

President Recalls Coal Fact-Finder Board for Parley

From UP and AP Reports.
WASHINGTON, Feb. 14.—President Truman today reconvened the national board to help in new negotiations with the soft coal operators and John L. Lewis.
The board, headed by Director Cyrus S. Ching, announced the board's action. Ching said he and David L. Cole, chairman of the three-man board, may sit in on some of the bargaining sessions which resume here tomorrow at 11 a.m. EST.
Ching said in a statement he and Cole will keep in close touch with the new bargaining sessions "in order that we may be in a position to assist the practices and to keep the President currently informed."
"Either singly or jointly, we shall attend such meetings," Ching said, "in our judgment, we will make a contribution to the settlement of the dispute."
At present, Ching said, neither he nor Cole intends to take part in tomorrow's bargaining session.
The fact-finding board reported to President Truman on Saturday that the coal operators and John L. Lewis are in a "bitter" fight for the national health and safety.
"In the coal contract, no work will be done until the coal is produced in all major coal producing states. Hundreds of miles of roads, highways and bridges will be closed."
The West Virginia coal association said some 100 miners in the United Mine Workers' district 17 in Ohio, West Virginia and Kentucky are on strike.
The coal strike situation is unfavorable to the coal operators, Illinois, Utah, Alabama and West Virginia among the larger producing states.

Peas for Hanging Rejected by Judge; Youth Is Relieved

BURLEY, Feb. 14.—District Judge Hugh A. Baker this morning sentenced Neale Butterfield, 16, Hyburn, to "confinement for the balance of his natural life" for the first degree murder of a 7-year-old child, Gladys Joyce Birkholz, last Nov. 16.
The state had sought the death penalty. Butterfield and his mother were visibly relieved at the sentence. They clasped hands briefly. Prosecuting Attorney A. H. Nielson sat erect in his chair until sentence was passed—then he slumped.

Tension mounted in the packed courtroom after Judge Baker announced he would tolerate no demonstration, and while Butterfield stood nervously before the judge for a 15-minute review of the legal aspects of the case. Spectators sighed when sentence was passed.

Whisked to Boise
After the hearing, Butterfield was immediately whisked into a waiting station car for his trip to the state penitentiary at Boise. As he came from the courtroom, he was wearing handcuffs. A crowd of boys started the trip.

After reading a 45-minute statement giving his reasons for not invoking the death penalty, Judge Baker stated that he had consulted with the county, spiritual advisers, relatives and officers of the court.

Reorganization Given New Setback in State

BOISE, Feb. 14 (AP)—Idaho's state senate slapped down another major proposal of its committee on governmental reorganization.

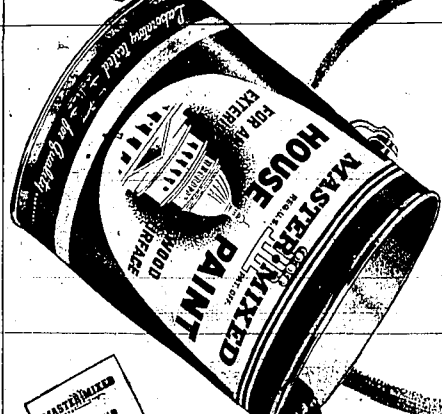

"Soil management is extremely important in relation to conservation and prevention of erosion," said Letterman, district conservationist for the soil conservation service, in commenting Tuesday upon a series of tillage meetings scheduled in Magic Valley the next three days.

The speaker is O. R. McDole, Portland, OCS regional engineer. He is familiar with southern Idaho irrigated lands through spending several years with the University of Idaho as extension soils specialist. He has had many years of experience in soil and soil management.

McDole's schedule includes appearances at the Wendell high school at 8 p. m. Wednesday, the Haxton high school at 8 p. m. Thursday and the courthouse in Jerome at 2 p. m. Friday.

Sponsoring the meetings are the Gooding Soil Conservation district, Kenneth King, supervisor for the Wendell area, and the North Blaine Soil Conservation district, assisted by the Beat Growers' warehouse, Lions club and Barlow warehouse, all Haxton.

Don't Erode Easily

Jones pointed out soils high in organic matter and with good tilth do not erode as easily as soils which are broken down and finely pulverized. Proper tillage and tillage methods particularly are important on sandy soils subject to wind erosion.

The tillage and management of soils in connection with crop rotation, good irrigation and other conservation practices are important in maintaining maximum production on irrigated land without loss of soil by wind and water erosion, the district conservationist emphasized.

"You can face the possibility of loss of your insurance when it expires because it may not be in force when you get around to making application for a converted policy or renewal," he explained.


