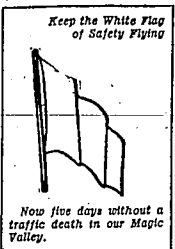

WASHINGTON, Feb. 17.—At least one government loan program is going begging. Last spring the Indian bureau made available \$100,000 to the Navaho tribe to be loaned to tribal members to purchase improved milk goats.

The Navaho wanted none of it. All summer the tribe's advisory council tried to persuade Indians to borrow goat money. It didn't receive a single application.

The story of the goat loan fund was told to the house appropriations committee by Albert Huber, assistant chief of the Indian bureau branch of extension and credit. It was made public today.

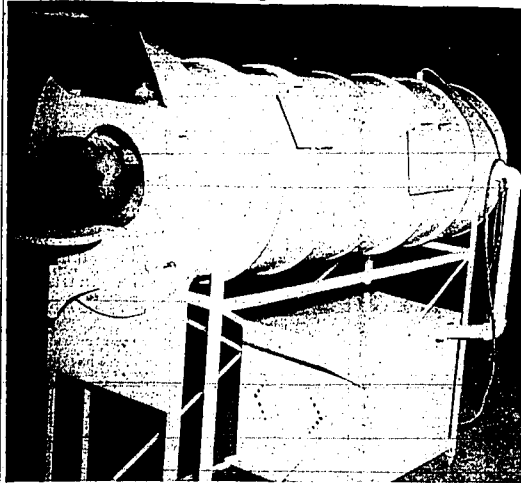

# Filer Man Builds Iron Lung; Donates It for Magic Valley

FILER, Feb. 17—A locally-made iron lung, for use in all of Magic Valley, has been donated to the city of Filer by its maker, Willard Herrett, operator of the Acme Machine shop here.

The idea of making such a lung came to Herrett last year after he had seen a lung in action in New York City and had read several articles on its operation. Putting together what he learned through the articles and what he already knew about the effects of pressure on the human body, he set to work on his active deep-sea diving, he began to work on the iron lung at his shop in October.

He made the body tube by welding together two 50-gallon oil drums, set it up on a frame made of simple angle-irons and made the lung breathe through the use of an air pump and rotary valve.

Herrett describes the lung as a simple machine, but there is not a single nature missing in the machine. The patient is protected from rapid change of cycle because Herrett membered to put a 17-foot hose on the valve to make any change take place gradually.

An electric light inside the body tube provides both a means of heating and a light for an attendant who must reach inside to change dressings. A window in the top allows the attendant to see his work while changing dressings. An adjustable headrest and mirror provide comfort and aid in the patient and careful fittings of rubber make the machine's operation air-tight.

### Seed Growing Considered at Class Meeting

**TWIN FALLS, Feb. 17** — O. Coors, chairman, speaking to the Jerome veterans agriculture classes at their regular Wednesday night meeting, said production of good quality seed is an important part of farming.

"Idaho Valley has ideal climate and growing conditions for many seeds. These seeds are sold through-out the world and this market can be increased with high quality seed," Coors explained.

"The farmers and seed companies must work closely together, both doing an excellent job, if each is to have a product that could be bought and sold profitably. Maximum returns can be obtained only if high quality seeds are grown and properly processed," he continued.

Some of the factors which Coors outlined for successful seed growing are:

1. Select a seed crop that will fit in with your own program.
2. Be sure you have the proper soil conditions, equipment, labor and market for the seed to be grown.
3. Do not plant a "long-shot" crop unless you are able to take the risk. Investigate all the hazards that might be involved in growing the crop.
4. Prepare an excellent seed crop on clean land. Seed, cultivate, care for, harvest and handle each operation of production with utmost care. Detailed and precision farming are necessary for good, clean seed production.
5. Rogue out foreign plants from the seed field. A few dollars spent on roguing may pay large dividends in the final value of the crop.
6. Be sure you have a good, clean, production-of-seed-to-be-sold-to-specify-if-it-is-to-be-for-seed-production. Choules concluded by stating that any company would be glad to discuss with the farmer his individual problems and help him to choose the right crop for his conditions.

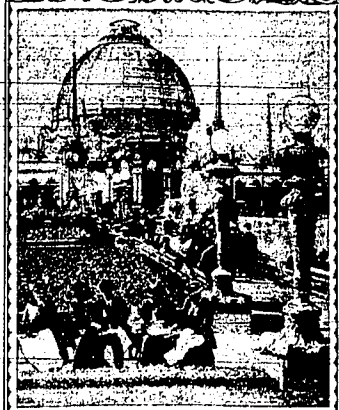

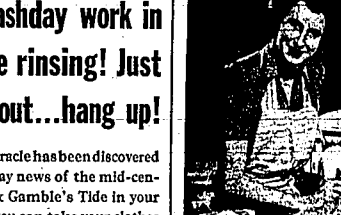

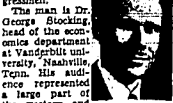

### Select Group of Solons Hears Lecture By Expert on Evils of 'Basing Points'

 WASHINGTON, Feb. 17 (Special)—One of the nation's top authorities on freight rates and basing point systems delivered a lecture on the inherent economic evils of basing points to a select group of congressmen and pressmen.



The man is Dr. George Blockley, head of the economics department at Vanderbilt University, Nashville, Tenn. His audience represented a large part of the western and southern sections of the United States—areas which have suffered traditionally from the economic discrimination of basing points.

