Damages Sought In Suit Filed by Driver at Burley

BURLEY, March 6—Charles Tulon Price has filed suit in district court against Union Pacific Railroad and Clinton Osterlander for damages totaling \$123,282.75 for injuries allegedly received Dec. 24, 1948, when a car, driven by a Robert Anderson and owned by Price, was struck by the "rainbow goose" on Overland avenue in Burley. Price alleges the railroad company did not maintain gates, fences, lights, blinkers, or safety devices at the crossing, and that there was no flagman there. Osterlander was engineer at the time. Price claims he suffered severe shock bruises, lacerations of the chest and face, and a dislocated shoulder, and that he continues to suffer from a nervous condition. He is asking \$750 for doctor and hospital bills, \$49,233 for the wrecked car, and \$12,000 actual damages. Dean Kloepper and Herman E. Betke are attorneys for the plaintiff.

U. S. Refuses Hungary Plea To Cut Staff

WASHINGTON, March 6 (AP)—The United States indignantly rejected a Hungarian suggestion that the American legation staff in Budapest be trimmed down on the ground that it is an anti-communist spy tract. The state department disclosed this by publishing the text of a strongly worded reply to a note which communist Hungary sent to Washington Feb. 23. The Hungarian note asked the United States to consider reducing the legation staff. The answer turned down this suggestion without reservation, but it also managed, by a piece of diplomatic footwork, to get across the idea that the legation staff probably will be reduced anyway. This apparent contradiction was similar to the circumstance which arose a year ago when the Hungarians demanded the recall of American Minister Selden Chapin.

The United States then denied that Hungary, as a former enemy state, under peace treaty control, had any right to tax an American minister. But having taken that position, the state department and Chapin's home and replaced him by the present Minister Nathaniel P. Davis.

TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHORLIGIG POT SHOTS
