Gooding Men Invent Bean Harvesting Implements

Combination Rotary Bean Windrowing, Cutting Machines Invented at Gooding

GOODING, April 24.—Twenty years spent in the exacting business of raising beans in Anglo Valley has given A. R. Bishop plenty of opportunities to study the problems faced by the grower, particularly from the harvesting angle. For the past six years Bishop and his son, Kenneth, 20, have been trying to improve on the old system of cutting beans. "Because it's really quite a headache," he said. Wednesday marked a crucial day when father and son were able to see the completion of an answer to their problem. In the Bishop rotary bean cutter and Bishop rotary windrower set up for exhibition at the Van Dorn and Egler blacksmith shop in Gooding. "This combination is the only machinery on the market today which cuts and windrows in one operation, it is believed by the Bishops, who have spent time and money in research and have applied for patents on both pieces of machinery. The outstanding feature of the cutter is that it cuts the beans at ground level, causing less shatter than any machine now on the market. Both the cutter and the windrower can be attached to any type tractor in a matter of a few minutes by one man. The cutter is "power" driven from the tractor power take-off while the windrow is friction driven, being attached to the rear of the tractor. The cutter is particularly adaptable to use, where the common fork-
