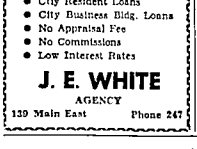

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 7 (AP)—The Democratic party must go forward vigorously with the program upon which it was elected, Vice President-elect Allen W. Barkley told a victory banquet audience last night.

Referring to the Democratic party as "the chosen agency of the people," Barkley said that "the election has done more to confirm the Democratic victory at least in part to the claim that most of the party's accomplishments were endorsed by our opponents with a rather shy suggestion that they could have done better if they had been in power and could do better if returned to power."

Dedication Set Wednesday for St. Helen's Church at Ketchum

KETCHUM, Dec. 7.—The long-awaited dedication of the new Catholic church at Ketchum will be held at 10:30 a.m. Wednesday when the Rev. Father L. M. Dougherty, pastor of Halley and attended missions of Ellaine county, celebrates high mass.

Wednesday is the "Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary," a Catholic holy day of obligation.

Music for the mass will be sung by the high school choir of St. Charles church, Halley, under the direction of Mr. Tom Walker, Sr. Solo numbers during the mass will be sung by Larry LaPrise, Sun Valley. Mass servers will be Jack Gieseler, Ernest, David LaPrise and David Goerchen.

The blessing and dedicatory prayers for the new church will be given by the Most Rev. Edward J. Kelly, bishop of Boise, assisted by the Rev. Father Mammoth McNeill, chancellor of the diocese of Boise.

The new structure, to be known as St. Helen's church, replaces one of the old landmarks in Ketchum, St. Mary's church, which was served in pioneer days by the Rev. A. J. Glorieux, bishop of the diocese of Boise.

A number of interesting relics of the pioneer days are to be preserved in the new church when suitable provisions can be made for them.

The new church building is located across from the Ketchum school in the heart of the business residential section of town. It is of dark and stucco construction, with frank red brick trim on the front and side.

Final stucco and brick work will not be completed until spring of 1949, because of the difficulty of winter construction. The interior of the church is finished in knotty pine ceiling, with polished hardwood floors, and aisle of multi-colored asphalt tile. The altar and pews will be of temporary nature, awaiting arrival of fitted furnishings being prepared by an eastern firm.

Construction work on the edifice has been done by the Morris Lund company of Boise, with Hubert

Idaho Mailing Forms for '49 Income Taxes

BOISE, Dec. 7 (AP)—P. O. Neill, state income tax forms, said today Idaho income tax forms have been mailed to all taxpayers who filed returns for 1947.

He said there has been no change in the requirements governing the filing of state income tax returns.

Requirements listed

Single persons whose net income for the year amounts to \$700 or more, or married persons whose joint net income amounts to \$1,500 or more, are required to file returns.

Non-residents having income from sources within the state are also required to file as well as residents for a fractional part of the year where income exceeds the personal exemption for such fractional period.

Due Before March 15

Returns are due on or before March 15, 1949, for those reporting on a calendar year basis.

Neill said tax forms may be obtained from the office at the statehouse in Boise, banks, courthouses or from department field auditors at Coeur d'Alene, Lewiston, Nampa, Twin Falls, Pocatello, and Idaho Falls.

USDA Finds Preference in Spud Desires

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7 (AP)—Farmers, here's a full-blown portrait of the American housewife's idea of a potato. The agriculture department suggests you tack it up in the barn for quick reference.

The department conducted a survey among 3,400 housewives to find out what they knew and liked or did not like about potatoes. Results indicate that farmers and shippers should see to it that the potatoes they prepare for market are clean, of medium size, free of spots and marked by few "eyes". The color and undamaged. They should be of such quality that they will cook up soft, mealy and waxy throughout—without falling apart.

Want Medium Size
Housewives like medium sized potatoes because they rule them easiest to peel and handle and best for judging individual portions. The all-purpose potato, they say.

The survey shows more than a fourth of the householders disturbed by "mechanical and handling injuries" to potatoes. Said the department in its report: "It is pretty good evidence that too many potatoes are being dug and handled with improper machinery and tools and that the potatoes are not properly culled before being sent to market."

Origin Unknown
Few housewives explained their likes and dislikes in terms of specific types of potatoes, or by reference to the producing area. Some 30 per cent of those questioned indicated they do not know the origin of the potatoes they prefer.

The department advises farmers not to take housewives' preferences lightly. Only two out of 100 surveyed say they buy potatoes without looking for good or bad points.

Of course, the housewives aren't perfect, either. The survey shows that most think the potato only food value is its starch.

Other Values Related
As a matter of fact, says the department, the potato has as much iron as two slices of bread, a boiled potato has as much vitamin C as a small glass of tomato juice and the lovely spud also contains appreciable amounts of vitamin B1.

The department indicates it hopes farmers and shippers can convince housewives about these other food values and help them forget the idea potatoes are "too fattening."

Reasons Stressed
Here's why, in the department's words: "Farmers have learned to produce more potatoes to an acre than they used to. But in the meantime, people are eating less potatoes per person than they did a few years ago. "Consumers with high incomes usually eat fewer potatoes and more of other foods than when incomes are low, and say they are not inclined to use more potatoes when potatoes are plentiful and cheap than when they are scarce."

Auto Dealers Warned Over Profits Taxes

BOISE, Dec. 7 (AP)—A practicing profits tax would result in lower production and possibly start a decline in employment, the Idaho Automobile Dealers association was told today.

