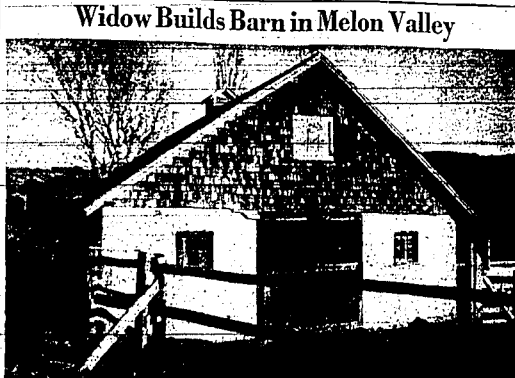

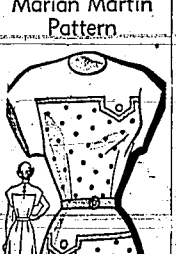

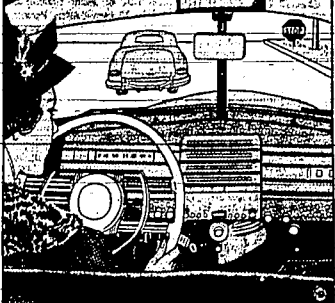

Water Purity Test Service Is Described

MOOSEW, Jan. 12.—If there is doubt in the Idaho homeowner's mind concerning the purity of his drinking water supply, he can have the water tested without expense.

Max C. Jensen, agricultural engineer at the University of Idaho, says the Idaho public health department gives the service free to citizens of the state.

Jensen explains that the state department gives two kinds of analyses for testing the water—one is test primarily for bacteria, the other for chemical content.

For the most part, the bacteria test is the important one to the home owner, and it is with this test that he can do his part in making the test both efficient and accurate.

Water for use that must be put in the department in specially sterilized containers which may be had from the health department upon request.

The homeowner must take every precaution to make sure the water goes into the container without contamination from improper handling.

Testing for water-borne bacteria is an analysis of the water and the wrong impression of the water source.

Chemical Test
The chemical analysis is not so important. Water for it can be sent to the department in any clean container that is at least a quart in size. Chemical analyses are desirable in cases where the water is excessively hard, or contains sulphur, iron, or other minerals. Influenza, typhoid, and cholera.

Localities Noted
Where the homeowner sends his water for bacteriological analysis depends on the part of the state in which he lives. Laboratories are established at the south central district health unit at Twin Falls, and other health units at Pocatello, Lewiston and Coeur d'Alene.

When the analysis indicates serious problems, the public health officer offers suggestions for correcting the difficulty.

Jensen suggests having all water tested when new wells are brought into use and re-testing when situations develop which may influence the purity of the water source.

Construction Dip Is Noted by City Official at Bureau

BOURNE, Jan. 12.—Thomas D. Smith, Thurston city clerk, has released a figure showing a total of 67 new residences and remodeling permits for the year 1944 as compared with 196 new and remodeling permits issued by the city in 1943.

There were 37 new residence permits with costs estimated at \$452,700 in 1944 as compared with 106 new permits issued in 1943, with estimated costs totaling \$561,000. Thirty permits were issued for remodeling as compared with 64 in 1943.

For business construction, 14 new business building permits were issued in 1944, with estimated costs totaling \$292,900, and 15 permits for remodeling business buildings were issued for cost \$440,000, making a total of \$732,900 for business improvements last year.

In 1944, 11 new business construction called for an expenditure of \$273,500, with 12 remodeling permits estimated to cost \$112,145, or a total of \$385,645 in 1944.

Grand totals reach \$747,235 in 1944 with 196 new permits, with \$210,474 expended in 1943 for 153 permits.

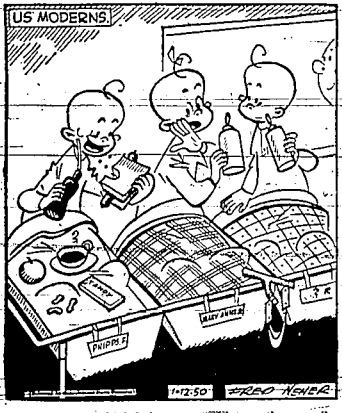

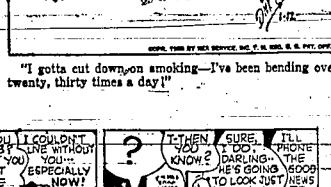

Labor Regime Fully Revises Life in Britain

Editor's note: Prime Minister Chamberlain has announced a general election will be held in October. In that election, British reaction will be the chief factor in the outcome of the United States election. The Chamberlain government has a power base now which will allow it to change the world's political map.

Britain has had five years of economic and social change. The Prime Minister Clement R. Attlee and his labor government have changed irrevocably the British way of life. Not even a conservative victory in this year's general election will bring back the former Britain.

It has been a five-year revolution, albeit a peaceful one. Probably in no similar period in British history has the social basis of the nation's life been altered so completely.

Unparalleled Security
The socialists have brought the British nation unparalleled security from womb to tomb. But they have made him pay for it with the heaviest taxes in the western world and "hemmed him in" with restrictions on his freedom in these enlightened days outside totalitarian countries.

The benevolent government interests itself in the citizen even before birth. If a prospective mother wishes to help balance the family budget, she gets \$5 a week for 13 weeks— including before and after the birth. She gets an additional \$1.20 a special birth grant.

A non-working housewife also gets a grant of \$1.20, plus \$2.00 a week for four weeks.

No Doctor Worries
No mother and indeed no Briton need worry about doctor or hospital bills. Under the controversial national health care, medical care at home or in the hospital is free. Mothers also get free orange juice for the government for their babies.

For each child after her first, a mother gets an extra 70 cents a week until the child becomes of age. The government also insures all Britons for unemployment, injury, sickness and retirement. Every widow gets a pension for up to 13 weeks if she is under 50 years of age. If she is older, she gets it for the rest of her life. If she has children, an augmented pension begins at once.

Free Teeth, Spectacles
If any Briton needs false teeth, spectacles, a couple or even a hot water bottle, he gets them free under the national health plan.

At death, the government contributes \$50 toward his burial expenses. To support this gigantic welfare program, the government taxes all incomes over \$378 a year at a basic rate of 40 per cent and a sliding scale of surtaxes.

A married man with two children earning \$2,000 a year pays an annual tax of \$584. If he earned \$22,000, he would pay \$17,171. A single man earning the same salaries would pay \$742 and \$17,257 respectively.

Payroll Cut Heavy
Then there are special payroll deductions of up to 70 cents a week for every worker to help pay the cost of the national health insurance and assistance plans, sales taxes ranging from 25 to 100 per cent, inheritance taxes ranging from 1 to 75 per cent, and assorted taxes on beer, liquor and entertainment.

This high taxation, along with the welfare state program and the wartime "boom" in the lower-bracket wages have carried Britain a long way toward the socialist goal of equality. The number of Britons with net incomes above \$420 a year has more than doubled since 1929. Those earning \$14 to \$28 a week has nearly trebled. But persons with an income after taxes of \$200 or more have dropped 25 per cent. Fewer than 900 persons now earn more than \$1,000 a year after taxes and only 15 earn more than \$17,000.
