"Monkey trial" at Dayton, Tenn., in 1925 was a world sensation. John Scopes, at right above, an obscure teacher of biology, was arrested for breaking the Tennessee law against teaching Darwin's theory of evolution. The test case attracted the top legal and newspaper talent of the nation, and for eight blistering-hot days in July all eyes turned on the trial in Dayton. To the defense came famed lawyer Clarence Darrow from Chicago; aiding the prosecution was the "Great Commoner," William Jennings Bryan. Although Scopes was convicted and fined \$100 for his offense, the anti-evolution cause was held up to ridicule. Strongly in the case was the sudden death of Bryan shortly after he had tangled with Darrow as a witness for the "fundamentalists."

## Hearings Planned On Soil District For Owyhee Area

MURPHY, March 7—The state soil conservation commission has called hearings for March 14 at Bruneau and March 18 at Grandview to secure information as to the interest and need for a soil conservation district in the Indian Cove, Bruneau, Grandview and Oregona areas in Owyhee county, according to J. V. Briggs, Owyhee county agent.

The hearings are the result of a petition signed by 34 landowners in the areas and submitted to the commission. Briggs urges emergency in the area to attend one of the hearings, and to express his views on the formation of a district.

Educational meetings have been held in Indian Cove, Bruneau, Grandview and Oregona during the past few months to discuss the purpose and function of a district.

Briggs explained a soil conservation district is a local subdivision of the state and the law requires that a hearing be held.

If the information received at the hearing indicates that there is a need and interest in a district, the commission will later conduct a referendum—in which time landowners in the area will have an opportunity to vote on the proposal. The results of those voting must favor the district before it can be approved.

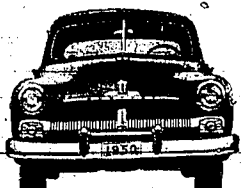

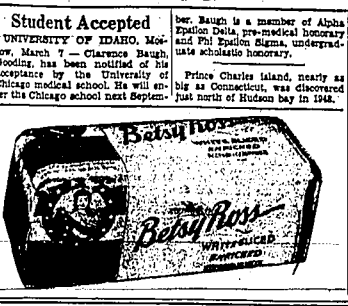

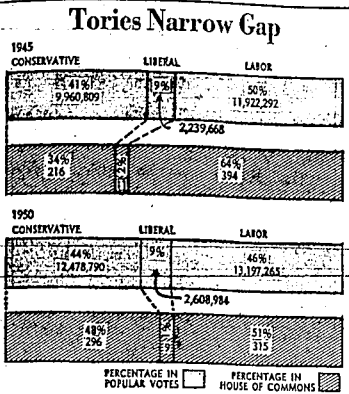

### Shooting Pellet Studied to Stop Double Menace

SAN FRANCISCO, March 7.—Game conservationists are trying to develop a type of shotgun pellet that doesn't have a double chance to kill waterfowl, two wildlife specialists reported.

As things stand now, a charge from a hunter's gun can miss a bird completely, then months or even years later kill a waterfowl which happens to swallow some of the spent shot.

James B. Jordan and Frank C. Hellewell, of the Illinois Natural History Survey told it today in a paper before the North American Wildlife conference.

The pellet's second lethal chance is due to its ability to cause lead poisoning. Some waterfowl areas have become so strewn with spent shot that they are a hazard for feeding birds. This is especially true of swamps and shallow lakes which for years have been favorite shooting areas.

The waterfowl pick up the pellets and swallow them because they resemble gravel. In the gizzard digestive juices remove some of the lead and carry it into the blood stream, often with lethal results.

### County Agent Urging Spray For Orchards

Spraying of trees should be done now, according to County Agent C. W. Daigh. Spraying must be done before buds open and should be done on a calm day when wind will not blow the spray from the trees, Daigh said.

He cited the orchard spray recommendations prepared by the University of Idaho experiment station for spraying trees in this area. Not only ornamental trees but commercial trees in the city should be sprayed to prevent scale, he said.

**Gives Formula**

For San Jose scale, dormant spray of emulsion should be used at the rate of four gallons to 90 gallons of water or liquid lime-sulphur at the rate of not less than 10 gallons for each 100 gallons of spray. An oil-soluble sulphur should be used at the rate of one per cent actual oil and three gallons of lime sulphur per 100 gallons of water. Four pounds of dry lime sulphur is equivalent to one gallon of liquid lime sulphur.

Dormant sprays should be applied after leaves fall and before bud scales separate or show green. Use plenty of material and a pressure of at least 350 pounds, the recommendations state.

For green peach aphid which causes leaf roll in potatoes the dormant application of oil should be delayed until just before the buds open. One pint of nicotine sulphate or pyrethrum extract should be added to 100 gallons of spray.

**Spray Recommended**

To prevent European red mites use four gallons of dormant oil emulsion in 80 gallons of water. Summer control can be obtained by using one and one-half gallons of summer type oil emulsion plus one-fourth pound of colloidal spreader in 90 gallons of water.

For "leaf miner" lime sulphur is advised at San Jose scale and one-half gallon of summer type oil emulsion in combination with lead arsenate. The lead arsenate should be sprayed at the rate of one pound to 100 gallons of water. Basic lead arsenate used with a spreader at the rate of one pound to 100 gallons of water.

**Aphid Spray Listed**

Apple growers who want to prevent apple aphid should use one per cent dormant type oil emulsion to which has been added one pint of nicotine sulphate or pyrethrum for 100 gallons of spray. Daigh pointed out it should be applied in the dormant stage. For an effective dormant stage spray, combine two per cent oil and three per cent lime sulphur with one and one-half gallons of water. Daigh added many other insecticide sprays are explained on the recommendation bulletins received by him. Anyone wanting further information should see him at the county agent's office.

### Disabled Veteran Training Not Hit

Disabled veterans training under public law is not affected in any way by recent veterans administration and budget bureau recommendations to curb weaknesses and abuses in the GI bill of rights education and training program, says Arnold Helwege, VA contact representative for Magic Valley.
