Children Think Nothing of Scaling Canyon Cliff to Meet School Bus

'Canyon Kids' Scale Cliff to Go to School

(From Page One)

The four children who make the trip up the canyon wall on their way to school are not at all perturbed about the apparent dangers of the climb. They started scaling the rim when they started to school—like Marjorie—and have grown expert at it. The other three going to school are Johnny, 8, Joanna, 12, and Hazel, 12.

Johnny admitted he was a "little scared" the first time he came up but he's a veteran climber now. In fact, he hardly uses his hands on the ladders. When asked if there wasn't another, easier path up the cliff he answered, "There is another path on the other side of the bridge but it's harder to climb."

The trail leading to the rip-raps almost directly under the bridge and turns upward nearly 800 feet above the canyon floor. The first two-thirds of the path is a series of steep slopes and isn't too difficult to climb except for the 150 yards or so where a slide of boulders must be crossed. But from there on it is a steep scramble up the sheer face of the cliff for 150 feet.

Rock chimneys and makeshift ladders make it possible, although still difficult for the beginning. A series of lateral ledge steps back and forth until the final ledge below the rim is reached. Here a "hurry" stairway almost makes one forget the climb below. Looking down the stairway, one feels it leads to nowhere except "maybe" to a narrow observation ledge.

A few times during the past winter the children found the going too hard and stayed home from school until their father and older brother had helped them over the rocks. A blanket of snow makes the trail smoother and easier, according to the Holtons.

There is a less rugged way of getting out of the canyon but the trail is for most trips. They can go a mile downstream by boat where it leads down to the river but they describe that as the "long way around." However, they do use their boat—equipped with an outboard motor—to take fruit and produce they grow into town. For minor chores, the luring horns 100-pound sacks of potatoes, they use the cliff path.

Four other little Holtons, below school age, have yet to master the trail. But they'll be learning soon. The older brother works on their orchard with Mr. Holton and helps with the heavy hauling down their private "rock trail."

Several years ago they raised cattle and hogs but they found the feed problem too tough for their means of transportation. Since then they have plowed under much of their grass land with a hand plow and have started an orchard containing a wide variety of trees. Apples and peach trees are bearing fruit and plum, fig and grape trees are well on their way toward mature growth.

Near their cabin are rocks halloved out through the ages by river, water and sand which provide convenient storage space for many cases of fruit and vegetables they store every year.

Mr. Holton works at the sugar factory during his season and spends the rest of his time tending his orchard and garden. Their milk supply is solved by goats which graze on the grass at the base of the cliff.

Fish and game in season provide many a meal and fish for the appetites of this outdoor family. The Holtons are about as self-sufficient as any family in this end of the county. Their food and fuel are largely the product of their own hands. Except for their clothing, nearly everything they need is provided by nature or can be grown on their land.

The year-around streams of water coming off the cliff behind their cabin would provide an ample source of power and Mr. Holton plans to send a generator when he can find the right type.

He also plans for the day when the area might be developed into a "hickory" camp for people who want to get out of the city for a few weeks of peace and quiet. However, when that day arrives, he says he doesn't intend to move west and climb down the cliff. The labeled lake, the river would permit transportation of a road down stream a mile or so where the canyon can be entered by automobile.

What the census taker might do about counting more at the Holton place is a matter for conjecture. He could read this story, add 11 to his total for the Snake river canyon area and go about his business. Or, he could climb down the rocks and risk a narrow, hazardous family that has learned to live to a considerable extent without the devices of a complex civilization.

