### Five Auxiliary Buildings for TB Hospital Are Nearly Ready

**GOODING, Oct. 27**—With the completion of installation of the heating plant for use at the state tuberculosis hospital here and the completion of covered walks connecting the five auxiliary buildings, the entire plant is nearly ready for use.

The work in the auxiliary buildings goes on landscaping of the grounds to be planned, some of which is underway.

The air view above shows the hospital and grounds, facing north. The first building, directly behind the hospital in the foreground, is being fitted for surgery and store rooms for the kitchen and household supplies.

The first building in lower right side is the dining room for ambulatory patients and a maintenance shop; the next two are ambulatory and semi-ambulatory wards. The last of the group of four is the ambulatory ward.

Directly to the rear of the group is the warehouse and in the upper right corner is seen the heating plant which is now used for heating the five auxiliary buildings, and which later will be used to heat the east building, shown in upper left corner.

Plans now include removal of the foundations shown between the two large brick structures. They were included in old Gooding college plans but were never used.

### \$296,260 Available For Conservation Projects in Idaho

**BOISE, Oct. 27 (AP)**—The state of Idaho will match federal funds 25 cents to the dollar to provide a total of \$296,260 available for conservation projects in Idaho during 1949.

Vernon B. Rich, federal aid coordinator for the state, said a record high of \$221.16 in federal funds is being granted the state.

The federal funds come from excise taxes on arms and ammunition. Rich said an increase in the number of hunters has substantially increased federal allocations to some states.

Rich said the projects to be benefited will be the Star lake refuge

in Lincoln county for migratory and upland birds; habitat development in planting food-producing trees and shrubs on marginal areas; expansion of North lake refuge in Jefferson county; distribution of salt by airplanes into forests to control migration of elk and deer; acquisition of game range and transplanting of game and fur-bearing animals.

- 3. Cut a half million persons off padded government payrolls.
- 4. Each one of us must restrain himself sensibly and halt the too-anxious consumer demand for available production and curtailment of unnecessary buying on credit.
- 5. Increased production throughout the country.

### Miller's six-point program included the following suggestions:

- 1. Recognize that the function of control legislation is to regulate the operation of economic forces and that such regulations can not be a substitute for civil forces.
- 2. Make reduction of the national debt the foremost objective.
- 3. Public movements to reduce buyers propensity to consume be fostered and encouraged.
- 4. Caution on Expansion. Manufacturers and producers be encouraged to utilize their existing production capacity to the limit, but be cautioned to avoid undue expansion.
- 5. Individual workers be encouraged to bend their best efforts to increase and improve individual production relying on their unions for protection against exploitation.
- 6. Continue the present European restoration program and cultivate that field for future foreign trade.

### GOPers Plan Victory Party On Vote Tally

NEW YORK, Oct. 27—Confident Republicans are getting ready today for their first presidential victory celebration in 20 years but the party's congressional prospects are spotted by gloomy doubt.

Gov. Thomas E. Dewey is ahead today in his contest with President Truman for the White House. Polls and the experts agree on that. The last time the Republicans won a presidential election was in 1928 when Herbert C. Hoover licked the late one of E. Smith. The last time one of the polls—and some of the experts—were wrong on the White House was in 1928 when they predicted Alf M. Landon, Kansas, would defeat FDR for the second new deal term.

The Literary Digest, which did that polling job among telephone subscribers and automobile owners, went out of the polling and magazine business all at the same time after the votes were counted. Landon won two states.

But this time the polls appear to be on the target. Mr. Truman is running against the States' Rights candidate, J. Strom Thurmond, in the south. He is running against Henry A. Wallace in some of the great industrial states with sizeable white wing concentrations. He is running against Dewey pretty much all over. It looks like Mr. Truman will be ousting.

### "Kitty Hawk" Will Be Placed Beside Lindbergh's Plane

WASHINGTON, Oct. 27 (AP)—Charles A. Lindbergh's "Spirit of St. Louis" began moving over today for a famous companion — the Wright brothers' pioneer "Kitty Hawk."

