Advice Given On Boost for Crops of Pigs

MOSCOW, Jan. 4 — Although Idaho's spring pig crop will not be coming along until the later days of February, the fact is that in March, the fate of many pigs will be decided during the cold winter months some 60 to 90 days before they are born.

Each sow the brood sow now may mean the difference between good healthy pigs that will grow fast and strong and the weak litter that is hard to make into good pork and reasonable profits.

Proper Feed Care
Dr. Lloyd Scribner, station veterinarian at the University of Idaho, says poor litters of weak pigs often come from sows that do not have the proper feed and care during the gestation period.

The good sow can produce good litters only when she is on a well balanced ration that is going to furnish the developing pigs with the right vitamins, minerals and nutrition," Scribner emphasizes.

Recommendations
"A sow should gain during the time she is carrying the pigs but she should not become too fat. Be sure of enough exercise, a balanced ration, plenty of good clean water, a good place for housing and you can usually bet that she is going to produce good pigs."

The national figure shows that only two out of every three pigs born live to the weaning age. One third die, many because of poor start resulting from poor feeding and management of the sow before the pigs were born.

New Products Remove Some U. S. Hazards

NEW YORK, Jan. 4 (AP)—Accidents will happen, so if you have mirrors set fire to the curtains, or shoot a dead duck, there are new products to take care of everything. A new shatter-resistant mirror to meet safety requirements in public washrooms, hotels and housing developments is being made by a Pittsburgh firm. The company says the mirror has four to five times the resistance to impact as conventional plate glass. When it is broken, it disintegrates into small granules that the company says are harmless. The mirrors are installed with a theft proof hanger.

Setting fire to the curtains has been made very difficult by two New York companies who jointly developed a fire-resistant wool-glass fabric for curtains. The fabric also resists moisture and dust, tends to remain on the surface of the material. Dry cleaning is not recommended and neither are the fire-resistant qualities.

Decorative made of non-bleedable emulsion plastic are manufactured in the U. S. The emulsion plastic is applied to the correct angle in the water. It has a white material to make them self-righting and for use as a stand out of the water. The product comes in a variety of colors.

New Fungicide Made
A new agricultural fungicide has been developed by the U. S. which is said to be exceptionally effective against a large variety of fungus diseases attacking fruits, trees and certain plants. It is called BR-48 and is a white, odorless, bacteria-proofing chlorine and sodium chloride compound containing carbon, hydrogen and oxygen. Effective dosage appears to be one gallon of active fungicide in 100 gallons of spray.

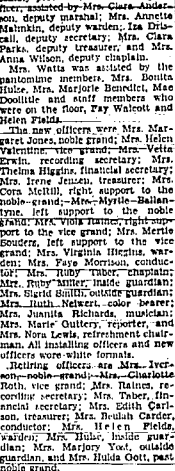

Care of Your Children

By ANGELO PATRI
When most people speak of discipline they mean something unbecomingly severe that causes suffering because of unpopularity always. That is not what the teacher means by discipline. He means the sort of training that will set a child's attitudes and establish his relations with his parents, his neighbors, his life with love, truth and more enjoyment. The training of a child should have that end in view. Any treatment of a child that is unkind and that purpose is unlikely to help him or anybody else.
We begin training children when they are born. Every experience they have comes by establishing a routine of life, of growth, of good habits in him. On that foundation we can build in him a character that will make him socially acceptable.
From the little one shows that he is discovering a self inside him, and we begin to help him control and direct that self to good ends. We teach him to obey whom we give him a direction because we know as yet he does not know what is safe for him to do and what is dangerous. In respect to the child, we should be aware of his growth in intelligence and cooperation, knowing that as the child grows his independence on us and that we must loosen our control of him. The low level of intelligence is the chief importance in child training.
Before giving a child a direction we should be sure that the child understands which affect his response and its consequences to him. In the case of the child, we should be sure that we are not only to him and to others concerned. To obedience with him. Will the consequences be pleasant? If any of these things are not clear, we should say so with the child.