Interest in Dr. Blockley's comments was intensified by the fact that both Senate and House have passed legislation legalizing delivery pricing and freight absorption practices and the bill is now being reported out of committee.

Characterized by its opponents as "steel" and cement company bills, the legislation is now running a neck and neck race with a supreme court case concerning pricing policies of the Standard Oil company.

Proponents of the bill hope to enact it into law before the supreme court hands down a decision in the Standard Oil case. Opponents are trying to stall conference so the coast will have a chance to clarify the whole matter without having to take into account a new law which would automatically justify the Standard Oil position.

In this setting, Dr. Blockley gave the members of congress a short course in economics and lashed out at basing point practices as "systems which have not worked out for the good of the American people nor the free enterprise system."

The old "Pittsburgh plus" system of pricing all steel no matter where it originated at the Pittsburgh selling price plus freight rate from Pittsburgh to the buyer's factory was outlawed by the federal trade commission in 1924 because of consumer protests, Dr. Blockley explained.

This led to adoption of multiple basing points throughout the country, or zone price systems, or freight equalization practices. All of these, however, maintained the base price for steel products high enough that a high-cost Pittsburgh manufacturer could absorb freight charges and sell his steel on the west coast or Birmingham, Ala., at the same price as the low-cost Seattle, San Fran-

isco or Birmingham products. Until 1928 Pittsburgh was the basing point for west coast buyers, Dr. Blockley said. Later Birmingham became the nearest point of supply but quoted base prices included transportation costs from Birmingham. This resulted in a situation where a Pittsburgh steel producer was able to move into the west coast market without even the profits offered by San Francisco and Seattle steel producers.

Blockley said that western users are 25 per cent higher than to eastern consumers, Blockley estimated.

In analyzing all steel purchases and deliveries made during one month in 1929, Dr. Blockley found that because of the equal pricing system there was no incentive for a buyer in St. Louis to purchase steel from a producer across the street rather than a firm in Pittsburgh or Birmingham. As a result of this situation St. Louis steel producers, although capable of supplying the needs throughout their immediate area, actually supplied less than 20 per cent of the steel used by St. Louis fabricators.

The remaining 80 per cent of their production was sold to buyers located elsewhere—some even in Pittsburgh itself. Similarly, west coast and mountain steel manufacturers got only

five per cent of the business in their own region. Admittedly, Dr. Blockley said, the west coast steel plants may not have sufficient capacity to meet all demands of west coast purchasers, but the important point is that under such pricing practices there is no incentive for them to expand and attempt to meet their local needs.

"In general," he stated, "a purchaser's knowledge that he operates under a pricing system which enables his integrated companies to get into his market at no disadvantage to themselves discourages him from expanding his output."

Blockley gave as his view that some freight absorption to carry competition into neighboring areas was inevitable in a healthy free economy.

"But," he emphasized, "systematic use of basing points extracts a higher price from nearly all buyers and this unduly burdens fabricators who could otherwise produce and sell more cheaply. And the system demands a lot of 'cooperation' which may or may not be compulsory, among steel producers."

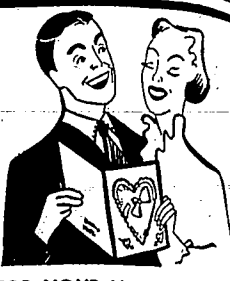
### Check Mailed to Community Chest

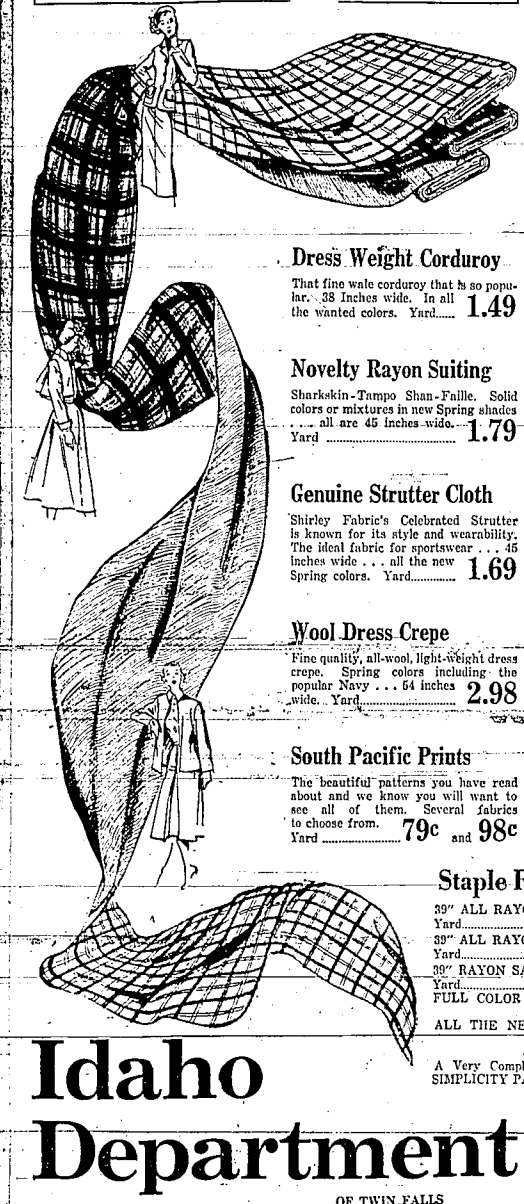
