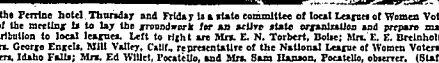

FUCHS' IMPRESSION OF US

We people of the democratic world may be surprised to learn that, even though most of us aren't communists, we often are a quite decent sort.

This comfort comes to us from Dr. Klaus Fuchs' British scientific recently sentenced to 14 years imprisonment for handing atomic secrets to the Russians.

Over the years—which has been written about the strange nature of the communist movement, particularly in the Soviet Union, but little that's been said matches Dr. Fuchs' formal spy confession in providing real insight into this mentality.

Dr. Fuchs said that when he came to Britain for Germany he fell in naturally with extreme leftist people. They were his friends; he understood them and their thinking. And presumably all of them were governed by a deep attachment to Russia, the communist state.

Gradually, however, Dr. Fuchs rose in prominence as a scientist. Soon he found himself working with other eminent British specialists on highly secret atomic projects in Harwell, England. He felt that he was now working for the government. Dr. Fuchs still felt a primary loyalty to the political creed he shared with his first British friends. And hence he convinced himself it was proper to pass on to Russia, the red fatherland, the secrets he learned at Harwell.

But what concerns us more here is at Dr. Fuchs' reaction to the people he met at Harwell. He thought that they were like his friends and relatives were not like his other friends. They were solid Britishers, more or less content with their lot, earnestly doing their jobs. They didn't talk of overthrowing the system.

As time went on Dr. Fuchs grew to admire these people. He concluded, almost reluctantly and with evident astonishment, that they were decent folk. He found they were not interested in the Communist party and its kind of mysterious whispering that fed their driving energies.

TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—Klaus Fuchs' 13-page, 8,000-word letter to the state department... The letter, which was obtained by the state department from the British... It is the only document of its kind that has been made public.

SYSTEM—Fuchs' story of the way he slipped across atomic stuff to the men of Moscow confirms the story that he had to be "kept" in the United States to keep the secret while he was working for the A-bomb.

SITTING—Fuchs' told his questions his mental operations were what he called "controlled, rational operations." That is, he lived in two worlds, the decent and the secret world, and he had to be careful of conventional or unconventional patterns in both his lives.

U. S. Potatoes Make Big Hit With Lisbon

WASHINGTON, March 24 (AP)—Surplus American potatoes are making a Hollywood-like hit in Portugal.

A report from American consular officials in that country said consular agents are making a big market to buy surplus shipped there from surplus stocks bought by the agriculture department under a price support program.

The department is paying American farmers an average of about \$125 per 100 pounds, selling the potatoes for one cent per 100 pounds at storage points in the producing area. Some of the potatoes are then shipped to Portugal, Spain and Mexico.

Portuguese consumers were said to be paying at the rate of \$450 for 100 pounds of potatoes. The quality potatoes are selling in Washington at about 8¢.

Water is the most important factor in the growth of plants. Lack of water not only reduces the yield, but the vegetables you get are likely to have woody fibers rather than the succulent ones you aim for. Water by soaking from a slow-running hose or place an old tin can with a small hole in the bottom, beside a plant. Fill the can once a day with water that will ooze out through the small hole. As the plants develop, a light sprinkling of a complete 4-12-4 fertilizer between the rows, followed by watering, will help promote healthy growth. A good rule-of-thumb is to figure two pounds of fertilizer for each 100 feet of row.

Snow Depth Now Is Greater Than Recorded in 1949

HAILEY, March 24.—Snow depth here is 19 inches, compared with four inches at this time last year, according to the forest service's latest snow-report. Total precipitation since Oct. 1, 1929, is 11.90 inches, or .26 above last year's figure and 2.15 above average. Since the report was issued, an additional .29 precipitation has been recorded.

Snow depths in 1930 and 1929 in the Wood, 11 drainage include: Matchum, 27 and 14; Galena, 50 and 45; and the three stations on Old Idaho, 30 and 29, 30 and 29, and 29 and 50.

On the Malad side, at Soldier there are 12 inches of snow compared with last year's 24. At Fairfield, present depth is 10 inches, compared with 22 last year.

On the South Boise river, the 48 inches of snow at Featherfalls is below the record for this time of the last year. Measurements at Shako creek are 34 and 30 inches.

In the Snake valley, there are 39 inches of snow, three inches more than last year. Stanley snow depth is estimated six inches.

Four Topics Discussed by Study Group

KETCHUM, March 24—The necessity of parents fitting a good example for their children was stressed in an adult education class held by the Ketchum study group. Presentation of the four topics was followed by discussion.

Dr. J. Supple, Halley, a plan for dental care prevention in the home was discussed. Mrs. W. H. H. safety; Mrs. Carroll Coates, Bellevue, nutrition, and Kenneth Palm, Halley, citizenship.

Survey Findings
Dr. Supple described the need for a decay prevention plan shown in a mass survey he conducted in 1932 in Blaine county. The survey showed 718 pupils in the county school system. Of this Halley high school had 2308 cavities in permanent teeth and 884 cavities in baby teeth.

A total of 224 baby and 232 permanent teeth needed extraction. He said although parents were informed and there was wide publicity, very few parents replied and there was no action to change the dental picture in the county.

Officers Not "Gone"
Hand, a state police lieutenant, urged parents to provide their children with "correct" examples in all safety matters. He cautioned many parents using law enforcement officers as "correct" and said this results in children fearing and misunderstanding law enforcement officers, leading to lack of cooperation later.

Example was stressed again in the nutrition class by Mrs. Coates, the county public health nurse. She cited the importance of parents can set in serving and eating balanced meals.

Citizenship Example
Palm also urged parents set an example in citizenship. He said the measure of citizenship is each person's desire and effort to serve his community.
