Markos, as an example of what could happen here with 85,000 men acting as guerrillas and supported by millions of sympathizers.

These are matters which allied military experts must consider—most dispassionately as they seek to prepare the defenses of western Europe. The question in case of war would be, how much can the country contribute to the general defense while still maintaining an upper hand over the communist at home? In the case of Italy, allied estimates are not optimistic.

Benelux Countries Ask End of Bans

THE HAGUE, Oct. 21 (AP)—The Benelux countries called yesterday for complete abolition of trade barriers and proposed a substantial reduction of tariffs in western Europe.

The three countries—Belgium, the Netherlands and Luxembourg—said in a joint memorandum to the organization of European economic cooperation (OEEC) that these were essential steps to further economic recovery.

Wallis was forcibly removed to police headquarters when he allegedly interfered with police who were attempting to arrest Jiri Citak, a Czech national employed as a translator by the British.

The note differed from Wallis' version given newsmen Monday evening. At that time Wallis said he was battered about and held for nearly two hours, although he identified himself as a British diplomat.

2 Revisions Quite Vague; Says Leader

BOISE, Oct. 31 (AP)—Dr. John Booth, executive secretary of the Idaho Education Association, Wednesday said in a recent statement by Secretary of State J. D. Price regarding two proposed constitutional amendments needed clarification.

The two amendments will be voted upon at the Nov. 2 general election. Dr. Booth said Senate Joint Resolution 1 proposes to eliminate the office of county superintendent from the list of elective county governmental offices and Senate Joint Resolution 2 eliminates from the state constitution mention of the state superintendent of public instruction as a resident and citizenship qualifications.

To Continue Superintendent Dr. Booth said "there is not, and never has been any intention to discontinue the office of state superintendent."

He explained that the proposed amendment to abolish qualifications of state superintendent of public instruction as a resident and citizenship qualifications of that office as an elective office.

There are at least four additional amendments yet to come, but which the legislature did not act upon because they came too late in the 1947 session for thorough discussion and consideration."

Dr. Booth said, "When passed, they will be designed to abolish the office of state superintendent as an elective office, so that the superintendent may be appointed by the state board of education."

Provision by Law Dr. Booth said, "contrary to Price's press release, the law already provides for the county board of education and also provides that it shall appoint the county superintendent."

He explained the law will not be fully effective, however, until the amendment is passed by a vote of the people. Even after enactment of the amendment, the county superintendent elected in November will serve out the term. Thereafter, that office would be appointed by the county board of education, Dr. Booth said.

2,400 Taken From Berlin By Lift Craft

BERLIN, Oct. 21 (AP)—German and allied authorities estimate that about 2,400 German children and invalids have been flown out of Berlin for rehabilitation in the western zone.

Eighty empty seats daily have been allocated on British airlift planes since Sept. 20, but only 100 on whom the Berlin blockade imposes special hardship.

British officials stressed that the problem of selecting individuals and providing for their care in western Germany is handled completely by Berlin city officials.

No "Large-Scale" Attempt

British and American military government officers stressed they were making no attempt at large scale movement of Berliners.

German authorities have established four priority categories for children and invalids wishing to leave.

Those needing special medical treatment unavailable here.

Those needing long rests and special food.

Early tuberculosis cases.

Delicate or undernourished children.

Plans Expanded

The plan originally called for evacuation of 1,000 children, but has been expanded.

German press reports said the International Red Cross plans to feed one meal a day to 100,000 aged Berliners. Additionally it plans to provide evening meals a week for 25,000 students.

There is little escape from other causes of the blockade, however. These include drastic rationing of gasoline and electricity.

Most homes in west Berlin get only two hours of power in the daytime and two hours before daybreak. The subway ceases operation at 6 p.m.

Raided Gas Stations

Americans and other allied nations also are under rigid gasoline and electric rationing.

The only relief comes from the black market, which has drained large quantities of food and gasoline from the Russian zone. Prices, however, are too high for the average working man.

