Widman said he would be glad to see the administration today of the Republican 80th congress.

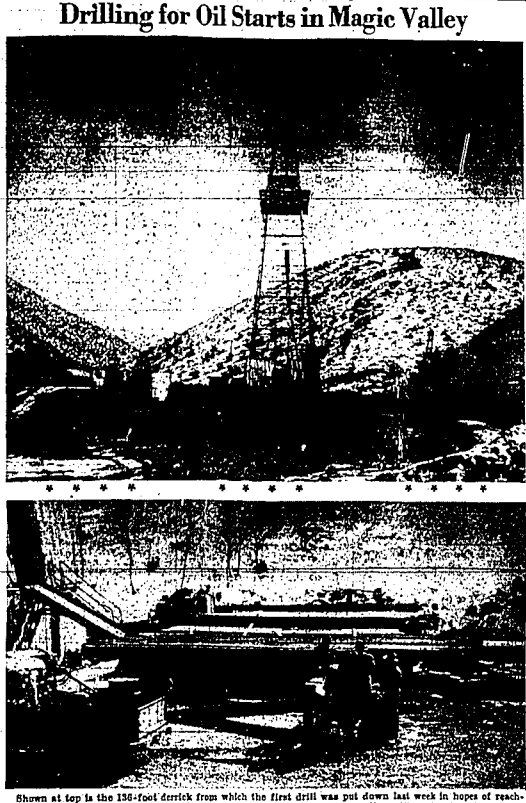

Oil Well Drilling Operations Inspected By Group at Cassia County Boundary

BURLEY, Feb. 15—Burley Chamber of Commerce members, while on a tour to view oil drilling operations east of Malad, were given a lesson in lively chamber activities by one of the youngest community groups in the state, the Haft River Chamber of Commerce.

Malad, with a population of about 400, is the largest community in the valley, but the chamber boasts a membership of 35, and they're all "active." Some of the members drive miles over rough country roads to attend meetings, coming from Juniper, Dublitt, Idaho, Strevell and Bridge.

Working on its most current project, the construction of a good road into oil drilling areas east of Malad, the Haft River Chamber of Commerce invited members of the Burley chamber to visit the drilling site and check on the possibility of improving a 12-mile section of road which would cut the distance of hauling supplies to the oil well from 65 miles to 20 miles. At present, all supplies must be trucked in from Malad City, to the south-west.

The drilling operations are being done by Phillips 66 corporation, with the present well located in Cassia county, just three miles from the Cassia line and approximately 30 miles southeast of Malad. The drilling site is in a canyon east of the base of Black Flies mountain.

Construction of the derrick started shortly after Christmas, chamber members were told, after considerable explorative geological surveys were made. The steel derrick is 130 feet high and 20 feet square at the base.

The petroleum company has two other pits slated for drill operations in the near future, one near the Haft reservoir and the other on Gold Springs creek, both in Cassia county.

Malad Chamber of Commerce members pointed out that there is already a good road up through the Haft River valley, but the remaining 12-mile stretch of road to the drill site needs to be widened and graded over Meadow creek pass. During good weather the 12-mile section is usable, but during the winter the pass is clogged with snow. Better construction would make it a year-around road, they said.

In promoting the road project, the Haft river area people feel that the entire valley would profit by making a closer road available into the drilling area.

All equipment has been transported from Malad to the site, and water is being hauled from Shovelville by transport trucks. 24,000 gallons per day. The company sank two wells, 225 feet deep and 123 feet deep, but reached no water. A total of 13,000 gallons of water are used each day, with the balance being stored in reserve.

The drilling is made with a 122½-inch diameter bore-hole, and no specific depth is expected, although the workmen report they are equipped to go down 10,000 to 14,000 feet in search of a producing kintiva.

Up the derrick 90 feet is a house-sized unit where a crew works to the new sections of drill before it is dropped. The first drill was put down last week.

Forest Roads Building Plan Is Drawn up

BOISE, Feb. 15 (AP)—A \$1,500,000 forest road construction program in Idaho has been mapped by state and federal officials.

L. M. Huggins, district engineer of the bureau of public roads office here, said the program will be submitted to Washington, D. C., for approval. Action at the nation's capital is expected in about six weeks.