John W. Stokes, New York City attorney and tax specialist, told the association's annual convention that government investigations leveled at corporation profits were designed to shake the public confidence in large and small businesses alike in efforts to bring about an excess profits tax.

No Present Incentive
He said that although the assessment of such a tax in wartime had the incentive of patriotism, there was no such incentive now because industry needs a fair profit to warrant the risk of investment in production expansion.

Production is the key to price reductions and if the government will not permit the present on business competition will bring prices down sufficiently rapidly to avert a devaluation, Stokes asserted.

He said the Mary report on the automobile business was an example of government interference that is designed to result in property.

After several months of investigation into the selling price of automobiles, two or three witnesses were produced as a basis for the conclusion that dealers are selling cars at outrageous prices, he said.

The committee failed to mention that the prices received for automobiles are only slightly higher than the cost of production, whereas other products are 50 to 200 per cent higher, including income taxes, Stokes told the delegates.

Retirement Open For Members of "Civilian" Groups

Members of civilian components of the army who wish to apply for retirement with pay under the provisions of the new law 156, and who are 60 years of age or approaching 60, may now secure application blanks and receive adjustments of departments of the army, according to Capt. A limited supply of the forms, designated as NME 108, is available. Consequently, the department of the army will furnish them only to individuals who are 60 or more, or close to that age, and who are retired from service by the adjutant general to be otherwise qualified for retirement benefits, Captain Rodarme said.

Under title 11, public law 156, a minimum of 20 years of satisfactory military service is required of the civilian components of the armed forces is required, with some time spent in active duty during either World War I or II.

Forms are being mailed to qualified persons who have previously applied, Captain Rodarme said. It is not necessary for applicants to submit affidavits of service. The adjutant general will verify service claimed from records on file according to Captain Rodarme.

He showed it to the experts at his school and they suggested he take it to New York's Metropolitan museum. Met officials said he "might have something" and bid him to try for identification at the Boston museum of arts. So Bernie hitchhiked up there. He was told that the portrait was of the French school, dating back to the early 1800's and "it appears to be worth at least \$1,000."

Official Says Farm Programs Aim at "Plenty of Food" Goal

RUPERT, Dec. 7—Price support and conservation programs administered by elected farmer-committees seek to provide plenty of food for everyone, according to Earl E. Merz, newly elected chairman of the Minidoka county agricultural conservation committee.

As far as production is concerned, the programs are paying off, he said. "Farmers are producing the greatest crops in history and progress is being made in protecting the soil for future abundant production."

Price support, or price stabilization, programs aid work being done to protect the land from erosion and depletion. Merz said the first step in conservation is protecting the farmer and his family against ruinously low prices.

Price supports put a floor under commodity prices and keep them from going down so low as to hurt the farmer out of business, he explained. With that protection the farmer can go ahead with his program of agricultural conservation and abundant production.

Stability in the farming business encourages better care of the land through conservation practices which control erosion and build the land for greater production, Merz said.

Price supports and conservation, being closely related, are administered by the same elected farmer-committees, he declared. Loans and other price stabilizing programs with soil and water conservation fit into the pattern of greater security for the nation.

Quince Rice, acting chairman of the Idaho production and marketing administration committee, maintains that conservation under the

probably was taken with an eye toward protecting any revenue that might be lost to the cities by repeal of the slot machine law.

It is estimated a two per cent sales tax would raise between six and seven million dollars a year in Idaho, but asked whether the sales tax would replace an already existing tax or be added to the Idaho tax structure makes little difference.

You said a sales tax is a "nuisance" to the taxpayer, but adding "as a nuisance it makes little difference to the tax conscious and more interested in his state government."

He said a sales tax alone does not give equality of taxation. One of the traditional arguments against a sales tax is that it hits hardest at the lower income group in its proportionate ability to pay.

"Many cities are hard pressed for funds and it appears something must be done to give them more revenue," You said. "But whether or not the sales tax, with some apportionment to cities, is best is a question."

He said the sales tax is "easy" to collect in contrast with a state income tax. You explained that if the tax is collected only in cities it would work a hardship on businesses operating within the city limits and hurt businesses outside the city limits.

Dr. Booth said the Idaho Education has talked over possibilities of a sales tax at numerous sessions, but said "it is up to the house ways and means committee to find methods of raising money for the state's program."

He said the possibility of a sales tax at the state has a general fund balance of 10,000,000 and does not need the extra tax. They say municipal governments are the ones that need new revenue sources—not the state.

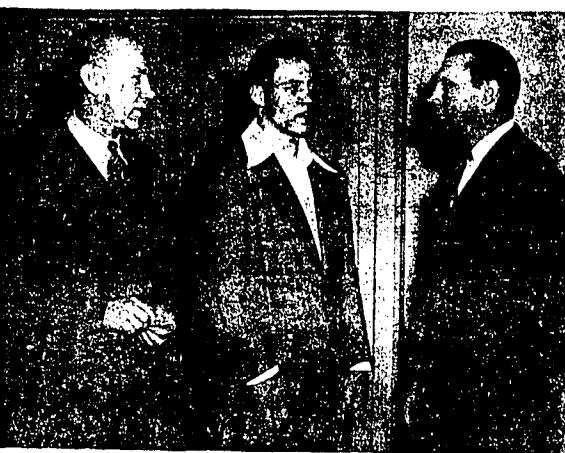
