NEW YORK, Feb. 13 (AP)—The world heavyweight champion was sprawled out, apparently helpless, in the laps of front row newsmen. Can he make it? Will he be able to return to the ring before the fatal 30 seconds are tolled? A bomb had sent him catapulting through the ropes and out of the ring.

The \$20,000 speculators, who jam-packed the Polo grounds, sat dumbstruck at first. Then, to a man, the huge crowd sprang to its feet, all with the same thought. Can he make it? Will he be able to return to the ring before the fatal 30 seconds are tolled? A bomb had sent him catapulting through the ropes and out of the ring.

It started out in a blaze of action and ended the same way. The 2 to 1 knockout of the Argentine, a powerful, unskilled pugilist, gave the huge throng in his first thrill by smashing the champion to the Argentine's knees shortly after the round opened.

How he made it—by his own power or with the helpful shove of newsmen—will remain a subject of controversy for years to come.
