WASHINGTON—According to strategy that has been ascribed as a brazen defiance of the law and expansion of the power of the federal government over the interior and rural electrification administration have concocted a scheme that will result in the ownership of the nation's electric generating plants and transmission lines under a government plan.

The device, which represents a greater step toward power by federal control than has been dreamed of, is being used to circumvent the existing law and to avoid the need for approval of the Supreme Court by President Truman, who is the author of the plan. The scheme, announced by the National Electric Association, is a plan to take the matter already in effect, a power system gridironing the union will fall into federal hands by indirect means.

Oddly enough, the first experiment has been made in the home state of President Truman and in the district represented by Clarence Cannon, the energetic chairman of the house appropriations committee. He forced approval of a plan for \$44,000,000 over the two weeks of "winter" weather which he heads the subcommittee handling these matters.

PEACE WITH RUSSIA

In ironic mood the eminent scientist, Albert Einstein, says there may be some doubt about whether we will fight the next war but none at all about the one after that. In World War IV, he says, the weapons will be atomic.

His witty comment accurately mirrors the profound concern felt everywhere by scientists, statesmen and ordinary men over the future peace of the world. Since President Truman announced his official policy of going to build a hydrogen bomb, there's been a rash of proposals aimed at staving off another global conflict.

Senator McMahon, Connecticut Democrat, has introduced a bill for \$200,000,000 to build a plant to include Russia and her satellites. Benator, Tydings, Maryland Democrat, calls for a world disarmament pact to "end the world's nightmare of fear."

A number of atomic scientists want the United States to promise to use the projected hydrogen bomb only if first attacked with a similar weapon. The 1,500-man Federation of American Scientists proposes that a new international agreement be drawn up between the United Nations to re-examine the outlook for control of atomic bombs.

These plans offered by earnest, sober-minded men only serve to intensify the anguish of every child's mind in this critical moment. The dilemma is this:

The prospect of the hydrogen bomb has made the specter of war infinitely more terrifying than ever before. All of us believe that the only way to avoid it is to prevent it and therefore we must avoid it.

Yet the rush toward this frightening holocaust goes on without check. It does so because the brake that could stop it has failed. It is the failure of the present, a solid, genuinely effective peace agreement with Russia. For, if you discount the chance that Germany may rise again, the Soviet union is the only potential aggressor in sight.

The interest of peace depends in the end on winning an honest accord with Moscow. But all the evidence we have—and who will disagree—is plain before our eyes.

"Depraved words have been pleading for just one more try" with the Russians. But, in the bluntest statement to come from our statesmen, it is clear that the Secretary of State Dean Acheson has ruled out any new approach to the Soviet-union on the ground it would be a useless effort.

There can be no peace with Russia, he said, until the country that made them themselves so strong that the men in the Kremlin become convinced peace is the wisest course. For strength and force are the only language they understand, and any agreement not supported by military might would be broken.

Acheson has spoken with admirable wisdom and courage. His words should help to give us firmer courage and strength that alone can lead toward peace.

NEED ACTION ON EDUCATION

We've had another warning from Earl J. McGrath, U. S. Commissioner of education, that public education is in a critical state and getting no better.

With school population way up and still climbing, the nation has about 25 per cent less elementary school teachers than it did in 1937. In the secondary schools, the situation is trending on this line, many teachers barely meeting professional standards.

The office of education and the National Education Association agree that to replace the retiring and obsolete teaching staff and add the new ones needed to accommodate rising enrollments during the next decade will take about \$10,000,000,000.

There are other problems, but these go to the heart of the matter.

Congress has been kicking the aid of education issue around for sometime now. And most of the proposals it has considered deal only with school operating expense and teachers' salaries. Very few attempt to grapple with the mounting backlog of vital school construction.

Electron year or not, the law-makers should place this in this matter promptly. The nation's education is in a critical state and getting no better.

We're growing up and they'll advance toward maturity without an adequate education—in millions of cases—unless congress does something about it.

WIRE-TAPPING HAS ITS USE

The cracking of the case of Dr. Karl Fuchs, British scientist accused of handing atomic secrets to Russia, is certainly an argument for more wire-tapping in espionage matters. It now is clear.

The FBI says that's how they caught up with Fuchs' activities. The wire-tapping technique is dangerous to liberty and privacy if the check on the fundamental security of the nation justifies it.

Last Date Nears On Tree Orders

SHOHOINE, Feb. 26 — Time is growing short to order trees for windbreaks and woodlots, George Cook, Lincoln county extension agent, advises farmers. Tree orders must be postmarked by March 1 to be filled this spring.

Farmers wishing to order trees should get their order-blanks from their county agent's office.

Trees available this year include Russian olive, Siberian pea, Russian mulberry, southernwood, hickory, chest, green ash, honey locust, Siberian elm, golden willow, ponderosa pine, lodgepole pine, Norway spruce, Oriental arbutus, juniper and Douglas fir.

These trees are made available to Idaho farmers under a cooperative agreement between the University of Idaho and the federal government, and are not to be planted for ornamental purposes.

Tree prices are 40 per hundred for 300 or less, up to 20 per thousand.

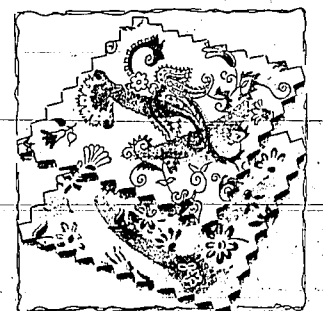
