Minimum Pay Becomes Law Jan. 25

MINOTON, Jan. 19 (AP)—A minimum wage law will go into effect Jan. 25. That is the date when the national law goes from 40 to 75 cents per hour into effect.

Pressure Location of Idaho Highways, High Engineering Costs Criticized in Road Report

...of engineering and construction are covered in this installment of a series of reports on the highway program. The first report, published in the January 13 issue, dealt with the location of the highways. This report deals with the engineering and construction costs of the highways.

HIGHWAY LOCATION AND DESIGN

Much of the highway system in Idaho was built to standards which were considered satisfactory under traffic conditions which existed years ago. It is now being found that many of these standards are inadequate for present-day transportation. Design capacity and severance affect the safe and free movement of traffic. Inadequate standards, restricted bridge width, poor drainage, insufficient base materials, low-type surfacing, steep grades, sharp curves, and short sight distances.

Included among the elements of cost which enter into preliminary engineering expenditures are travel and subsistence payments. Auto Changes For 1950 Are Mostly Minor

The 1950 automobile, of almost every American manufacturer, is basically the 1949 model. Changes in appearance are confined to the front end and rear ends of new cars exhibited to date, and engineering changes are, as a rule, just improvements.

Body and appearance, Studebaker presents the most radical change yet noticed. The hood, based on the airplane-type air scoops does away with the conventional grille for the first time in popular American cars. And other manufacturers have recognized the American desire for revenues and have made grille changes to mark their 1950 cars as "new."

Grille emphasized. The Buick engineer, who is eliminating the grille, has emphasized it by making it heavier and extending it over the bumper. Chrysler, Dodge, Plymouth, DeSoto and Pontiac all have heavier grilles. Pontiac, along with Ford, has extended the grille around the fenders for increased chrome. Many cars have incorporated head parking and fog lights into a block unit in the fenders.

At the rear of the new cars, the rule seems to be longer and higher fenders. Studebaker, Oldsmobile and Buick have emphasized rear fender lines in this manner. Rear windows run larger in Chrysler, DeSoto and Oldsmobile models. Changes in the trunk include new handles and counterbalanced springs for easier opening on many models.

Minor changes. Chevrolet, Buick and Oldsmobile have put out one model each which looks like a convertible, but is actually a hard-top coupe. Dodge station wagons now have a rear seat which folds into a floor, making an eight-foot carrying space. Cadillac has not yet announced its new models, but it is expected to have a greatly changed style and an extension of models to invade lower-priced class.
