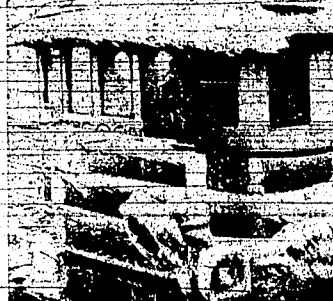

s Coming in
50,000 Years**

POKANE, Jan. 2 (AP)—A huge glacier some day will spread a cool blanket over the Pacific northwest, a college professor who studies such things said today.

It will not need to melt your lawn mower. The big glacier expected to flow over the Pacific northwest in 50,000 years or so.

That's the opinion of Dr. H. H. Hensley, of the botany department at the University of Idaho.

Studies show that history repeats itself, he reasoned. "The last ice age," he said, "was about 10,000 years ago. A great part of the world was covered by ice and the general trend has been toward continued coolness and increased moisture."

But don't shed too many tears for the citizens who might be troubled by glaciers in 1950, or thereafter. "You won't really have it so bad. Dr. Hensley said in previous glacial times it wasn't nearly so cold as imagined; plants continued to live; mammoths and other animals lived at the glacial period."

He spoke at a botany-moology symposium of the Pacific Northwest Scientific Association. In his talk, Dr. Hensley detailed northwest history revealed in the pollen of primitive forests preserved in peat bogs.

'Critical' Year Seen for U. S. Foreign Policy

WASHINGTON, Jan. 3 (AP)—Cool-headed and two-front cold war, President Truman and his advisers are looking forward to a tough and critical foreign policy year in 1949.

Two critical years are forecast, officials said today.

One is the problem of developing an effective reconstruction program in the far east.

The other is the job of deriving some way to prevent western Europe from falling into a new economic hole when Marshall plan aid ends in 1952.

Both new lines dominates state department concern over the future outlook for U. S. foreign policy, it was learned today.

Here, according to a survey among administration experts, are the major questions that President must deal with in the weeks and months ahead.

1. European aid—State department experts agree convinced that the Marshall plan is proving at least two-thirds successful. It may be one-third failure. They believe there is no new line hope that Europe will be able to stand on its own feet by mid-1952 when the four-year program ends.

2. Far East—Policy advisers are not sure last Thursday on specific actions which may be taken to block communism in the Far East. Following the Korean war, they are announcing an aircraft carrier is going to Adak.

3. Atomic energy—Here Mr. Truman is confronted with two problems. One is mainly that persuading congress to restore American partnership with Canada and Britain in research and development. The other problem concerns international control of atomic energy and weapons with the Soviet Union. It guards which Russia has consistently rejected.

4. European union—Some top advisers feel the United States will soon have to make a basic decision on the line between Europe and American relations with it.

5. Peace treaties—Germany, Japan and Austria are still without the treaties which would normalize their relations with the United States.

6. China—The first 1950 issue on China seems certain to be primarily the problem of relations between the non-communist countries—chiefly America and Britain. Britain is expected to recognize the communists within two weeks.

7. Relations with Russia—The conflict between Russia and the west will continue at many points. Probably the focal point, however, will be Yugo-Slavia.

Here that the Kremlin will make its maximum effort to crush Marshall aid to the east. It is expected to direct threats of force by the Soviets would pose one of the really critical questions of the year.

8. Yugo-Slavia—The United States will support should the United States give Yugoslavia?

Decline Reported In-Reno Business

RENO, Nev., Jan. 3 (AP)—Either married life is becoming more and more serene or the Virgin Islands are taking a healthy bite out of Reno's divorce business.

Or maybe people just haven't got the money they had during the immediate postwar days.

In any event, the total number of Reno divorces dropped 10 percent in 1948, for the third consecutive year.

The 1948 total is the lowest since 1942 when the first of the hasty wartime marriages attained to break up. From then until 1946 the divorce rate here went soaring, reaching the dizzy climax of a 35-a-day average in 1946.

Since 1946, the annual divorce total has declined—until the 1949 total of 3,871 divorces in one year is nothing to sneeze at compared with any previous year. The previous record was set in 1947—the year Nevada's six-week divorce procedure was enacted—with a total of 4,745.

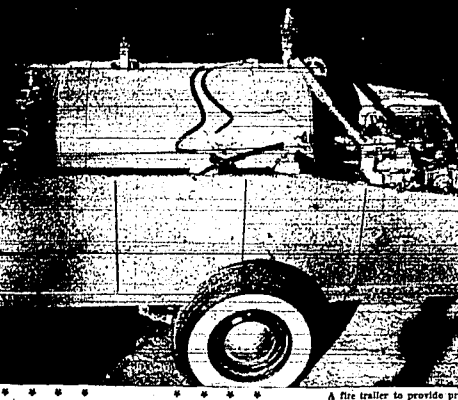

11-Inch Model Auto Runs on Small Battery

RUPERT, Jan. 3—Phil Jacobson, senior in the Rupert high school, is gaining recognition throughout model automobile circles for his accurate scale reproductions of late production models.

Jacobson, three times winner of the western district states-body-model builder, contrasts over competition the western states in the past three years, recently has completed a two-door 1948 model Ford sedan.

The late creation was drawn on the scale of 1/16 of an inch from pictures in magazines. It was started during the winter of 1948-49 and completed at the start of the current school year.