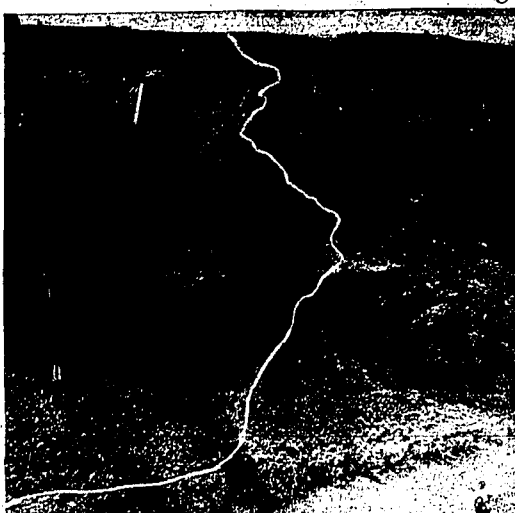

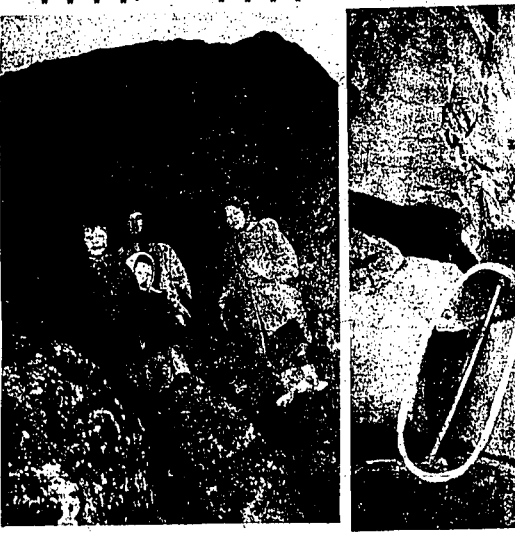

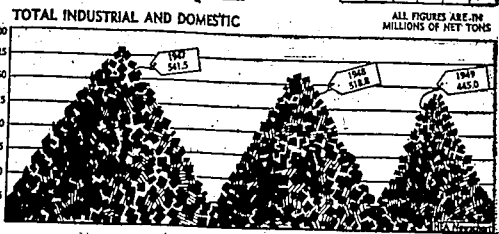

The scientific aids positions pay \$2,400 to \$4,100 a year. Salaries for the communications jobs are ranging from \$2,400 to \$4,000 a year; facilities specialist, \$2,250 to \$4,000; service supervisor, \$2,450 to \$4,000; specialist, \$2,100 to \$4,000; radio and wire specialist, \$2,250 to \$4,000; telegrapher, \$2,100 to \$4,000; telegrapher operator positions, \$2,075 to \$4,000. All positions are with federal agencies in the Washington, D. C. vicinity.

To qualify for the scientific aids positions, applicants must pass a written test. In addition, they must have from one to four years of appropriate experience, the amount depending upon the grade level for which they wish to be considered. A part of this experience must have been in the specialized fields of fiber technology or textile technology. Provision is made for substitution of appropriate education for the required experience.

A written test is required for communications positions. To qualify, applicants must have had the appropriate experience. Part of this study may be substituted for part of the experience on the basis of the use of the experience for communications specialists and radio and wire specialists positions.

Age limits for positions are from 18 to 62 years except for persons with veterans' preferences. Information and application forms may be obtained from Reardon in the Twin Falls postoffice, civil service regional office of the U. S. civil service commission, Washington, D. C. He said that by the end of 1950 an estimated additional 2,000,000 cars will be on the roads. "We've got to keep busy," he warned.

Higher gas taxes are fair, he added, when they are supplemented by bond issues which enable projects to be undertaken immediately.

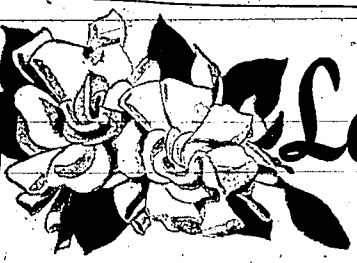

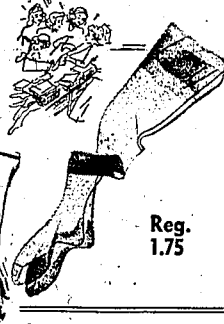

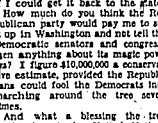

Tour of Banana Plantation Is Described to Hailey Residents

HAILEY, March 29—Movies and a description of a trip through a Panama banana plantation and to Peru were presented here last night by Frank Hurl, manager of the plantation operator and brother of H. H. Hurl.

The widely-traveled, veteran previously has shown films here in Alaska and Idaho.

Hurl and his wife were passengers on a United Fruit company boat from Seattle to Panama, a ship which transports the bananas grown on the plantations the Hurla owned.

The boats go from Seattle to Panama where they load enough to go to New York and unload, then can go to Los Angeles and Los Angeles and Seattle.

Each of the boats has six staterooms. The company owns about 50 ships, of which nine have completely intangible parts and cost \$100,000.

The Hurlas toured a banana plantation at Port Au Prince, a town in an automobile equipped to run on railroad tracks.

Describing banana growth, Hurl said a box of bananas taken from a tree 10 to 12 inches thick and 20 to 30 feet high.

The tree is cut down to harvest the fruit and in six or eight weeks the cut portion will be completely filled with new shoots grow from the stump. Despite heavy rains, overhead irrigation is used. Water is pumped from the ocean and distributed per square inch.

Hurl said some of the land is used for rubber and oil palms. He showed pictures of the large "towns" built by the fruit concern to maintain its employees.

From the banana plantation, the Hurlas flew to Lima, Peru. Air fares here are two to three times higher than in the United States. Hurl explained, because of lack of government support of aviation. Airline passengers also pay the charges to permit the airlines passage over various countries.

