



3 Judges Are Candidates to Miller's Office

BOISE, Dec. 20 (AP)—Local bar association has named three district judges as candidates to succeed Sen. Bert H. Miller on the Idaho supreme court.

Miller's resignation from the high court will become effective tomorrow. Gov. C. A. Robins will appoint his successor.

Miller will leave for Washington tomorrow morning. He will replace Henry C. Dvorshak in the U. S. senate.

At the Dec. 4 meeting, the Idaho Bar association voted to allow each of the 11 local bar associations to recommend one man for the gubernatorial appointment.

When Miller handed his resignation to Governor D. E. Robins, he said he "didn't know" if he would want to be re-elected.

District Judge Hugh A. Baker, who is retiring, is a possible candidate. Although he is endorsed by his own local bar association, local sources said Baker had asked that his name not be entered as a supreme court candidate.

(Editor's note: Gen. Lucius D. Clay, American, disclosed tonight that about every month to escape Russian and German attacks in the American and British zones in Germany, he talked with a German policeman.

AMERICAN-SOVIET ZONAL FRONTIER, Germany, Dec. 20 (AP)—A family of 10 people is being repatriated 1,000 times a month—along the 120 miles of the Soviet zone and German borders the American and British zones.

### Cull Potatoes Processed at Starch Plant

A new starch plant employing 20 men on a full-time basis recently started operations in Twin Falls. The plant, located in the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce Industrial site, utilizes low grade potatoes to make starch used in the adhesive industry.

The plant, which serves the central counties of Magic Valley, has a water system consisting of two wells 600 feet deep and a reservoir with a capacity of 175,000 gallons. Two separate water lines supply the plant. An eight-inch line supplies the processing portion of the operation and a six-inch line carries water used to float potatoes to the conveyor. None of the water is used a second time.

**Pulp Use Planned**

According to plant officials, the pulp is not being used at the present time but plans have been made for using it as livestock feed during the 1949 season.

In photo No. 1 potatoes to be processed into starch at the factory of the Magic Valley Processing company are brought by truck and carried by overhead conveyor belts into the storage building. The capacity of the storage building is 100,000 pounds—or 15 days supply for one-shift operation.

Photo No. 2 shows how the potatoes are carried from storage to a conveyor by water, up the conveyor into machines which wash the potatoes and separate them from rocks and trash.

**Potatoes Crushed**

After being washed, the potatoes are run into a pre-crusher which forces feeds them through a specially designed disintegrator. (Photo No. 3) The crushed potatoes come out of the disintegrator as a heavy "slurry" which is pumped into two long shakers.

In the shakers, photo No. 4, most of the fine starch cells are washed through fine screens. The pulp from these shakers is pumped into a second disintegrator and mesh shaker, where the remainder of the starch is removed from the pulp.

**48-Hour Process**

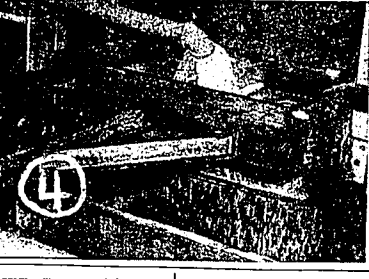
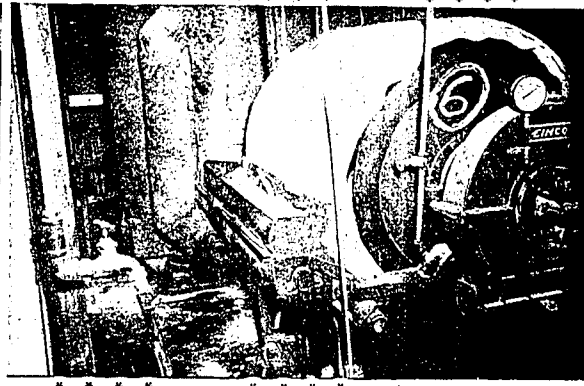
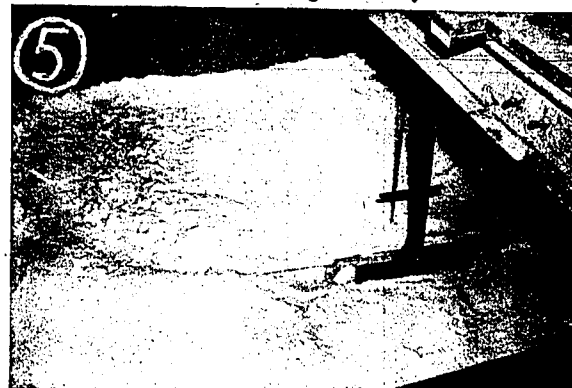
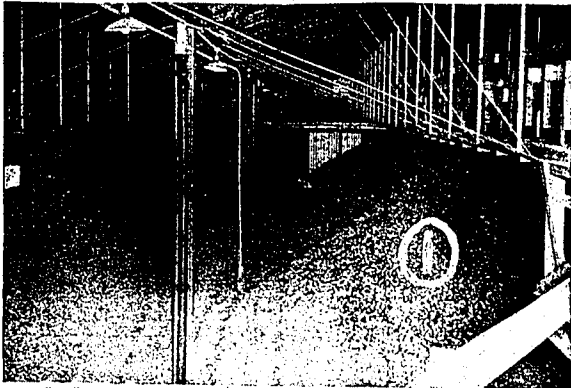
After the starch milk flows through separators which separate the protein water from the starch, the solution is pumped into primary vats, (photo No. 5) where excess water is pumped off. New water added and the starch put in solution by large agitators. After this procedure has been repeated in the secondary vats the starch is ready for drying. These processes require 48 hours.

