### U. S. Reveals New Types of Atom 'Sleuths'

WASHINGTON, April 27 (AP)—The government today unveiled an assortment of atom-age "sleuths" ranging from an electronic midget one-inch long to a 14-ton "beast" that can detect a gram of radioactive material.

1. Warning people against invasion by invisible and soundless atomic energy. Each of these "sleuths" would play vital roles in both military and civilian defense. They can "detect any type of radioactive attack and discover and locate contaminated areas."

2. Locating atomic raw materials which might otherwise escape discovery. These devices are "must" equipment for prospectors in the hope to hit the uranium jackpot.

3. Analyzing materials that give their identity away by the kind and amount of radiation they emit. The electronic wizard performing this function is known as the industrial or scientific laboratory.

4. Measuring radiation dosage received by workers in laboratories and plants which handle atomic materials.

5. In all more than 100 different instruments "relating to personnel protection, monitoring and radiological analysis" were demonstrated by the national bureau of standards and the atomic energy commission in a special exhibit for scientists.

Once secret, they have been declassified and are now being manufactured by private industry.

**"We Never Finish Building," Describes Hatchery's Growth**

BUILT, April 27—From its small beginnings in November, 1928, the Snake River trout farm at Clear Lake near Shoshone has grown to be one of the largest producers of rainbow trout of any hatchery in the United States, government or privately owned, according to Jack Tingey, its owner.

Starting such a technical business "that time was a major undertaking," Tingey said, "because of the effects of a depression and a stroke of bad luck in the hatchery business can spell disaster."

Tingey had traveled all over the country looking for an ideal location for a hatchery. Water supply was of course, a prime consideration. "The water supply here is ideal," Tingey said. "We have 75 cubic feet of fresh water per second going into every pound."

Before he could start on the hatchery it was necessary to clear a road into the property. With all the preliminary work out of the way, the hatchery was on its way.

By comparison it has been found the trout produced at this hatchery are at good or better than any trout in the world, wild or domestic, Tingey said.

Since the best fish can be produced—rainbow trout, brook trout and clean ponds, the work involved in producing these trout is no small item. Feeding these fish is in itself a highly scientific undertaking.

Nothing can be left to chance. Poor ponds or careless feeding could result in a complete loss. The fish are fed all kinds of ground wheat, fresh fish, shorts of ground wheat, fish meal, soy bean meal, skin milk, powdered milk and several kinds of vitamins.

Fresh meat is fed to the fish in the fresh state, and the other meat goes through a process of sterilization several hours of cooking under pressure. To keep the food in proper condition a 100-lb capacity freezer has been built. Surplus food is kept here and distributed as needed.

"We buy many," Tingey remarked, "the fish can consume four and one-half tons of food at one feeding."

The quality of the fish produced at the hatchery has been such that little advertising has been necessary. "The fish have done the advertising themselves. Chiefs who have prepped the trout have also helped spread the fame of the product."

The market for these fish extends from Chicago to the Pacific coast and as far south as El Paso. The shipments of a ton of dressed trout a day are frequent.

Though most of the fish are shipped fresh, demand and production vary. Since they couldn't be made to balance, a freezing plant was installed. The frozen fish are packaged attractively, graded for size and ready for shipment on demand.

"We expect to produce 300,000 pounds of dressed trout this year," Tingey said. "Our yearly average of dressed fish runs around 1,300,000."

The Snake River Trout farm is an Idaho corporation and has been built from the profits of the company. Thirteen to fifteen people are employed at the hatchery the year around. Some of the personnel are engaged in the actual work of handling the fish, and some are hired for carpenter work.

"We never finish building," Tingey said.

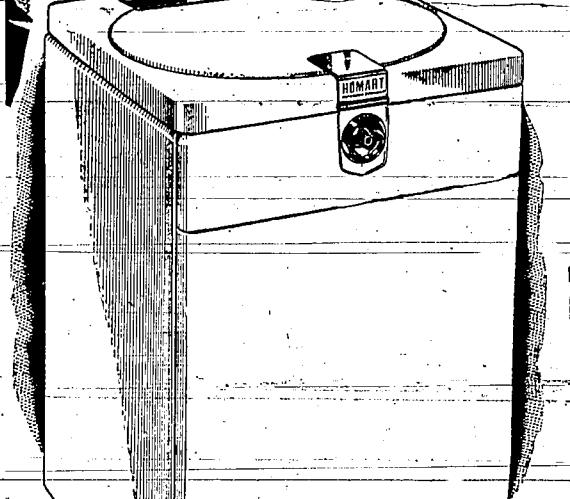

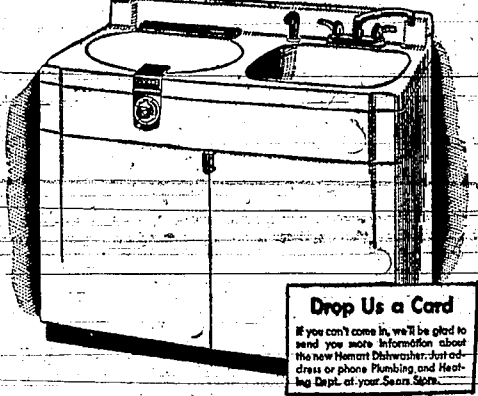

He stated the reason for the child's behavior lies in the home and that this environment must be changed if possible. He cited as an example the fighting boy who saves as an excuse that his dad was the mark on the child, and law enforcement agencies in many cases must take over.

Judge Wall, in speaking of the function of the probate court in delinquency cases, said the community was five or six years late in handling this meeting. He declared that a great many lives would not have happened if something had been done sooner.

Reason for the interest shown here is the alarming increase in delinquency over the United States, which, according to statistics, had increased 180 per cent.