The Hurlas observed only two

sees and each three bears between three and four miles a year. The bunches, weighing about 50 pounds, weigh 30 to 35 cents a bunch for the locals.

Bananas which ripen on the tree, of course, are more delicious than those ripened in the commercial way. A tree usually is held to four or five bunches of bananas—of the bunches each bear a bunch.

As he gathers the fruit, the hooch man always has a staff with the front until the bananas come slowly down. After the bananas are free, he cuts the fruit for the rest of the way and the process goes on for 30 years.

The Scotia employ about 30 Inca Indians and pay them 16 acres a day then charge them five acres back for meals and rooms. They are worth approximately a nickel.

The Scotia has two bunches of bananas a day.

Dooce and Leal pay no taxes. Their Indian laborers never have been a school. They live a very simple life with few customs or followers of great significance. They have no church; their simple religion pertains almost solely to the burial of the dead.

Each wife must have a separate house, but an Inca more or less can have as many wives as he wishes. There is considerable sharing and trading in this custom.

The workers have a menu almost entirely of bananas and rice. They eat pork with fish and chicken. Charles Lamb's essay on how the Chinese came to cook their meat over a hot coal fire is a good one. It doesn't do it.

The Scotia try to live the Inca in better sanitation and living, but the Indians are slow to copy or learn.

Gibbs told Leal about a friend, a woman who is a grower for "bringing civilization" to the Pacific islands. When leaving the islands, the officer asked the native chieftain what he would like sent from the United States.

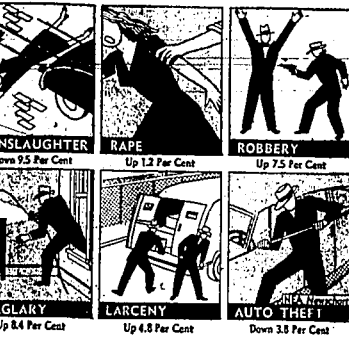
The chieftain replied, "Send us some fish hooks; we've about forgotten how to fish."

Leal illustrated the caliber of the Inca by replying, "Our Indians are more simple, they don't even fish." They live in little houses on stilts to keep the dampness out. All transportation is by small mules, awkward carts or the more usual pack saddle.

Leal said they could raise pigs but there is always the chance of disease and the Scotia intend to stick to bananas until they get a better supply of hog serum. He said there is a great future in hogs in Ecuador as everyone wants the meat and the jungle furnishes a just living for the hog.

A current of air coming from Cape Horn carries enough cold to make the climate very pleasant, Leal said. One always uses a blanket at night. There's a lot of rainfall, but the jungle, the mules and the Inca don't mind that at all. They care about a very banana and the Scotia have great hopes for the future in a fine pioneer spirit.

USDA Refuses to Hold Hearing on Apple Agreement

WASHINGTON, March 29 (AP)—The agriculture department has refused a request by a group of Washington state apple growers for holding on a proposed marketing agreement for apples grown in Washington and Oregon.

Officials said:

1. The proposal was not specific enough.
2. It was not accompanied by endorsements from apple handlers and shippers.
3. There was evidence that Oregon growers were not in accord.

It was emphasized that the department did not pass judgment on the idea behind such a program. Officials said it acted instead on the belief that there would not be sufficient justification for a hearing until broader support for a program could be shown.

Such a program would permit regulation of apple shipments by grades and sizes. It would be designed to help stabilize prices by preventing seasonal glutting of markets and the sale of low grade fruit.

