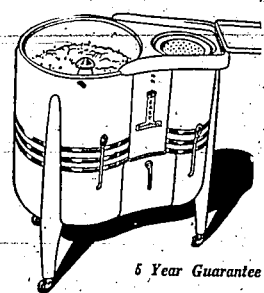

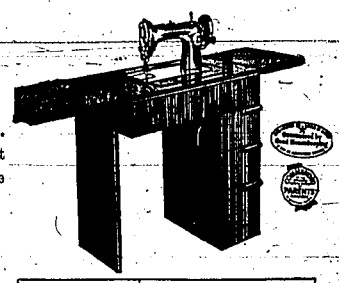

Civil Service Wildlife Jobs Are Reported

Civil service examinations have been announced by Herman Hax, chief, local service, Idaho state civil service commission, for wildlife management biologist, fishery management biologist, biological (technical aid supervisor) and research psychologist.

The biologist positions are in the fish and wildlife service of the department of the interior and are located throughout the state. Salaries range from \$12,233 to \$14,600 a year. To qualify, applicants must have completed an appropriate college course or have four years of appropriate experience. In addition they must have had from one to three years of professional experience.

Research psychologist (psychophysical examination will fill positions in the fields of psychophysics of vision and psychophysics of audition at the U. S. Naval submarine base, New London, Conn. The positions pay \$12,515 to \$14,500 a year.

To qualify, applicants must have completed either an appropriate four-year college course or four years of technical experience in experimental or physiological psychology, or a comparable plus appropriate graduate study or responsible research experience.

Applications for the biologist positions must be received in the commission's Washington office not later than April 11. Persons applying for the research psychologist examination can file their applications with the commission, board of U. S. civil service examiners, U. S. Naval submarine base, New London, Conn., until further notice.

Examinations also were announced for lithographic offset pressman (also helper and foreman), paying \$10 to \$11.9 an hour; off-set duplicating press operator (also set-duplicating unit supervisor, \$1.27 to \$1.17 an hour; and operative, printing and binding plant (also helper), \$1.02 to \$1.17 an hour. These positions are located in the government printing office and in several other federal agencies in Washington, D. C. and vicinity.

To qualify for any of these positions, applicants must have had experience in the type of work for which they apply. Appropriate resident or apprenticeship training may be credited toward the required experience.

No written test is required for any position and the age limit, 18 to 62, will be waived for persons entitled to veterans preference. Full information and application forms may be obtained from the local secretary of the position, from civil service regional offices or the U. S. civil service commission, Washington 25, D. C.

Burley Judge Gives Talk at WCTU Meet

BURLEY, March 30—Probate Judge Henry W. Tucker addressed the monthly meeting of WCTU Thursday afternoon at the Christian church, when he discussed juvenile delinquency and other problems related to the liquor traffic.

Judge Tucker named many contributing causes to juvenile delinquency, including poverty, poor housing of large families, poor food, and lack of proper clothing, especially for girls, sickness, poor eyesight and hearing, and parents, broken families and alcoholism of parents.

Bad movies, crime programs on the radio and exciting funny books contribute to juvenile delinquency, he said. Many of the most serious crimes are committed by young people who are not educated.

Mrs. E. M. Steinhilber gave a statistical report on conditions before and after the 19th amendment with respect to the present time. She discussed the four promises of the anti-suffrage movement made at the time of repeal: A reduction in taxes, discouragement of drinking, the promise that no crime, or any substitute for it, would not return.

EVERETT, Wash., March 30 (AP)—Interior Secretary Oscar L. Chapman says 50,000 acres a year will be opened for development starting in 1952 in 17 Utah or interior department projects.

Chapman, in the Pacific northwest to give impetus to the Democratic campaign in three Columbia river basin states, addressed a Jefferson-Jackson day dinner last night before flying back to Washington early today.

Mandate "Clear"
He declared the people of the nation "stated clearly" in the 1948 presidential election that they intend their resources "shall continue to exist for the welfare of our people."

"You have not changed your opinions because someone has told you that you have created a welfare state or that you have become socialist," he said as he defended President Truman's policies and lashed out at those who call them socialist.

Beats Alaska State
The President's top political adviser expressed satisfaction with the house-approved Alaska statehood bill, "an particularly pleased" to see progress toward Alaska statehood because Alaskan people are American citizens as a whole and are entitled to full franchise.

Regarding interior department development projects, he said the acreage to be opened up was reduced from 70,000 because "people in lower levels are not able to provide utilities for such a large number of acres."

Chapman again emphasized that President Truman's visit to the northwest may well be "strictly non-political."

'Huk' Rebels Hit 2 Towns; Manila Girds

MANILA, P. I. March 30 (AP)—Communist-led Hukbalahap guerrillas sacked and burned a town only 37 miles south of Manila today. Manila itself was girded by troops and tanks prepared to beat off a possible attack.

A band of 100 Hukks invaded Tanauan, sacked houses and applied the torch indiscriminately. The public market and 200 houses were destroyed. Damage was estimated at more than \$1,000,000.

Another 1000 Hukks simultaneously attacked the municipal building at San Pablo, 43 miles southeast of Manila. They killed an officer and four constabulary enlisted men.

The raids marked the start of the second day of an uprising against the eighth anniversary of the founding of the Hukbalahap peasant army. Press reports said nearly 60 persons were killed in fighting yesterday in four provinces of the capital island of Luzon.