The public is beginning to feel it is time something is done about it, the judge said.

As a group, the people whose duty it is to build good citizens are doing a mighty poor job, Judge Wall declared.

He said that delinquency problem had increased to such an extent that he feels the public as a whole should know what was going on.

Instead of secrecy in these cases, he said he had been thinking seriously of publishing every problem, but he said he was made "mild" enough, that something would be accomplished.

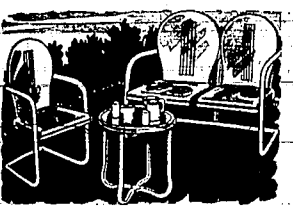

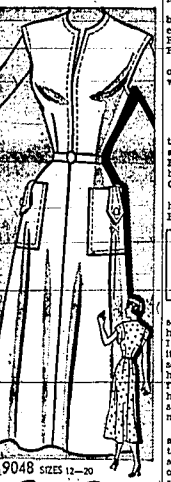

### Appeal Issued For Rain Try On Dust Bowl

DENVER, Colo., April 27 (AP)—Colorado officials appealed to the U. S. air force today to stage its first large-scale rainmaking operation over the state to prevent development of a new dust bowl.

Worried over the growing drought situation, the state's water conservancy department requested that the federal government make an appeal for rainmaking operations over the state.

The idea for the operation resulted from aerial rain-making experiments in the area 18 days ago. Downpours followed the experiments.

Two crop duster pilots took off on April 19 and sprayed heavy clouds over Las Animas, Colo., with carbon dioxide from five extinguishers. A second pair of fliers followed 24 hours later at nearby Pueblo with another similar experiment.

None of the pilots would take credit for the rain. But they pointed out that their rain fell when we took off and was really coming down when we landed.

**Useless Problem**

The governor said the drought was developing into a serious problem despite those showers.

Crop experts said another good general rain was needed over the entire old dust bowl area of the 130's covering eastern Colorado, western Kansas, Oklahoma, panhandle, west Texas and northeast New Mexico.

The Colorado governor said national guard planes were unable to undertake the project because of lack of personnel, planes and funds.

### Cold Weather Adds to Strife In Flood Area

GRAND FORKS, N. D., April 27 (AP)—Freezing temperatures are adding to the suffering of flood victims in the upper Midwest today but promised to bring some relief in the latter part of the week.

Unrelenting the languid Red River and its tributaries.

The mercury dipped sharply below the freezing mark throughout the flood zone and slowed the thaw of fresh snow dumped by a near-blizzard early this week.

**Deep in Midwest**

The sub-normal cold cut deep into the Midwest. Freezing temperatures were recorded as far south as Missouri, Illinois and Indiana. Snow piled the north-central states from the Rockies to the eastern Great lakes.

The prolonged wintry weather and low flows threatened to make the opening of shipping on the Northern Red lakes one of the latest in history.

**Fort Opened Delayed**

Weather forecasters said Lake Superior ports may not open for another two weeks. The latest opening on record is May 16.

The Red river of the north fanned out over the snow-covered lowlands north of here today as it crept back down on Canadian border communities.

The Red-Cross said nearly 25,000 persons in North Dakota and Minnesota had been driven from their homes or subjected to hardships and property loss by the high waters.

erator, deep freezer and a heavy-duty mixer. A large, sanitary pantry is located just off the kitchen. A newly-installed health room is considered by county nurses as what every school in the area should copy. Equipped by the PTA at a cost of about \$100, the room contains two beds, a wash basin and well-stocked medicine cabinet. Located in a quiet part of the school basement, it provides a resting place for any student who gets ill or is hurt on the playground. The classrooms are also modern and designed for comfort. Each desk and seat is an adjustable unit to ensure that the child will have a desk that fits perfectly. An air conditioning system changes the air once every half hour in each room so that students may be kept alert for their lessons. The rooms have been wired for rheostatic lighting which will adjust itself automatically to add artificial light to a certain brightness as the

day grows darker outside. Installation of this lighting will be one of the next steps for the school. As a church-endowed school, the building has a parson hall in which the Rev. R. C. Munnly can lecture to the students once a week. When the room is not in use for this purpose, it serves as a hall for entertainment and assemblies. The school is expanding to meet its needs. The practice school officials has been to limit enrollment to the point where a maximum of 30 pupils will be taught in any classroom, since several students have been turned away each year, the school is expanding gradually to take a few more students. Later he completed three courses in engineering, locomotive engine and electrical work in the American commercial schools.

He then became the operator of the sawmill plant at the Alta-Columbia mill company and later operator of the Yukon Gold company's Goussenheim plant at Dawson, in 1912 he went to work for the Canadian Klondike Power company and stayed with them until 1920.

Of his years as postmaster, Hartshorn said, "I have had a wonderful 15 years in the postoffice. He started out with a blacksmith shop in 1904 and he was buying and setting off for the Klondike February, 1909. Landing at Skagway, he packed over the White Pass trail to Bennett on the headwaters of the Yukon. His pack train would not go out until early June.

This column yesterday drew attention to the fact that Russia's current offensive of "bought" incidents is a psychological war of nerves.

The red drive is aimed not only at governments but at the general public of the democracies. Its purpose is to create anxiety and doubt among the people.

We aren't afraid of Russia's strength—but nobody wants another war. We want to get ahead with our jobs, and with educating our children, and building for the future.

The worst aspect of this war of nerves is that it might develop a spirit of "let's make it a shooting war and get it over with." That is something we must guard against, because as things now stand, a shooting war isn't inevitable. Russia isn't likely to invite war deliberately so long as the democracies hold the balance of power as they do now. Should the Soviet union acquire the balance of power in days to come, things may be different.

Our course, therefore, is to refuse to let the war of nerves get under our skin.