Hereafter, the Wright plane will occupy the No. 1 display spot at the Smithsonian Institution. The little aircraft in which Lindbergh flew to Paris 21 years ago — The first solo flight across the Atlantic—has held the place of honor since it was acquired in May, 1928.

Now "the Spirit" is being moved back about 40 feet from the entrance, its vantage point, the first sight to greet visitors, will be taken by the long-absent Wright machine. The Wright brothers' plane is being returned from London. Orville Wright, first man to fly, sent it there 20 years ago because of a dispute with the Smithsonian over credit for discovering and proving the principle of heavier-than-air flight.

# U. S. Spends To Find Way For Cost Cut

By HARMAN W. NICHOLS  
WASHINGTON, Oct. 27 (AP)—Government spending, like Tennessee's immortal brook, goes on forever.

You do know how much your government is spending to find out how much less it can spend? About \$2,000,000.

That's the estimated cost of a study on federal activities which has kept the commission on record—on the executive branch of the government—hunting for almost a year. It's still working.

Tom Dewey, who has an eye on Harry Truman's balcony, has been watching the study card. Hoover Hears Study

Mr. Herbert Hoover, who used to be a President himself, heads the commission and his headquarters here has, as yet, no final tally. Both Tom Dewey and Harry Truman have been talking about cutting corners. The federal spending last year was \$10,000,000,000. Cutting a big chunk out of it would cut a master stroke.

The four major items in the national budget are national defense, foreign aid, social security and interest that keeps piling up on the national debt. That adding up to around \$1,000,000,000 right there.

Want to Cut Costs  
After those figures were fixed, the Hoover commission came into the picture to find ways to holding spending to the lowest amount consistent with good performance.

It was Mr. Hoover's job to eliminate duplication in service—to roll up the red tape and throw it away. It was not an easy task—for a man of 74. Mr. Hoover, of course, isn't attempting it alone—and that's why he means done. But his office in Washington hears from him every few minutes.

The chore actually amounts to revising a whole government and that may never be done. The problems of today are a little more involved than they were a century and a half ago. Records show that congress was trying without success to re-legislate the government as far back as 1788. A lot of people have tried the same since.

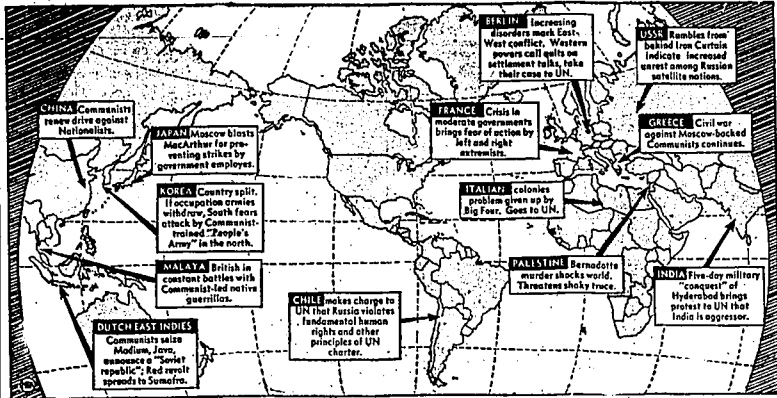

WASHINGTON, Oct. 27 (AP)—Henry A. Wallace is running for the office, but he has an uneasy eye on the future, too.

He is making repeated pledges that his new Progressive party will keep going after election day until it becomes one of the country's two major parties. Yet, according to his associates, he regards labor support, particularly from the CIO, as essential to his success.

That requirement would mean that the CIO split over the communist issue would have to be healed. During the past two years, the breach has been growing wider, not narrower, and the dominant right wing is fighting Wallace.

