### Report Given on Status of State Forests

March 21 (AP)—The state board of forestry held its annual meeting here Monday afternoon, according to a report by State Forester J. Guernsey.

Guernsey covered the forestry activities of the state for the year 1929 in Guernsey's report to the board.

He said the 1929 forest fire report was the saddest since 1914 due to a longer and more severe fire season.

There were 681 fires in 1929, burning 1,100 acres of land, compared to 418 in 1928, when 1,000 acres were burned. Last year, 6,000 acres as compared to 10,000 the year before.

Guernsey also pointed out to the board that 1929 was the heaviest year in the history of the state in the amount of timber sales. Total sales receipts were \$1,700,000.

Building Planned

Guernsey planned for constructing a branch office at Boise to house the state warden and deputy forester in charge of state sales in Idaho.

Guernsey said the board will probably be called to meet in early winter, but he took formal action on the building plan for the state warden and deputy forester in Boise.

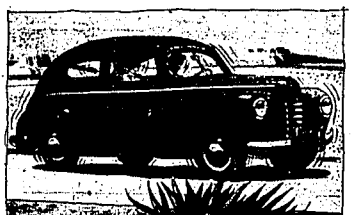

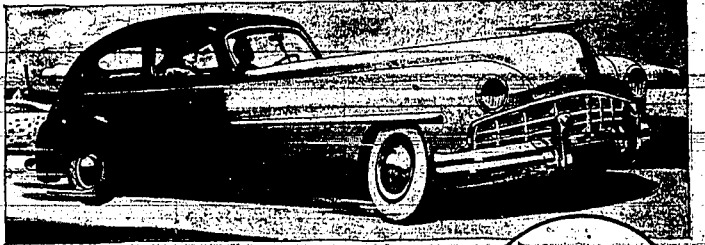

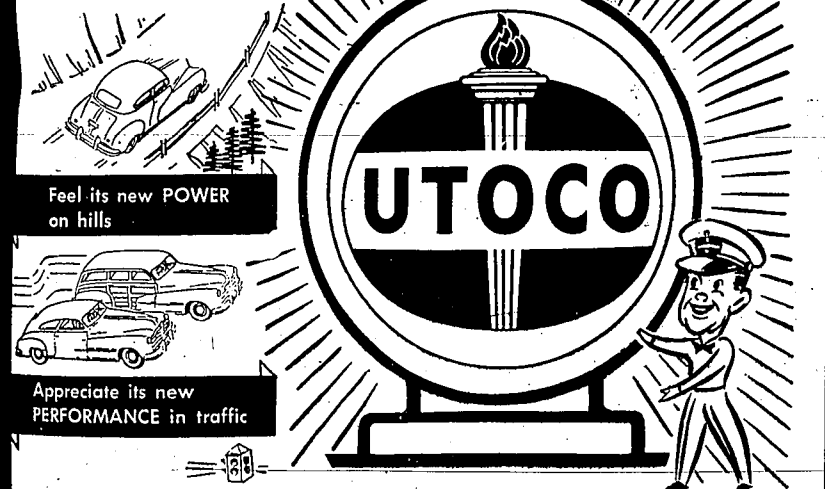