Idaho has been apportioned a little more than \$2,000,000 for the forest road program this fiscal year, but administration and maintenance costs will reduce to \$1,750,000 the amount available for new construction.

Huggins said numerous delegations from throughout the state appeared yesterday to testify in behalf of road projects in their areas.

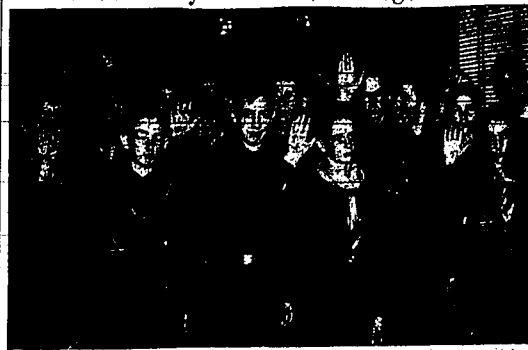

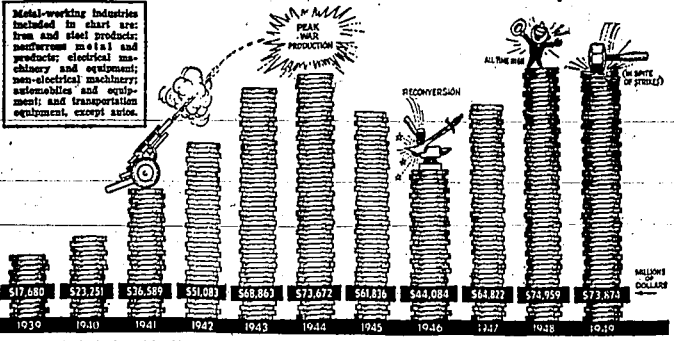

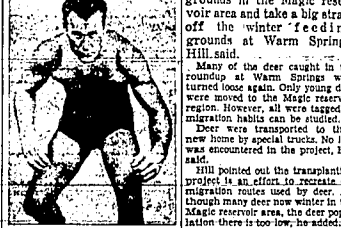

Bird That Sings Under Water Doesn't Mind Frigid Weather

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Moscow, Feb. 15 - There's one native Idahoan that hasn't done a bit of squawking about the cold weather; the thermometer is 30 below zero or 30 above is a little gray bird, the water ouzel. "I've seen one on that creek," Burleigh recalls. "It plunged into the water, walked around on the bottom while it got something to eat. Then it came out and hopped up on an ice-covered rock. With a hiss and hawking all around that little bird sang as cheerfully as any meadowlark does when the flowers begin to bloom." Even ice sheets on streams don't bother the water ouzel. "Being an underwater feeder, it walks along the bottom of the stream to pick up water insects. It even 'flies' through the water. It cruises around under the ice until it finds an opening to come out. Under waterfalls is a favorable nesting place. Nests are built of

moist, wet green and fresh by the perpetual spray. Later the water ouzel has found that underneath the many bridges man has built across the mountain streams are good nesting spots, although waterfalls still are preferred. "I have seen these birds dart straight through a waterfall to their nests," Burleigh declares. The university bird man figures that every one of Idaho's swirling mountain streams has some of these unusually hardy birds. "They do not like placid water, either on rivers or lakes. Nothing but tumbling streams appeals to them. "Water ouzels have a tough, waterproof covering of feathers just like a duck," Burleigh explains. "That is why they can be wholly indifferent to temperature."

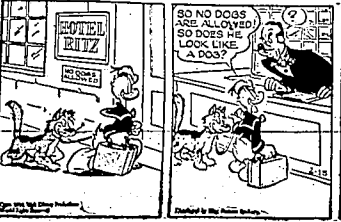

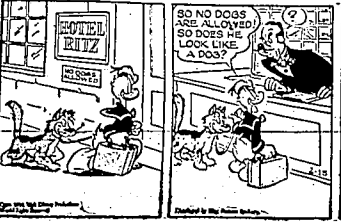

Russians Sign 30-Year Pact With Chinese

MOSECOV, Feb. 14 (AP)—The Soviet union and communist China signed a 30-year alliance in the Kremlin last night and came to understand on Manchuria.

Each has taken the Russians agreed to grant the Chinese a \$300,000,000 credit with which to buy heavy equipment from the Soviet union.