But this black market was threatened as Russian and German police enlisted the aid of housewives to seal off the flow of all foodstuffs from the Soviet zone to Berlin.

BOISE, Oct. 21 (AP)—Gold has been discovered in Boise's backyard, a 71-year-old Bohemian has claimed.

Vern Durant, the prospector, claimed a "large body of low grade" ore contained also silver and 17 other minerals had been discovered one-fourth of a mile east of the Boise city limits.

Durant said he sent the sample to a Los Angeles assay firm and that they reported 17 minerals besides gold and silver. However, no strategic minerals were found in the samples.

Red Probes Show Few Are Disloyal

NEW YORK, Oct. 21 (AP)—Harry B. Mitchell, president of the U. S. civil service commission, said today that the FBI had investigated 2,110, 851 federal employees and "only found three-tenths of one per cent of them disloyal who there was any ground for suspicion or disloyalty."

Mitchell told the convention of the National Association of Postmasters that the number against whom there was any "real evidence" was only a small fraction of the 6,344 who might be suspected.

He also denied charges that civil service employees got their jobs because of their politics. He said Maryland and Virginia communities where federal employees live near Washington—Washington residents have no vote—all gave a majority to Thomas E. Dewey in his 1944 presidential race.

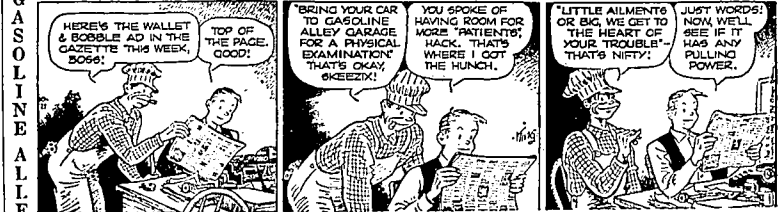

British Rearm "West Union" With Meteors

LONDON, Oct. 21 (AP)—Britain has started rearming the western union with her latest Meteor twin-jet fighter planes, it was reported authoritatively today. Holland already has received 200 Meteors, it was said, and other Brussels pact nations will receive a steady flow when the planned 100 per cent increase in British fighter production gets under way. The French armed forces have been receiving Vampire single-engine jet fighters from British factories as the first important move in the execution of the Brussels armament plan for the European powers.

That plan now is being studied by a committee of military experts in London and the supreme command of the western union's Field Marshal Lord Montgomery. Section of their defense airfields at strategic points on the continent is one of the problems facing the military committee. It was said that acceleration of the rearmament of the Brussels pact nations is being discussed in an aspect of the defense picture being discussed by the commonwealth prime ministers.

British air experts claim the Meteor is the fastest interceptor fighter in the world, comparing it with the newest American jet, which is not believed to be in service yet. The Meteor can climb to 40,000 feet in eight and a half minutes. Experts said it would provide a formidable air defense screen if available in sufficient numbers at key airfields dotted over the continent.

But the opinion was expressed in whitehall that effective rearmament of the anti-communist bloc depended entirely on finance. The French have been getting out of the Vespertine because their airfields are not yet equipped to handle the Meteor, which has a top speed of 600 miles an hour. It was believed the air experts of the Brussels military committee would now proceed to plan modernization and equipping of all continental airfields selected as key points in the defense screen.

Fire-Resistant Fluid Termed Air Safety Aid

NEW YORK, Oct. 21 (AP)—Development of a new fire-resistant hydraulic fluid that may increase safety in aviation was announced today.

The development, reported jointly by the Monsanto Chemical company, and the Douglas Aircraft company, combines most of the desirable characteristics of existing hydraulic fluids and fire-resistant qualities.

The announcement said the new fluid, to be known as airdrol, was developed after more than two years research work, and that arrangements have been completed for manufacture and distribution of the product.

The government has been urging development of such a fire-resistant fluid for civil planes, and last spring the navy announced it had developed a non-inflammable hydraulic fluid. The Air Transport association endorsed, however, that the navy development was not satisfactory.
