Twin Falls Will Remain "Dry," Residents Decide by 339-Ballot Margin in Second Special Vote

Twin Falls will remain "dry" local voters decided by a 339-vote majority Tuesday. The final count was 2,227 to 1,088 according to unofficial totals released by poll officials of the city's three wards. The total vote was 4,085, with 21 ballots discarded for varied rule infractions. A time of 6,018 votes was eligible. Hindered by bad weather, the election failed to draw the number voting in the June 17, 1947, election. At that time the liquor-by-the-drink proposition was defeated by a 662-vote margin. The final count was 2,767 for the "drys" and 2,115 for the "wets."