The agreement was concluded after 60 days of negotiations. Prime Minister Stalin and Foreign Minister Andrei V. Vishinsky participated in the talks for Russia with Chinese Communist Leader Mao Tse-Tung and his premier and Foreign Minister Chou En-Lai.

The news was made public by the Moscow radio a few hours after the principals affixed their signatures to the documents. Chou said: "Only the imperialists and warmongers will assume an attitude of hate toward this treaty and the agreement."

The unity of the peoples of China and the Soviet union, which number about 700,000,000, is a unity which is impossible to defeat. Vishinsky characterized the agreement as the "great step toward the cause of strengthening peace and democracy in the whole world."

The Soviet union has agreed to grant the Chinese (southern Manchurian railway and to withdraw her armies from Port Arthur, a Manchurian city.

Russia has further agreed to grant a large long-term credit to China for the purchase of railway and industrial equipment.

Finally the two sides have signed a treaty of alliance, friendship and mutual aid.

These various vital agreements brought to an end the Chinese-Soviet negotiations which began when Chou, arrived in Moscow in mid-December just prior to Generalissimo Stalin's 70th birthday.

They also bring to a formal end the treaties signed between Russia and the Chinese nationalists on the subjects on August 14, 1945. The American diplomatic colony had gone to bed before the news was released and was not available for comment.

Western diplomats here had expected the agreement but no western experts had suggested that they might be as sweeping as those which actually have been signed.

There was no suggestion, for instance, that the USSR might be in agreement with the Chinese relinquish Port Arthur or the Changchun railway or return property acquired after the war in World War II.

Hank Wants to Aid Old Buddy At Fantastic Spot for Fishing

After reading Dave Newell's story in the Feb. 13 issue of the Evening Post entitled, "I Make a Living Doing What I Like," I drove over to Homosassa Springs, Fla., to talk to Hank Newell if he could use me.

I hadn't seen the former editor of the Florida Sportsman for many years but I will recall that last year we were at a fishing lodge in the Florida Keys.

He was quite friendly and I used to entertain him at night by sitting on the front porch and calling out to him from the trees.

I wrote a story about his ability to make a living doing what he wanted to do and visit him, and I must have gotten 100 letters calling me a liar.

But it was the truth, so help me, and what I found him doing a few days ago undoubtedly will get me another 100 letters of the same sort. But it's also the truth.

Dave surprised me to see him on a tarpon that weighed exactly one-half ounce. I know the weight because that because I weighed him myself on postal scales.

The little cuss was about the size of my little finger and Dave, who has caught just about every kind of fish in his time, and hunted everything from Great Horned Owls to jaguars in Brazil, is prouder of that tiny tarpon. I think that of any other fish or animal he ever caught or shot.

He caught the tarpon, which he believes to be the smallest ever hauled in, on a No. 14 trout fly and a No. 12 leader.

I asked Dave what sort of board he was going to mount his baiter on and he said he thought he'd use either an alarm clock or a special delivery.

He asked how long he had to fight the tarpon before bringing him to gaff, Dave said almost three seconds of fierce fighting took place before his savage catch was in the boat.

As he explained in his Post article, Dave now is part owner and operator of nature's giant fish bowl in Homosassa Springs, a fantastic place if there ever was one. The springs are 55 feet deep, and flow better than 8,000 gallons of crystal clear water per hour. It is the source of the Homosassa river, which runs nine miles into the Gulf of Mexico.

For a reason no one has been able to explain, thousands of fish of every variety swim up the salt water gulf to the fresh water pool and stay there the year round. The pool is jam-packed with fish all the time. The Homosassa river affords magnificent fishing and it is possible to anchor your boat near where the gulf and the fresh water meet and catch a salt water fish on one side of the boat and a fresh water fish on the other.

That sounds like a fish story, but it is a true one. If you ever come down the west coast of Florida don't miss nature's giant fish bowl. For sheer, unspooled natural beauty Florida has nothing to match it. And for your information, just a mile away from Newell's place is the Homosassa springs hotel, run by Vic and Olan Johnson. For comfort and out-of-this-world eating, it can't be beaten anywhere. After the first meal Jean always took a notebook

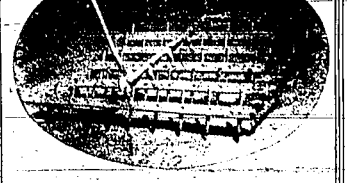
