Fred Vincent, a seismologist at the University of Nevada, reported his seismograph was still recording tremors, four days after the area first began to be shaken by earthquakes.

1948 Reports Dedicated to Willard Kunz

RUPERT, Dec. 29—Dedicated to the late Willard Kunz, the annual report of extensive service activities in Minidoka county has been prepared by his successor as county agent, Wilmer D. Pritchard, and Adeline Coltrin, club agent, and Adeline Beaver, home demonstration agent. Kunz served between Nov. 1, 1947, and Oct. 19, 1948.

His reports show a total of 987 farms in Minidoka county. Of that number, changes in practices resulted on 550 as a result of the 1948 agricultural program. A total of 348 farm families and 69 other families were influenced by some phase of the extension program.

A breakdown of the 550 farm figure shows 200 farms were reached for the first time, changes were made by 100 non-farm families, changes resulted in 10 farm homes from home demonstration activities including five for the first time.

Non-farm homes in which changes in practices came from home demonstration work numbered five including two for the first time. Four of the club members were enrolled in 81 farm homes and 21 other homes.

Exact crop acreages were unavailable but those estimated by irrigation districts were: Irrigated wheat, 6,000; oats, 2,000; barley, 1,500; corn, 40; alfalfa, seed 100; pasture 2,500; field beans, 9,000; sugar beets, 3,500; potatoes, 7,000; new seeding, 3,000; alfalfa hay, 18,000; peas, 30; and dryland wheat, 2,500.

Cost of the extension program between Dec. 1, 1947, and Nov. 30, 1948, amounted to \$3,600.77 was budgeted. Principal items of expense were airplane fuel, travel, freight and express.
