## Additional Snow Adds To Trouble Continues

Additional heavy snowfalls began to hit transportation facilities in Magic Valley, both helping and hurting the highway situation. Several more schools closed, others were operating part-time and some reopened. School officials termed them a blessing in reducing the hazard of drifting snow re-clogging roads, but in the Strevell area rain froze on the highway making it nearly impossible for heavy vehicles to remain on the road surface.

### \$1,000,000 Cash Loot by Bandits Spurs Nationwide Hunt for Men

BOSTON, Jan. 18 (AP)—Crack FBI agents joined today in a manhunt for a bandit gang that got away with \$1,000,000—a million dollars of it in cash—in one of the biggest robberies in the nation's history.

Working smoothly, the robbers escaped last night without leaving a single clue. Hours later, Police Sgt. Edward J. Fallon said "we have little or nothing to work on."

Eight suspects were being held but police officials indicated they had little chance of pinning them down. All except one are ex-convicts, and one is a lawyer. The seven still-escaped men have other names—left behind because their hands were covered like a movie thriller, they were given six locked doors to restrain them. A money transporter, a firm, a newspaper, five cashiers and guards before they could reach Hunt, were shot.

An alarm giving descriptions of the men was sounded about the city police board. One of the men's names was given. The FBI agents across the country were told to look for the men. Bank funds were included in the loot.

### Blaze Flares In Colorado; 2 Die, 3 Lost

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo., Jan. 18 (AP)—Fire broke up again today in the savaged south, where here a gas-stove, brush fire took two soldiers dead and three others injured.

The blaze, started early yesterday, spread over more than 30 square miles, burning a strip of business district. It burned much of the east-front of Cheyenne building, damaged the palatial homes in the Broadwood district and ran across several dirt prairie near to Fountain, Colo.