Progressive party leaders have no doubt that the right wing will reject its control at the CIO convention next month. In recent speeches clearly directed at such CIO leaders as President Philip Murray and Walter Reuther, president of the United Automobile Workers, Wallace has condemned "red baiting" by labor leaders. He will continue to invite them to join him, although he has no basis for hoping for any immediate liberal reforms.

According to some of his intimates, Wallace believes there may be disagreement as to the election among the anti-Wallace new dealers represented by the CIO right wing and American for Democratic Action. This conflict would be between those who favored forming a new "liberal" party and those who want to continue working within the Democratic party.

Reuther and his union leadership already are on record in favor of launching a new party after the 1948 election. A move of that sort presumably would splinter the "liberal" party and those who want to continue working within the Democratic party.

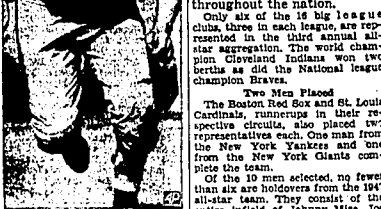

### Navy Moving To Aid Reich

WASHINGTON, Oct. 27 (AP)—The navy moved in today to bolster the Berlin airlift with 24 big transport planes.

The military air transport service said the planes are the vanguard of 60 additional C-54's which President Truman authorized for the supply run last week. It is the first time navy planes and pilots have been assigned directly to the airlift.

The navy planes can carry about 10 tons each. They will be transferred to Germany from the Pacific theater.

Maj.-Gen. William H. Turner, recently named commander of the combined British-American air forces in support of Berlin, will also command the navy planes.

The air force said about 200 C-54 transports are now in use on the operation but only about 150 of them are in daily use. Maintainers would keep about 40 planes tied up all the time.

Daily tonnage on the airlift is running about 5,000 tons. With the opening of a new air route in the French zone in December, air force experts believe the tonnage can be nearly doubled.

Up to now, the navy has been supporting the airlift indirectly. Its planes look over many global transport routes of the military air transport service to free air force planes for the Berlin shuttle.

Navy planes have carried 4,500 passengers and more than 800 tons of cargo in trans-Atlantic flights.

### Engineer Inspects Camas Building Material

### Tiny Plants Died, Volcano Blew Its Top to Make Area Building Material

A few hundred thousand years ago, a bunch of microscopic plants in a lake north of the present site of Fairfield gave their all in creating a deposit to be used in Magic Valley for building material.

More recently, maybe only 800 or 1,000 years ago, a volcano blew its top in the area now known as Craters of the Moon. Lava flows oozed off across the countryside from the volcanic eruption. As a result of one of these flows, there is a whole mountain of building material located near Magic reservoir.

These two building materials are unique because of their light weight. They will be used to construct probably 100 homes in a subdivision of Twin Falls in the next six months.

The deposit north of Fairfield is called diatomaceous earth. The name is derived from "diatom," a group of algae plants equipped with silica shells. The deposit is located seven and one-half miles north of Fairfield. It's one and one-half miles long and three-fourths of a mile wide.

Scores of billions of the tiny algae plants died to form the deposit which is 10 feet thick and covers an area of 500 acres, the approximate size of the ancient lake in which the algae lived. As the algae died, they sank to the bottom of the lake, thus building up pressure on lower layers of the tiny plants. Lava flows covered up the deposits of dead algae to put more pressure on the deposits. The result is diatomaceous earth, which resembles soft, powdery stone that can be crumbled between the fingers. It

weighs from 25 to 31.8 pounds per cubic foot, but it's tough.

The other building material, the mountain near Magic reservoir, resulted from a sort of "foam" pushed along on the head end of a lava flow. Weight of this pumice stone also is light.

Both building materials are easy to obtain. A power shovel can scoop up the deposits and dump loads on trucks.

Cement added to the building materials results in a sort of "concrete" that is an excellent insulation, stronger than ordinary brick, light and completely waterproof.

