# Soon To Be Tried In Fraud

WASHINGTON, Nov. 8 (AP)—J. Parnell Thomas, R., N. J., chairman of the house committee on un-American activities, was indicted today on a charge of conspiring to defraud the government.

Three charges of false claims also were contained in the federal grand jury indictment. He was accused also of 24 "overt acts."

His co-defendant, N. J. home, Thomas said "I have nothing to say at this time." He said he knew about the indictment and might have a statement later.

Indicted with him on the conspiracy charge was Helen Campbell, his former secretary.

This charge alleges a conspiracy "to defraud the United States of its money and property."

Court officials said that, if conviction were obtained, maximum sentence in the several charges would be 30 years imprisonment or \$40,000, or both.

Mr. "Bonafide" Thomas said the grand jury charged a conspiracy to pad the payroll of the congressional office with two employees who were not on the list. The two employees were named as Mrs. McKidd and Arnette McKidd.

The grand jury investigated published charges of irregularities in operation of the congressman's office.

The New Jersey Republican was called before the grand jury last week but declined to testify.

# Five-Year Conspiracy

The indictment said the conspiracy ran five years, from Jan. 1, 1943, to Jan. 30, 1948.

The indictment charged that Mrs. Campbell's niece, Mrs. McKidd, and a maid in Mrs. Campbell's home, who were named as Mrs. McKidd and Arnette McKidd, were employed by the congressman's office to defraud the government.

It was alleged that Mrs. McKidd and Mrs. McKidd, upon receiving their pay, turned over to Mrs. Campbell who deposited them in her personal checking account.

Thomas, according to the grand jury indictment, was charged with the conspiracy to defraud the government.

# Marshall Will Return Soon To Give Data

WASHINGTON, Nov. 8 (AP)—Secretary of State Marshall is expected to return to Washington before the end of the month.

It seems probable that the chief executive also will want to retire with his secretary of state before the end of the month.

The President of the United States started his Florida vacation at his naval submarine base in the company of a small group of White House friends, among whom he could relax and, for the time being, forget some of the problems of his office.

For the moment, his main concern was to take in the sunshine in colorful trunks and walk in comparative privacy around the submarine naval base where he is spending his fifth period of rest.

# Blueprints For Basin Aim Given

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 8 (AP)—A master blueprint for long-range development of the Columbia river basin was revealed today by army engineers.

The plan, described as the most comprehensive ever devised for an American river system, would cost over \$3,000,000,000, take 20 years to complete and reach into five Pacific northwest states.

# Double Power Output

It would more than double the basin's installed hydro-electric capacity by 1970, halt devastating flood damage, extend river navigation to 450 miles from the Pacific and add 220,000 acres of arid land to farming.

Col. Theron D. Weaver, north Pacific division engineer, said the report is the result of a five-year study. It replaces the army corps' original 1933 report on the Columbia basin's development.

The plan will go before the Columbia River Inter-agency committee on Wednesday. This committee represents state and federal departments and bureaus involved in regional resource development and conservation.

# I. N. Votes Balkan Quilt Of 'Threats'

PARIS, Nov. 8 (AP)—The western powers beat down a determined Soviet bloc filibuster today and forced approval in the 68-nation political committee of the United Nations of a charge that three Russian satellites threaten the peace of the Balkans by aiding the Greek communist rebels.

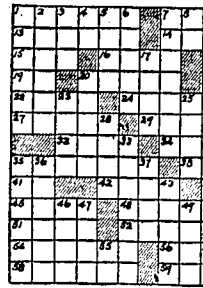

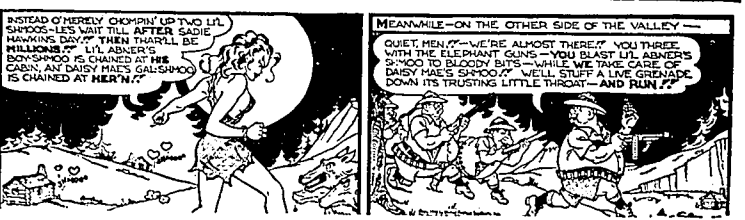
