**T. F. Businessman Uses Candy to Feed Pigs, Finds Meat Has Unique Flavor**

Percy L. Lawrence, Twin Falls businessman, has been giving his pigs candy on the hoof for more than a year.

"The American Meat Institute will run an advertisement in the Saturday Evening Post soon with a picture of Lawrence and details of how he fattens pigs by feeding them chocolate cherries, peanut clusters, and suckers."

Lawrence started out with 10 weaner pigs and 2,500 pounds of over-age candy. The results were "astounding," according to Lawrence. Meat from the pigs is firm and has a "unique" flavor.

Lawrence said he watched a man feed candy to a pig once and couldn't eat pork for a year. However, he has no difficulty consuming ham and bacon from his "candy-cured" porkers, he said.

"He bought old candy from two wholesale warehouses for one cent a pound."

Lawrence recruited neighborhood youngsters near his farm four and one-half miles east of Twin Falls on Kimberly road to wrap the mountain of candy. Each helper was rewarded with as much candy as he could carry home after each session of unwrapping. Lawrence said he had half of his double garage filled with boxes of candy of all types and descriptions.

"The diet consisted of chopped grain, candy, hay and water. No other feed was given the animals. They fattened rapidly and topped 300 pounds before being slaughtered. Pigs do not fit claims for special occasions," Lawrence said.

He claims even pigs have preferences in candy. They like peanut clusters, any kind of nut candy and chocolate cherries. After he started

SPRINGFIELD, Mass., April 12 (AP)—Sea power will safeguard the United States from becoming a battle ground to sea of men.

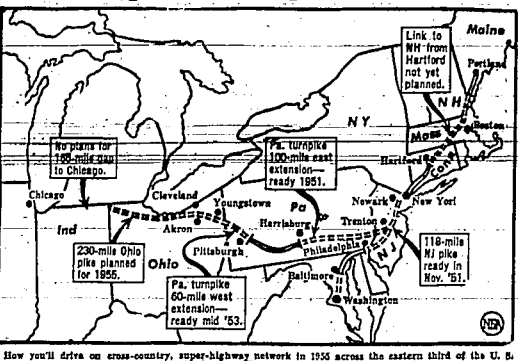

### Super-Highway Network Dreams Come True—at Least in Northeastern States

NEW YORK (NEA)—By 1935 you'll be able to drive from New York City to within 100 miles of Chicago on super-highways largely free of intersections, stoplights and other obstacles to smooth, speedy travel.

Back in the 1920s there was a lot of talk about a nationwide network of super-roads, but highway experts dismissed it as impractical dreaming.

Now, however, the eastern third of this nation is being "super-highwayized" with a network of super-roads which will be able to handle traffic volumes that are today impossible.

The original and still most important link in the east-west route is the famed Pennsylvania turnpike, which is 120 miles long from the outskirts of Pittsburgh to a point near Harrisburg.

Another link in the east-west route is the new Washington beltway, which will encircle the Washington area and connect with the Pennsylvania turnpike.

Other links in the network include the new New Jersey turnpike, which will connect the Philadelphia area with New York City, and the new Maryland turnpike, which will connect Baltimore with Washington.

### Bolivia Ruling Outlaws All of Red Activities

LA PAZ, Bolivia, April 12 (AP)—The Bolivian government has outlawed the Communist party and all its activities and subsidiary organizations. It charged the communist bias of its nations was conspiring to set up a South American Soviet union under a Brazilian-Peru-Argentine front.

The ban was officially linked to labor unrest in this Andean republic, which produces 10 per cent of the world's tin and various other minerals—wolfram, silver, gold, antimony and lead.

**40 Arrested**  
Forty-nine labor figures were arrested Monday night in a police raid from which one of the arrested men, Victor Hugo Libera, escaped in an exchange of shots that killed a policeman. Police said Libera is a student communist leader.

A police statement said Enrique Barron, an employee of the controller general's office, was wounded fatally.

Employees of all but one bank in the capital went on strike, demanding release of the labor leaders and increased pay. The government Saturday refused foreign exchange rates, and its effect, devalued the Bolivian dollar, which has been worth 2 1/2 cents, an average of 48 per cent. Simultaneously the pay of government and private employees was boosted 30 per cent.

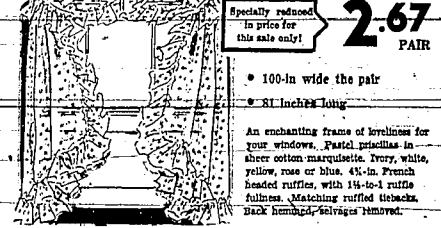

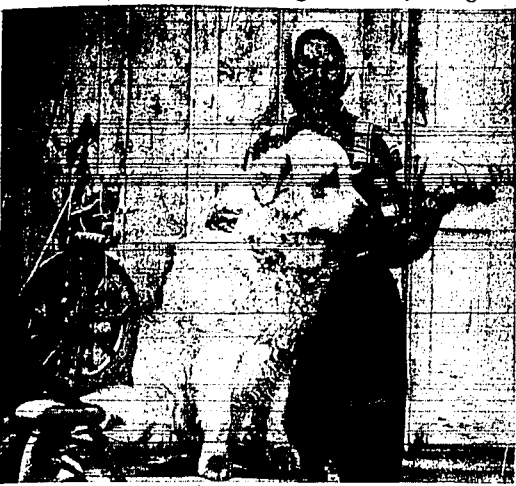

### Hair of Rare Dogs Used to Spin Yarn For Crocheting by Twin Falls Women

It is a common practice for people to shear sheep and spin yarn from the wool but when it comes to shearing your dogs and spinning yarn from their hair, that's something else.