The moisture content is reduced to 40 per cent in a large vacuum filter and the starch cake is cut from the filter drum, (photo No. 6) chopped fine and conveyed into "cyclone" dryers. This drying process is known as the flash process and requires 25,000 cubic feet of air per minute at 300 degrees Fahrenheit.

The dry starch is elevated by a high velocity fan, approximately 55 feet vertically and 20 feet horizontally, into a silo where it is sifted through a silk screen into the bagging hopper for packing in 100 pound bags, (photo No. 7). Less than a minute transpires from the time the cake enters the system until the starch is ready for bagging.

After the bags are sewed shut, the starch is placed in a warehouse to await shipment to eastern markets.

# State Publicity Report Shows Tourist Gains

BOISE, Dec. 20 (AP)—Idaho's state board of publicity today has released a report of its activities since the time it began its promotional work nearly 18 months ago.

The report, which was mailed 15,194 and news releases between July 1, 1947 and Dec. 15, 1948.

As a result of this extensive campaign, the report stated, was 429,728 copies of national publicity.

A comparison of 1947 and 1939 figures shows an increase of nearly 100 per cent in the state's travel industry.

Part of the higher income from tourists resulted from increased tax revenue from taxes on gasoline sales.

15 Per Cent Increase

Although the board made no attempt to measure the amount of traffic in Idaho, the board said tourist traffic during the year amounted to 15 per cent more than it did in 1947.

The bulky report also lists 6203 inquiries about Idaho from residents of almost every state in the union and many parts of the world.

Travelers seemed more curious than in any other year. The publicity board answered 79 inquiries from tourists and questions about the Gem state came from places as distant as Shanghai, The Netherlands, India, Ecuador, Italy, and South Africa.

# Top Forester To Seek Fire Control Hike

BOISE, Dec. 20 (AP)—Robert L. Chubb, state forester, today announced his plan to seek an increase in the state's fire control program.

In recommendations listed in the department's biennial report, Chubb said that the state's fire control program should be expanded to include fire protective districts, the most "most important" feature in our fire control program.

Chubb also recommended the position of state fire warden be made a full-time employment of 1 1/2 months each year and that the position be increased commensurate with the responsibility.

In recommendations made in the report included: A \$10,000 revolving fund for buying tax delinquent forest land for fire control; timber marking in selected branches of timber continuance and expansion of the state fire control program; and additional regulations in laws governing disposal of timber lands.

# 'Breaker' of Red Barrier Escapes Jail

BERLIN, Dec. 20 (AP)—Former paratrooper Edward J. Lada, who was arrested in Berlin for his love (or love), has disappeared from the U. S. army jail where he was held.

Lada's absence from the stockade was discovered Saturday night.

MPs went immediately to the barracks but found no sign of his friends, one of them the mother of his 3-year-old daughter. Lada was not with either of them.

Legal Inquiry Charged

Lada had been held at the army stockade since his arrest in Berlin. The 28-year-old hiker was arrested in Berlin in November. He was arrested after he went to the U. S. consulate to try to legalize his visit.

Lada told authorities he had come to see his sweetheart. He didn't say if there were any other reasons.

Was Turned Down

When he came for parole, Lada's attorney said he wanted to marry Ruth Rieck, 23-year-old mother of his daughter. He asked for a visit to Ruth and the boy, but the request had been turned down once because of his health.

Officers at the stockade said Lada's disappearance followed receipt of a letter from the U. S. army police the U. S. army "sold him off."