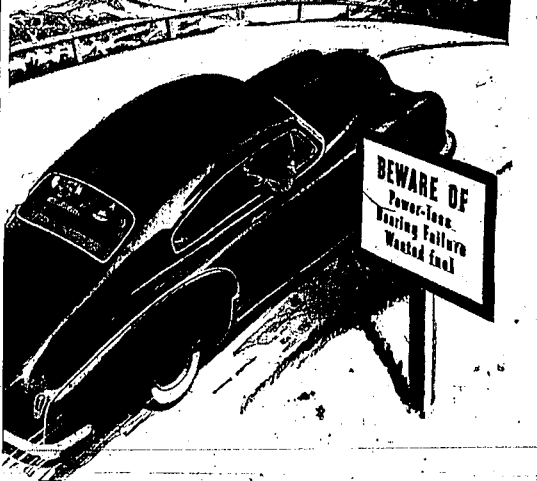

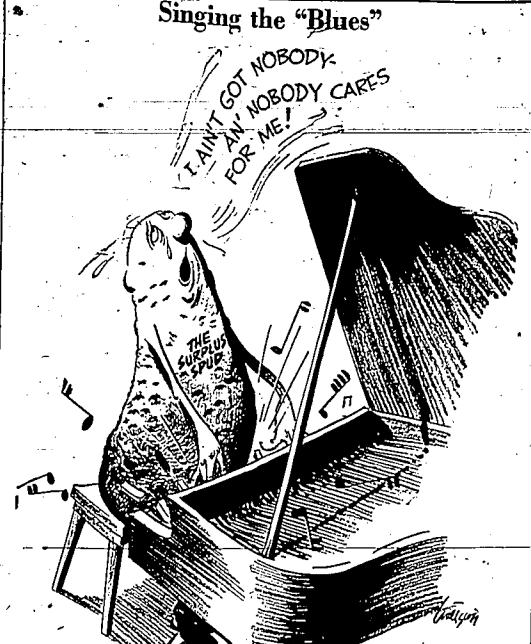

Chiang Urges World to Aid China People

TAIPEI, Formosa, March 29 (AP)—Chiang Kai-shek today appealed for world aid for the millions starving in communist China.

He promised to do everything possible to see that such aid reached the starving. The hand-picked nationalists themselves will send food to destitute China if the world will help.

Reds Loot Food

Chiang declared the Russian imperialists have systematically looted our foodstuffs, material resources and industrial equipment as they intensify their drive to take possession of peaceful rehabilitation.

Chiang's statement was broadcast over all national stations. Copies of it will be spreading over the mainland by planes beginning tomorrow.

The communists are in a bad way at home with famine, and with a trade agreement with Russia under which grain from Manchuria is sent to the Soviet Union.

Reds Meet Charge

(A red radio broadcast today, while not mentioning the famine, apparently was designed to meet nationalist charges. It reported that Manchuria had supported the "war effort" by sending its huge grain surplus to areas south of the great wall.)

Chiang charged that the Russians three years ago told Chinese communist leaders at least 300,000,000 Chinese should be sacrificed to meet the communist revolution in areas of China.

Now, the generalissimo said, the Chinese reds "with Russian support are overturning our fatherland and slaughtering the people."

"They (the Russians) have really become international bandits and the public enemies of mankind," his statement said.

Chiang said the Chinese communists simply were "executing Soviet policy of having China destroyed by the Chinese themselves."

WASHINGTON, March 29 (AP)—Idaho Power company, Boise, has asked the power commission for authority to issue 20,000 shares of four per cent, \$100 par value cumulative preferred stock.

The company plans to use the proceeds to finance construction. It also plans to make an underwriting agreement for the issue with Western and Daily corporation, Boston.

Shortly after his arrest, Patton asked reporters:

"What can a man do when he is hungry?"

A reporter found only three potatoes and a can of beans in the two-room apartment where Mr. Patton was confined with his 11-month-old daughter and two sons, aged 2 and 9 years.

Mrs. Patton was showered with sympathy.

She received large quantities of food, several hundred dollars in cash, two refrigerators, and a washing machine.

This morning a neighbor drove her downtown to bank the money.

"What bank?" a reporter asked.

"The National Bank of Commerce, of course," she said. "That's where my husband has a checking account."

Vote Backs Ban Of African Chief

LONDON, March 29 (AP)—The house of commons Tuesday overwhelmingly supported the labor government's banishment of African tribal chief Geretak Khama from his homeland.

The government won a majority of 118 for its motion to close off any further parliamentary debate on the action which stirred up a storm of protest here. It is Labor's biggest victory since the new house of commons convened early this month.

Khama, chief designate of the south African tribe, was banished from the tribe for five years after his marriage to a white London typist, Ruth Williams.

He is now in Bechuanaland, to stay with his wife until after the birth of their child, expected in June, and to gather evidence for a law suit. He must then leave the territory.

Long Election in El Salvador Ends

SAN SALVADORE, El Salvador, March 29 (AP)—Large numbers of voters were still lined up waiting for the polls to open when voting ended El Salvador's three-day election at noon Tuesday.

Most of the disappointed voters were women who turned out in numbers that far exceeded expectations.

The voters chose a president and members of a constituent assembly in the first free election since 1931.

Results are expected to be known within two weeks.

Public Power Termed 'Real Key' to Gains

WASHINGTON, March 29 (AP)—Private power companies have their place but public power is the real key to the riches of America's river valleys, Assistant Secretary of the Interior William E. Warne believes.

In an address to the American Public Power association, Warne said:

"I doubt that of necessity public power must displace the privately-owned utilities. Some power companies have filled themselves successfully into the new pattern in areas where most of the power is produced by public agencies.

"But private companies must not be permitted to skim the revenues-producing cream off our water resource program.

"If this were permitted, the development of all of the other related resources would be jeopardized.

Warne said an example of development through a federal power program is the manner in which Grand Coulee dam is building a whole new industrial area in the Pacific northwest."

He said that project is "about to give us an agricultural realm three-fourths the size of Delaware—perhaps a million acres of rich, brand new land."