Started as Guerrilla Force
The Hukks originally banded together as a guerrilla army to fight Japanese invaders. After Japan's surrender, they turned against the new Philippines government. Their leader is Col. Alexander (Stallio) Verna, a communist.

In Baculo, President Elpidio Quirino asked the cooperation of all Filipinos in an all-out offensive against the Hukks. He was reported speeding plans to merge the army and constabulary into one unit.

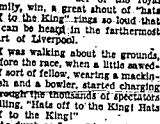

Brave Hank Outwits Searching Crew in His Climbing of Rock

 LACE WINDERMERE, Scotland—Let's start off today, though we are miles from Antiree and the running of the 100th grand national steeplechase, with a sight that I saw and heard at that course last Saturday.



Picture half a million or so folk gathered in and about the track where the world's greatest steeplechase is run. Remember, too, that when the King's colors, or the colors of any member of the royal family, win a great shout of "Hats off to the King!" so loud that it can be heard in the farthest part of Liverpool.

There in Windermere, dead in the center of some of the loveliest countryside in the world—the Lake district immortalized by Wordsworth, Southey and Keats—I heard a most enlightening talk by Lord Andrew McDonogh on the subject of rock climbing.

There are quite a few attractive mountains here in and about Lake Windermere, but Lord McDonogh, working British understatements to the hilt, referred to it as rock climbing.

He allowed as the rocks in this neighborhood were the training ground for those adventurous (and to my mind, dafsy) souls who want to scale Mt. Everest, highest peak in the world, and whose summit no man has ever reached.

Milord pointed out that rock climbing had but one real danger—death for those who made a mistake. That seemed a bit of a steep price to pay for scaling the side of a

harmless and peaceful rock. But Milord talked so convincingly of the sport, the thrill and the exercise and climbed myself a rock.

It was late in the evening when I went forth, and the visibility wasn't too good, so I can't swear it in height or a monster of some sort. All I know is that I didn't

make it. Halfway to the summit my lungs relayed a message to my legs, which in turn notified my brain (I) that I had better make camp for the night.

So I hunched down, snug against cold stone and wet, sticky lichen and turned in. Much to my regret, the other members of my party, including high officials of the British Travel Association, sought me for hours. Overestimating my strength, they scoured the real mountains, never suspecting that I would choose the rock garden for my first try at rock climbing.

Morning came and they found me

sound asleep in the rock garden, my brave heart beating against a bed of narcissi, and my weary arms circling six or seven tulips and a mass of daffodils.

Lord McDonogh complimented me on my spirit and took me to the train for London where I given half a chance, I shall scale Nelson's monument and give that heretic sailor's face a scrubbing it has long needed.

G. F. Children Learn by Doing In Constructing Farm Project

OLSON FERRY, March 30.—High spot of the year for second-grade pupils of Mrs. Catherine Mahan came when they participated in a project at tea party last week and showed "The Farm."

The model farm has been completed in one hour and 15 minutes once a week for 16 weeks, and four half-days that time when the size and scope of their "learning by doing" required the longer working period.

Explaining how her pupils learned by doing, Mrs. Mahan said that they learned their ability to work together and get along with each other that during the construction of their farm they had learned correct language, spelling, numbers,

model derrick, complete in many details.

Tree leaves, collected last fall by the children during an outing, were first pressed and then used to make miniature trees over the yard about the farm house. Spools, wrapped with green paper, formed the base for the trees, and trunks were made of tiny sticks covered with the same paper.

As they worked with their animals, the children learned such things as the life and habits of the cow, how it is used for beef, how the different parts of the animal are used so that none is wasted, how to figure the number of animals on the farm when some are sold or bought.

And as they worked, they learned songs to tell of their beloved farm. When they entertained their parents, the youngsters sang their songs, concluding with a clever fast-and-slow alphabet song. Opening the

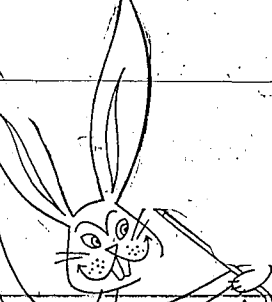

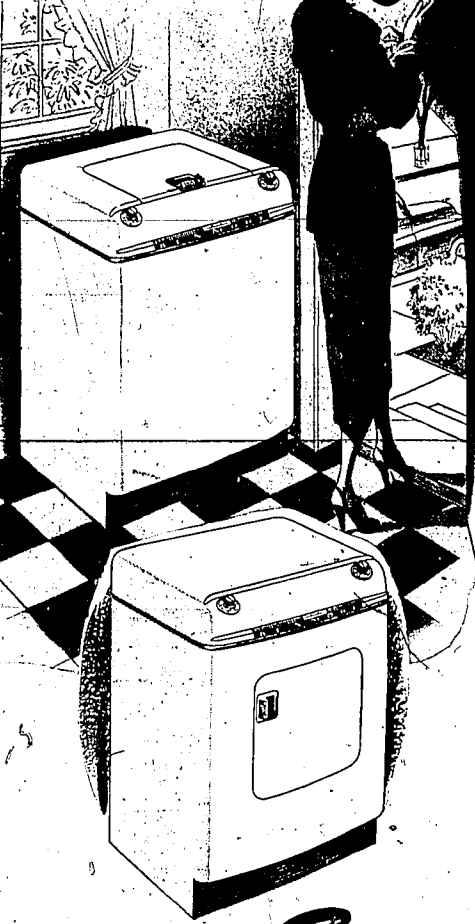