It is operated by a mini-motor, also constructed by the young builder, which is mounted in the trunk and operated by three small batteries, two of which are placed under the hood, and the other directly beneath the tiny car's motor compartment.

The 11-inch model has a small electrical which operates the speed governor, the tilt of the radio antenna mounted on the rear fender. The car can be placed in reverse and has variable speeds in both directions.

The wheels for the diminutive Ford was turned on a wood lathe and made of white pine. They are attached on aluminum springs with the four wheels being connected by threads and operated by the steering wheel located below the hood.

The car is mounted and to the left in the conventional place which is located which releases the hood.

After the other things which operate are both door catches, the trunk lid, glove compartment, cooling ventilator and the left in the front seats, upholstered in mohair and cushioned with foam rubber, fold down into the conventional manner, and located on either side of the rear seat can be found an arm rest.

The car's body is made of balsam wood finished with primer, zinc, hand smoothed and painted with about four coats of green car lacquer. The frame is made of copper and the entire inside is upholstered and two small lights under the front end is opened.

Other standard equipment on the model include a horn which, steering column gear shift, windshield wiper, spotlight, emergency brake lever, dash panel with regular gauges and speedometer, tail tail exhaust pipes with mufflers, clutch pedal, accelerator pedal, bumper guards and a foot brake pedal which operates a two-wheel brake.

In addition to his talent with model automobiles, Jacobson takes a leading part in school dramatic productions. He now is working on another model car to enter in a contest scheduled soon after the first of the year.

Ending Will Target for POPs in 1950

ANNOTON, Jan. 7 (AP)—State leaders seemed agreed today on ending population policies on or about the 1950 census.

It was the one suggestion that drew most of an analysis current and recent statements on the future course of the party. As of now, it needs more money and more money means more growth at the present time.

Ailing Water Resources Policy Review To Be High on Agenda for Congressmen

WASHINGTON, Jan. 7 (Special)—Sen. O. E. Roberts, when Congress reconvenes this week will have a full dress review of our long ailing national water resources policy.

To structure this will be especially significant because it may lead to a drastic revision of the present reclamation law and perhaps an ultimate reorganization of government agencies. The basic reclamation law was passed in 1902.

"We hope this review will give us something that we really haven't had for a long time; a federal water policy for the entire west—that is both definite and dependable," a Senate expert charged with organizing the hearing said last week.

The Hoover commission report on water resources crystallized long-standing questions about the wisdom and internal dissemination which has marked much government-aided water projects.

Airlines Had Safest Flying Year in 1949

WASHINGTON, Jan. 7 (AP)—The nation's scheduled airlines had their safest year of flying in 1949.

Only one passenger lost his life for each 100,000,000 passenger miles on domestic and international routes. This is about 25 per cent better than in 1948, the previous best year, and 83 per cent better than in 1947, one of the worst. A passenger mile means one passenger carried one mile.

Four Fatal Crashes

There were four fatal accidents in 1949, all on domestic routes, in which 23 passengers and 11 crew members were killed. This was the smallest number of accidents and the lowest death toll in five years.

The domestic carriers had five fatal accidents, with 83 passengers and 11 crewmen killed in 1949. The International Airlines had one accident in which 20 passengers and 10 crewmen died the same year.

Death Rate Lowered

The lower rate of passenger deaths is due in a large part to the greater volume of travel, estimated at around 900,000,000 passenger miles by government statisticians.

Two of the four airline accidents resulted from collisions with military-type aircraft. These accidents were:

Rupert Permits Exceed \$140,000

RUPERT, Jan. 7—Permits approved by the city this year authorized a total of \$147,718 in new construction, the city reported.

Of the total \$15,000 went for new houses, \$30,000 for business district improvements, \$17,650 for business house remodeling and \$82,068 for residential alterations. Many of these permits accounted for 175 mainline.

During 1949, there were 28 fires occurring within six weeks in November and December.

Record Road Project Seen In This Year

NEW YORK, Jan. 7 (AP)—American taxpayers are expected to pay a record \$2,000,000,000 this year for roads and highways. Today they are expected to spend more than \$1,000,000,000 on the road.

This is because of the construction boom in the last few years. In 1948, they dropped another 8 per cent, while highway labor productivity is reported up.

The "budgeting" having on next year's road bill could mean either \$2,000,000,000 more for roads, or a \$200,000,000 reduction in taxes.

Tax Rate High

Part of the cost of building highways is borne by state income tax. The annual burden of state and federal gasoline and automotive taxes now runs "alarmingly close to \$100 a vehicle," according to Baird H. Markham, director of the American Petroleum Industries committee of the American Petroleum Institute.

From all parts of the nation come the cheering word that while the United States launches itself on its greatest road building spree, roads are on their way down.

Massachusetts reports that contractors recently bid 20 to 30 per cent more than the state estimate of road construction costs.

Colorado finds construction costs down 13 per cent. Arkansas rejoices in a similar drop, but worries lest the minimum wage hike to 75 cents an hour next month may wipe out the gain.

California Notes Dip

California finds that by mid-year road costs were already down 6.7 per cent from the peak, which occurred last August and the first months of 1948.

Whether the recent hike of about 50 cents in the basic price of steel will halt or reverse this trend is not yet apparent, but cement is a more important cost item in road than steel.

This year the nation is estimated to have spent \$1,700,000,000 on its roads, a record. A new high is expected next year.
