### Airmail Stamp Use Is Urged By Postoffice

The use of airmail stamps for letters sent airmail rather than the use of two three-cent stamps was urged today by W. Frank, Twin Falls postmaster.

"It is true that three three-cent stamps are required to pay the postage on a letter sent by airmail," he said "but the value of airmail to the community is measured by the postoffice department on the basis of airmail stamps only."

He pointed out that "the government may very well determine that airmail service is not necessary of the community if the number of airmail stamps sold is small."

The cause of continued service by airmail, which must soon become a case to the government which it should continue to operate, was urged by Frank to the use of airmail stamps purchases. He said the airmail now carries a heavy weight of mail, but the airmail indicated by present stamp sale. ### Teachers' Air '50 Problems Of Retirement

Teachers' retirement in Idaho and its legislative aspects were discussed by the local Idaho Education Association at a meeting held at the Twin Falls high school at 4:15 p. m. Monday.

W. H. Winters presided over the meeting and minutes of the previous meeting were read by Mrs. Winona O'Leary. A social dinner was served and will be scheduled within the next few days by the club, according to Mrs. Lora Cookburn, social committee chairman.

Chairman of the legislative committee of the PTA and I. A. Orah, said, spoke on legislative aspects of the teacher retirement program and led the discussion which followed. He stressed that because the retirement laws were passed originally by the legislature upon the demand of the people, it is necessary to have their support in the continuation of the program. He stated that if the legislature does not act favorably in this special session the retirement law will be repealed.

All states provide teacher retirement laws and the number of states which do so is increasing. He said that other states have failed to meet their obligation to make the system remain in Idaho and become trained to teach in this state. He said "it was not out of the goodness of the state that the legislature on re-consideration, but because there was sufficient interest and pressure brought to bear by the people."

He emphasized that Idaho has provided a good teacher retirement law. But the present law is not sufficient to meet the needs of the children and the welfare of the state. He said that the state must make full obligation the retirement law and make it a sound basis.
