Recommendation for Government Reorganization

Under the Budget recommendations and proposals for changes in the state government are included in this final installment of the state legislative reform committee report on the government reorganization. The committee's report is published in this issue in a convenient form.

FIFTH INSTALLMENT Budget Recommendations

A government budget should answer one prime question: What is the government getting for their money? By law, the government is bound to submit its budget to the joint session of the senate and house of representatives, which should include the following information:

- (1) Part one of the message and budget should contain a fiscal budget including the government's recommendations regarding the fiscal policy for the coming biennium and showing the important items of the budget plan. This would prevent inflationary requests by department heads as they would first be compelled to justify need for the department's expenditures and the total anticipated income. It should also show the estimated expenditures and explain their significance.
- (2) Part two should present a general summary setting forth the aggregate figures of the budget so as to show the relation between the estimated expenditures and the total anticipated income. It should also show the estimated expenditures and explain their significance.
- (3) Part three should set forth the detailed data on past receipts and expenditures, the receipts and expenditures for the current year and the estimated receipts and expenditures for the next biennium. Such data should be supplemented with necessary explanatory schedules and captions.
- (4) Part four should describe the capital improvement program for the state and explain its relation to the proposed expenditure plan.
- (5) Part five should contain a list of the recommendations which are necessary to carry out the budget plan as well as the general fund and also list the estimated receipts and expenditures therefrom.

The chief executive alone is in a position to prepare a comprehensive, balanced budget program. He should be authorized to designate a chief executive to take the leadership in formulating the budget. This does not detract from the responsibility of the legislature in finally approving the budget plan. The governor's proposals are purely advisory.

Budget Control Needs

It is recommended by your committee that the legislature provide greater budgetary control of all both of the relations between the several divisions of government. For instance, the legislature should exercise budgetary control of the funds of:

- State highway department, by controlling sums appropriated for administration, engineering and construction;
- Rail and steam commission, by controlling sums appropriated for general operation; for fish propagation; for maintenance of bridges, and for dredging and new hatcheries; budgeting expenditures for propagation and fish propagation;
- State department, appropriating one lump sum from the general fund for the several functions of this department instead of numerous appropriations for each and every activity, also expressing in the budget and the appropriation bill how the appropriation may be expended and for what purpose.

The foregoing explanatory statements also apply to the University of Idaho, the College of Idaho and the State Normal School.

Department of Education

Your committee has given considerable thought to the appropriate division of responsibility for the administration of the various departments of education. This work is divided into four units, viz: department of education administration; school district organization; school development and grading; and finally, teaching and instruction. The combined expenditure of the four units totals \$40,304,871 for the school year July 1, 1927, to June 30, 1930. However, it is likely that the school program for 1929-30 will be discontinued during the year, and the program will be continued by the Peabody fund.

The report lists detailed expenses of \$134,918.60 for general administration; \$682,292 for school organization; \$499,033.73 for teachers' retirement; \$1,700,000 for pension; \$2,000,000 for curriculum development; and \$3,000,000 for building and equipment.

The monthly salary cost of administering these four divisions totals \$5,000,000 a year for a period of 20 years. This is a very large sum.

Your committee believes that consolidation and coordination is a factor in this program.

In addition to the superintendent of public instruction, an assistant superintendent, four directors, three auditors, six secretaries, eight clerical assistants, one school health representative and four "extra help" are needed to administer these divisions.