Grant Wirtick, vice president and director of the Commonwealth Investment and Finance company, declares the two building materials are natural. A geologist, he says the combination of the materials in approximately the same area is unusual. He has teamed up with J. G. West, a construction engineer, in the plan to build some 100 homes in Twin Falls in six months. West is president and director of the Commonwealth Investment and Finance company which was incorporated in Salt Lake City.

Wirtick said the combination of the two building materials in this area will result in FHA-approved, low-cost homes. The first 10 units in the project have been arranged, with the P. J. Bacon firm handling the real estate transactions. For a down payment of \$300, houses will be erected on the individual's lot. Approval of an FHA loan results in payments of \$37.62 per month.

Crews will erect 10 homes at one

time. Wirtick estimated it would take only 60 days to complete the first 10 houses, including installation of utilities.

After 10 houses are prepared for work, a spray-gun outfit mounted on a truck sprays on the walls which are from two to four inches thick, equivalent to a two-foot brick wall, according to Wirtick. Once spray work has started, crews will complete a house per day, he said.

Material used in the walls is a mixture of the diatomaceous earth, pumice and cement. The mixture is a form of concrete, with the diatomaceous earth serving as sand and the pumice as gravel.

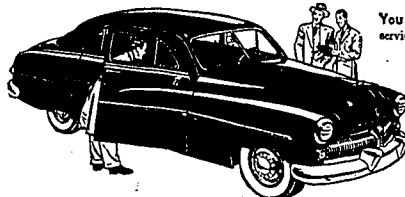
The diatomaceous earth is crushed into a powder and the pumice is broken up into small pieces ranging from 2/16 to 1/4 of an inch in diameter. The earth, pumice and cement are mixed in what is known as a "gunite" outfit, a cement gun.

The three ingredients are forced into a spray gun where water is mixed with them in a chamber. The finished material is shot out of the gun to form the wall of the house.

Wirtick said his firm had developed a process in which color is mixed with the water used in the gunite outfit, thus resulting in walls with solid color all the way through. Or the firm can "paint" walls by applying a second coat of colored material.

The firm plans to erect a plant in the center of Magic Valley to prepare the diatomaceous earth and pumice for use in their "gunite" outfits.

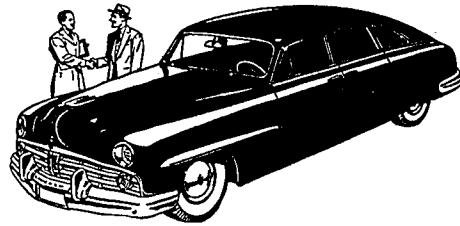

### USAF Chiefs Eye Doubling Of 'Lift' Rate

WASHINGTON, Oct. 27 (AP)—Air force officials estimate they can come close to doubling in about a month the daily tonnage delivered to Berlin by air.

This became known today on the heels of Russia's veto of a proposal in the United Nations security council for ending the land blockade of the German capital.

Early in December, the new Tegel airfield will open in the city's French sector. Built by 15,000 Berliners under supervision of U. S.

army engineers, it is about the size of Tempelhof but with much better approaches.

Potential of 8,000 Tons

It is estimated that when Tegel is opened, the American airlift force will have a maximum theoretical potential of 9,000 tons a day. The maximum potential at Tempelhof is estimated at 4,800 tons with the plans now used, and actual deliveries are running between 4,000 and 4,500 tons daily. With Tegel opened, it is estimated, deliveries could rise to 8,000 or more tons daily except in the very worst weather.

The big hitch is airplanes. Gen. Lucius D. Clay was given authority last week to draw 60 more C-54 transports when he needs them. While previous plane allocations were announced routinely by the air-

force, this one was announced at the White House.

"Effect" Considered

The idea, informed sources say, was to give the announcement the greatest possible weight for its psychological effect in Berlin and Paris.

So far, Clay has not actually sent for any of the 60 planes authorized. When and if he does, indications are that the air force will be near the bottom of its C-54 barrel. Headquarters here say there are about 400

operable C-54s. There are some 200 now being used in the Berlin airlift, exclusive of the 66 which Clay can request.
