The pamphlet, titled "The Communist Party in the United States," was found in a book rack in the library. It was one of a number of similar pamphlets found in the library during a recent search.

The pamphlet contains a list of names of Communist Party members in the Twin Falls area, including names of local businessmen and professionals.

The city librarian, Elynn Smith, said she was surprised to find the pamphlet in the library. She said she had never seen it before.

Landscaping Advice Given—Rupert Club

RUPERT, April 11.—Anton S. Horn, horticultural specialist of the extension service, showed slides and talked on landscaping at a meeting sponsored by the social club at 1:30 p. m. Wednesday. Mrs. Harriet Spencer, home demonstration agent of Minidoka county, was acting chairman. Horn and William Henschel, who had answered questions in the discussion that followed the talk. Following the meeting visits were made to the Frank Johnson and Blaine Nelson homes to discuss landscape plans first hand.

Boundary Area
Horn said that Rupert was the jumping off place for certain types of shrubs and plants because of elevation, and explained landscaping problems of this area. Trees that are adapted to this area are the mist green ash, Norway maple, European linden, thornless honey locust, black walnut, European spruce, English hawthorne, flowering crab and mountain ash. He advised planting good trees and placing them so they would frame the house rather than hide it by planting in front of the house. Another caution was not to plant too close to the house.

Other Suggestions
General suggestions for landscaping included a good foundation planting to tie the house to the ground. It suggested an outdoor living room in the back yard could be screened off from the neighbor by hedge or border of flowering shrubs, keeping trees to the side, leaving the center open for fireplace and shrubbery. Horn said flower beds in the center of the lawn and in front of the house and best they be put in curved and nested to the shrub borders.
