## Idaho National Guard's First Air Arm Perfects Gunnery in Winter Practice

### Desert South of Glens Ferry Is Used for Gunnery Practice

BOISE, Jan. 27 (Special)—The desert south of Glens Ferry and east of Mountain Home is echoing these days to the whine of F-31 fighter planes and the chatter of 50 caliber machine-guns. The 190th fighter squadron of the Idaho national guard, an 84-day force in defense of the Pacific northwest, is working constantly on the improvement of its air-to-air gunnery. And, for this phase of the squadron's combat training, the government provided the squadron with the wartime Sator creek gunnery range, where air force gunners sharpened their aim for the fighting in Europe and Asia during the conflict. Occasionally, the range resembles to the crump-bang of bombs and the shriek of rockets, but for the remainder of the winter, most of the squadron's flying strategy will be concentrated on air-to-air gunnery. In this phase of training, a plane dives behind it a long black banner, and flashes of the fighters, taking off from the 190th base at Gowen field in Boise, intercept the lone plane and sweep down on the target. Gunnery passes at the target are executed as they would be in combat, and while diving in on the banner, the pilot is running off in his mind the intricate calculations necessary to get the proper sight on the "prey."

### Capital Scribe Says Truman To Run Again

OKLAHOMA CITY, Jan. 27.—A prediction that President Truman will run for reelection in 1936, possibly against Gov. Dwight D. Eisenhower, came last night from Jack Bell, political writer for the Associated Press in Washington.

"All signs at present point to Truman as likely to run again," Bell said in an address at the annual mid-winter meeting of the Oklahoma Press association.

"On the Republican side, it looks as if the battle for the presidential nomination might be waged among Sen. Robert A. Taft of Ohio, Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower and Harold D. Ickes, president of the University of Pennsylvania.

"If the Republicans come down to 1933 in a politically disparate frame of mind, they will be more likely to nominate Eisenhower than somebody like Taft.

"Nobody knows whether Eisenhower is a Republican or a Democrat, but his attacks on the concentration of governmental power in Washington have been such as to encourage the Republicans to believe he is one of them."

Bell, a former Oklahoman, told the publishers that if Truman does not run again, the best Democratic presidential possibilities appear to be Chief Justice Vinson, Secretary of State Acheson and Secretary of Defense Johnson.
