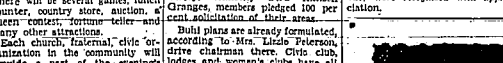

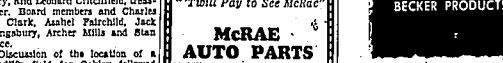

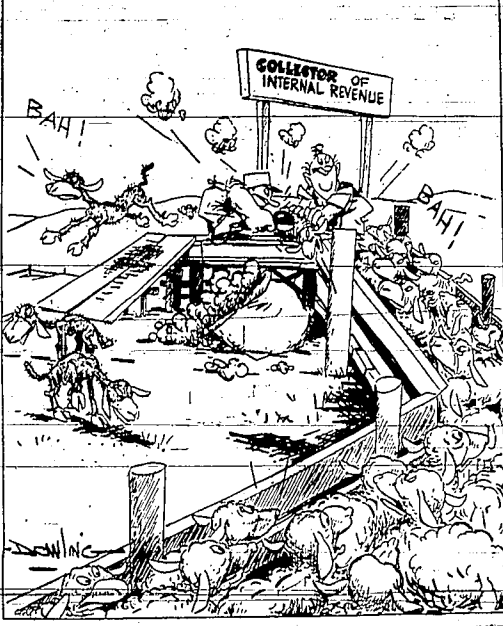

### Gain Noted in State Jobs, New Business

BOISE, Jan. 13 (UP)—Idaho today was faced with a paradoxical economic situation—increasing unemployment and a steady growth of new business.

Executive Director H. F. Garrett of the state employment security agency said there were 73 new businesses in Idaho during December, 1943, making a total of 13,195 covered employers at the end of the year. The total represents an increase of 372 over the number of employers covered by the agency at the end of 1942.

Meanwhile, unemployment insurance claims for December totaled 7,341, compared with 7,200 in December, 1942, and 7,223 in the same month of 1941. The total for the first six months of the year of 1944 was 40,932, compared with 40,242 for the same period of 1943 and 43,111 in 1942.

Weekly total for the first seven days of 1944 showed 1723 initial claims for unemployment insurance were filed with the employment security agency. This compared with 1,606 during the first week of 1943. The state paid out \$43,892 in benefits to jobless workers for the week ending Jan. 7, 1944, as compared with \$37,111 in 1943.

But the employment security fund continued to show gains in spite of the heavy drain, Garrett pointed out. "The balance at the end of December, 1943, was \$23,062,913, compared with \$24,009,403 at the previous year."

### Haircut for Cow Urged by Expert

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO—Moscow, Jan. 13—A haircut for the milk cow is a good way of putting a permanent shine on the milk check.

O. C. Anderson, dairy husbandman for the University of Idaho extension service, observed this week clean cows produce clean milk, he said. Clipping cows when they are in winter quarters not only helps to keep up quality of the milk but cuts down the time that must be spent in cleaning them before milking.

### Tax Proposal Discussed by Hailey Group

HAILEY, Jan. 12—Discussed at the first meeting of the Chamber of Commerce this year were the proposed state withholding tax program, plans to plant trees here and several committee reports.

An argument for the withholding tax proposal is that it would reach transient workers now paying no state income tax.

Disadvantages cited against the proposal was the argument that many workers do not earn the federal withholding tax and that most each year carry balances every penny of his earnings himself there will be little interest in change affecting tax problems.

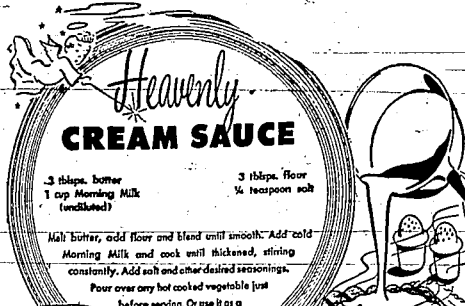