If by chance you should ever own a Great Pyrenees dog, you may find yourself doing just that. At least that is what Helen Caudle, who owns four of the 200 Great Pyrenees dogs registered in the United States, says she does.

Miss Caudle says these dogs are the only ones whose hair can be spun, as the hair from other canines breaks and is not pliable. The white dogs have two coats of hair, the under coat which is soft and fine and about the texture of a fine woolled sheep, and the outer coat which is coarse, but soft.

When the dogs are combed, both the inner and outer coats come out and are used in spinning. The hair is about six inches long and the inner coat is about the same length as the outer coat, Miss Caudle says.

### Black Canyon Settlers Seek Reduced Levy

WASHINGTON, April 12 (AP)—Settlers of the Black Canyon project in Utah would like to reduce their payments to the federal government about \$3 an acre annually.

Senator Dwyer, R., Id., said Tuesday the reclamation bureau has agreed to reduce the levy to \$2.50 per acre. The bureau is now receiving detailed information on the cost of the project. Efforts are being made to work out a new reclamation contract.

Costs increased. The settlers' trouble comes from an increase in construction costs from \$7,500,000 to \$11,500,000. On the basis of the original cost the settlement cost was figured at \$5 an acre. The Water Users association says this is "very high, considering the type of the land to produce." It has petitioned Idaho members of congress and the reclamation bureau to find a means of reducing the cost. They suggest a maximum of \$2 an acre.

### U. S. Gold, Silver Output Increases

WASHINGTON, April 12 (AP)—Daily mine production of gold and silver during February was 14 per cent and 11 per cent greater, respectively, than in January, the bureau officials said.

The bureau estimated February gold production at 172,016 fine ounces compared with 150,811 during January.

Output in South Dakota rose four per cent to 49,222 ounces, the highest monthly total since 1942. Utah output increased one per cent to 35,978 ounces. Other gold production totals for February included: Nevada 13,810 fine ounces; Washington 7,700; Colorado 7,400; Montana 4,550; Idaho 5,180; and Oregon 320.

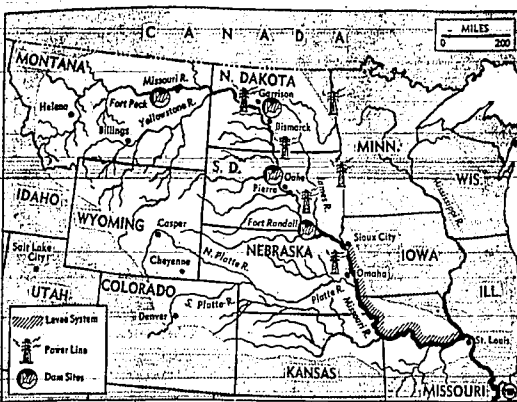

### More Power for Missouri Basin



The latest blueprint shows 230,000-volt "backbone" of the vast, federally-owned power network which Assistant Secretary of Interior William E. Warner says will cover 10 Missouri basin states (light portion of map). "Backbone," indicated on map by power stations, will run from Garrison, N. D., to Sioux City, Okla., or perhaps farther south. It will return, Warner said, along the eastern boundaries of North and South Dakota. Main loop will be interconnected with small feeder lines by which government can deliver some 2,500,000 kilowatts of power to "main load points" throughout the basin. Warner said basic power is supplied in the next 12 years will come from 15 big coal-fired dams at Fort Randall, Garrison, and Fort Peck. Already under construction along the "Big Muddy" is a flood-control levee system stretching from Sioux City to St. Louis.

### L. A. Blushes Over Census Rule in Area

LOS ANGELES, April 12 (AP)—The Chamber of Commerce is blushing indignantly beneath its sun-burned forehead because the bureau's new boundaries for metropolitan Los Angeles.

The 1950 census includes two national forests and the Antelope desert in the "metropolitan area."

"I could take this census table into one of the forests and he could find his way back to civilization in a week," said Guy Marlon, manager of the chamber's research department. "Yet he'd still be in metropolitan Los Angeles."

Marlon said the census bureau has included all of Los Angeles and Orange counties—an area of 4,600 square miles—in metropolitan Los Angeles.

The former boundaries embraced 1,540 square miles.

"As I understand the word," says Marlon, "metropolitan means a great central city and its suburban fringes. The new boundaries might be good as a statistical area, but we have lost all character as a metropolitan area."

Then he added, "we think it's silly."
